

#### Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month




- o Most months, between 500 and 800 beneficiaries were started on 041006ES.
- The number of beneficiaries completing each month steadily increased to approximately 400 in August 2006. The number of completers then dramatically increased during the last seven months of the project.





#### Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers




- o 14622 beneficiaries were started on the 041006ES dossier.
- Of these, 11141 completed the project when their sentence expired and 3481 left the project early.







#### Reasons for Early Leavers



Other reasons given for beneficiaries leaving the project early:

- o Of the 3481 beneficiaries who left the project early, 2165 (62%) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- o 9% (307) of early leavers decided not to continue on the project.
- o 175 beneficiaries left the project early due to ineligibility.








#### Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus

#### Ethnic Breakdown of All Beneficiaries




- o 80% (11628) of the beneficiaries started were White-British.
- o 20% (2996) of the beneficiaries started were from ethnic minorities.

#### Nationality Breakdown of All Beneficiaries



- o 82% (12022) of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES were from United Kingdom.
- o The nationality of 14% (2118) beneficiaries was unknown.



### Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2




- o The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started on dossier 041006ES was 23 years.
- The average (mode) age group is 21 30 years old.






#### **Disabled Beneficiaries**

#### Needs of the Beneficiaries Started on 041006ES




- o Over 90% of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES needed help with employment issues and over 95% needed help with education.
- o Nearly 50% of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES needed help with drug issues.





#### Beneficiary Background




- Over 7000 of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES were ex-offenders.
- o Over 6000 of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES are on the labour market.
- o Approximately 4000 of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES had a drug or alcohol problem






#### Beneficiaries with No Fixed Abode



- o 6% (950) of the beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- Of these, 182 (19%) had an accommodation outcome secured. A further 1271 beneficiaries who were not classified as having no fixed abode also gained an accommodation outcome.







- o For almost 6000 beneficiaries, their risk of harm was unknown.
- Where risk was known, the majority of beneficiaries were of low risk.


- o 13307 Soft outcomes were gained by beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES.
- o 1688 beneficiaries gained IAG assistance.
- o 2375 beneficiaries received a formal qualification.
- o 1583 beneficiaries either independently wrote a CV or gained assistance in writing a CV.
- Beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES attended 2540 interviews Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.







#### **Exam Results**




- o 79% (4022) of exams taken by beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES have been passed.
- o Where known, only 2% of exams have been failed.


- o 1234 NVQ levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 have been gained by beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES.
- o 1023 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries on dossier 041006ES.
- o 564 beneficiaries passed a course in computing.

- o 2,882,000 (64%) of the hours were collected for practical activities.




