

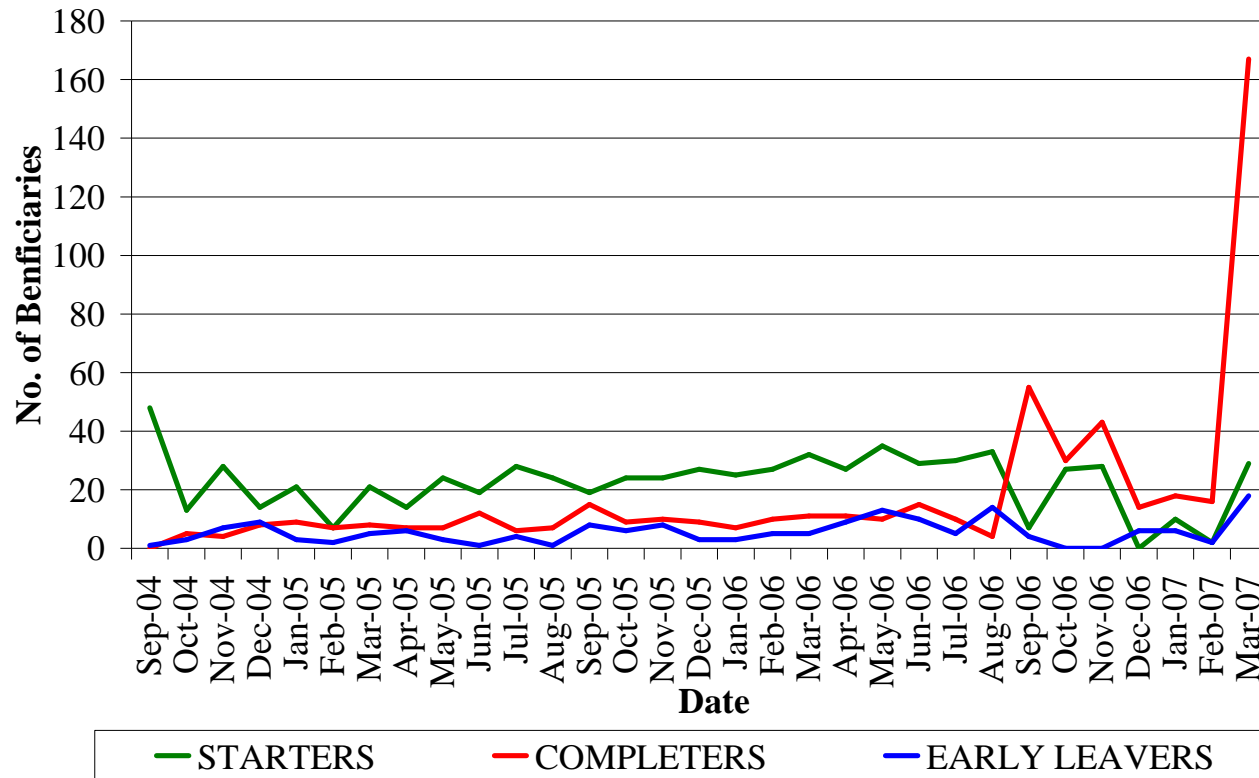

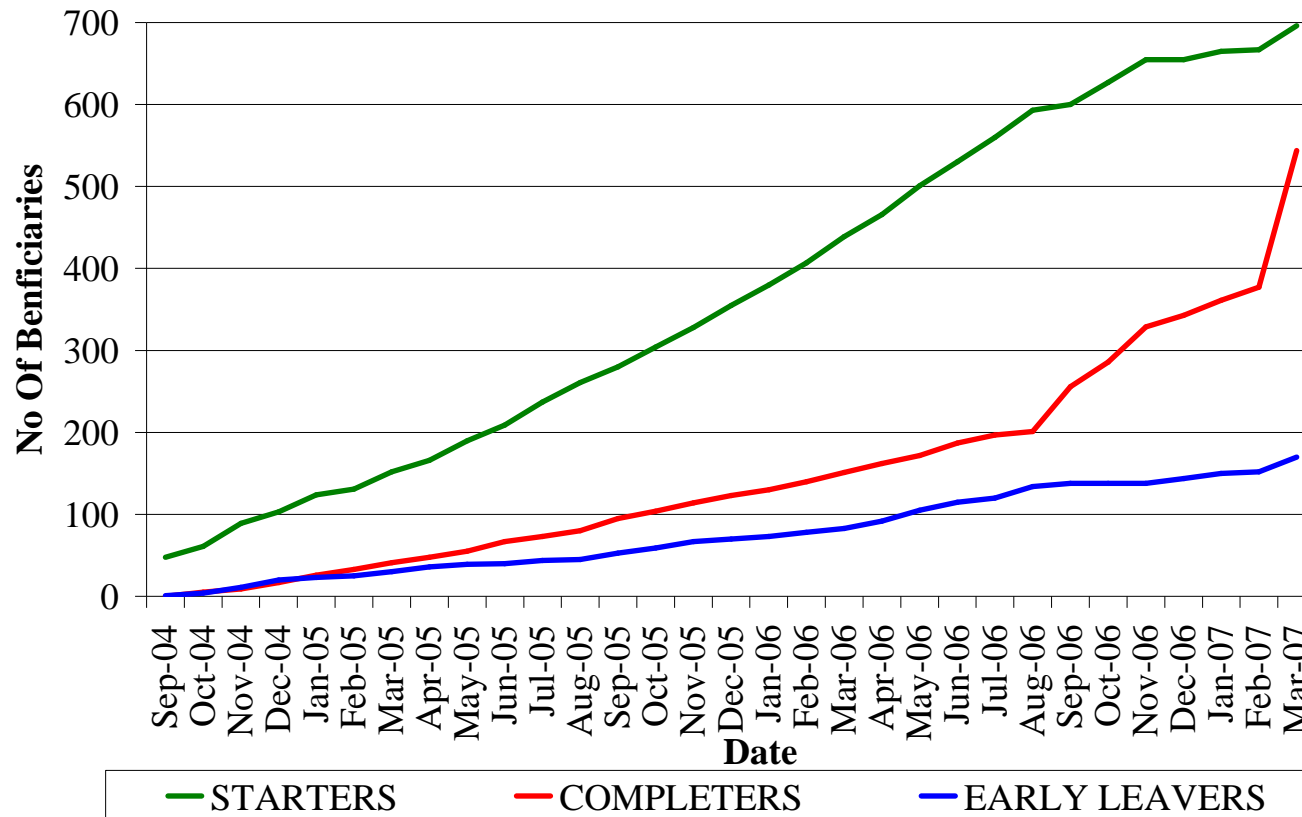

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



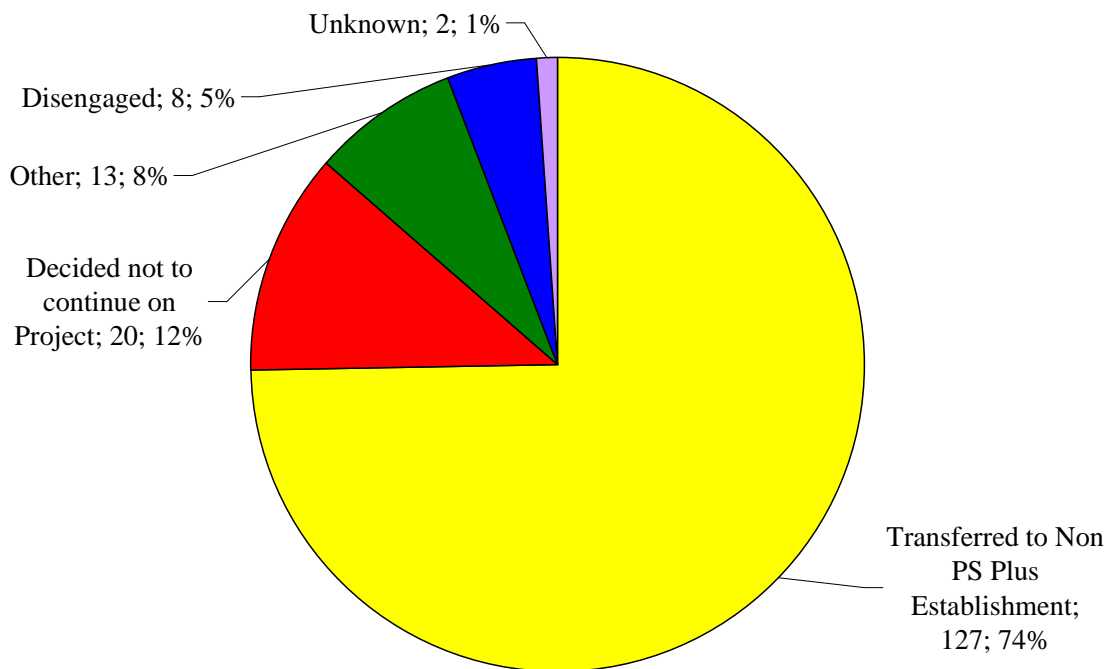
- Most months, Ashwell started between 15 and 30 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 15 beneficiaries were completing the PS plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 700 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Ashwell.
- 714 beneficiaries finished in Ashwell – 544 completed the project and 170 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

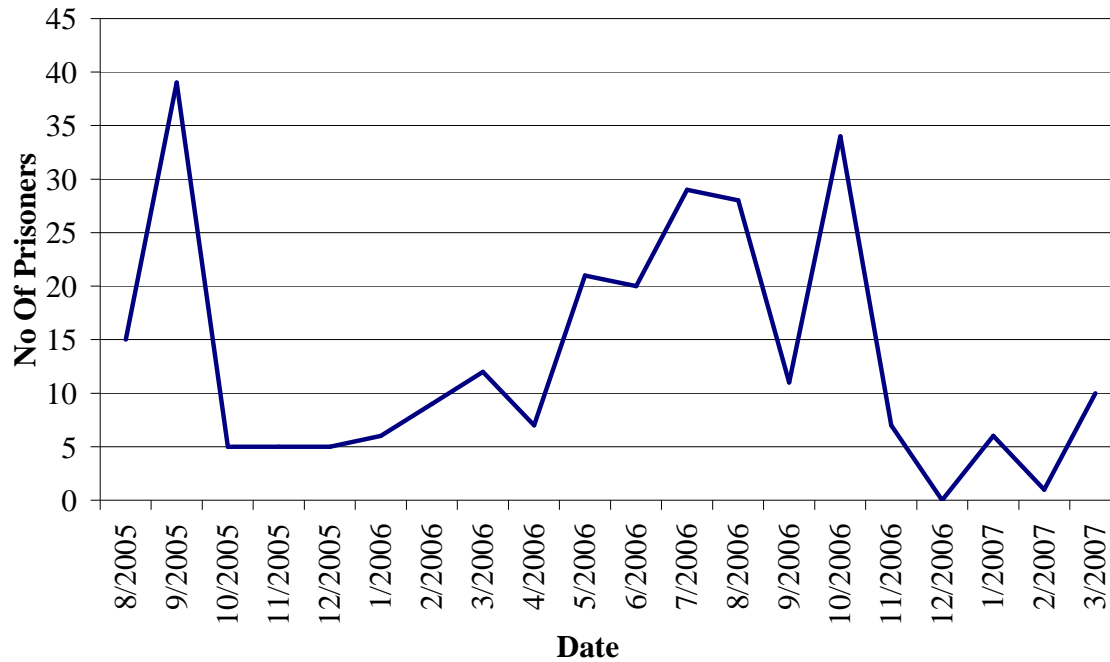


Other reasons given for beneficiaries leaving the project early:

- Of the 170 early leavers, 74% (127) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- 12% (20) of the early leavers decided not to continue on the project.
- 5 beneficiaries were made early leavers as they were due to be deported.

Non-Starters Per Month

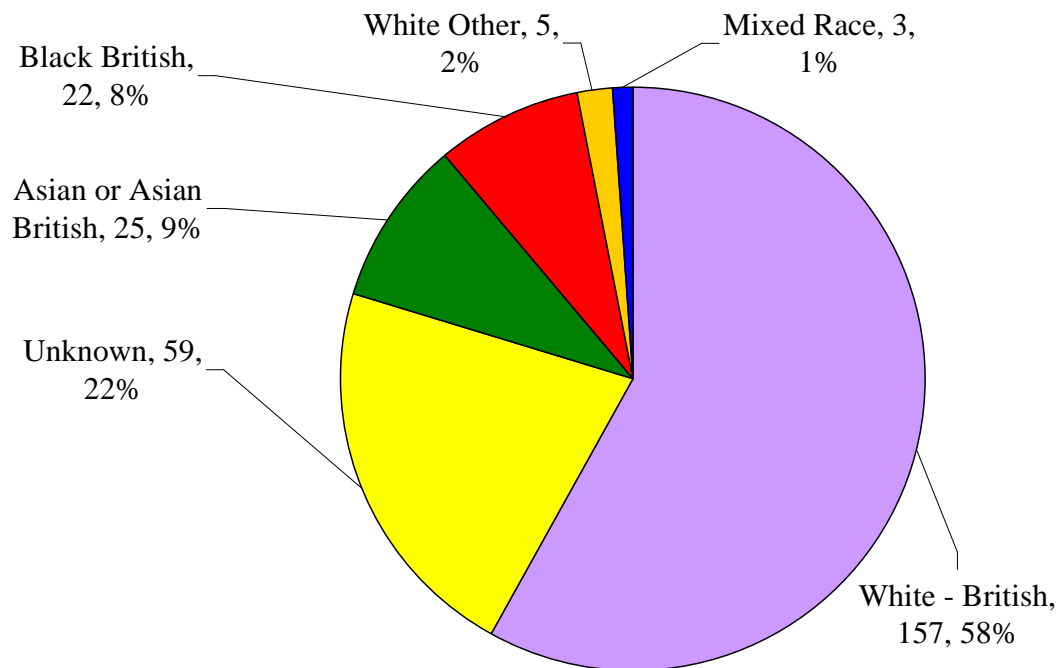

- Most months, fewer than 15 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, 271 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Ashwell.
- 101 of the prisoners not started in Ashwell did not require PS Plus Services and 27 prisoners were transferred before being started on the project (5 transferred before the assessment entered and 22 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



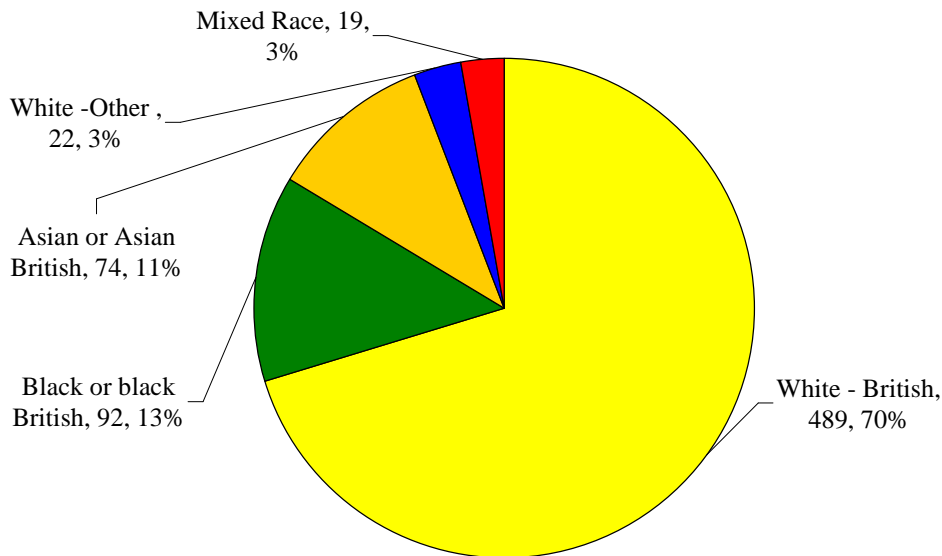

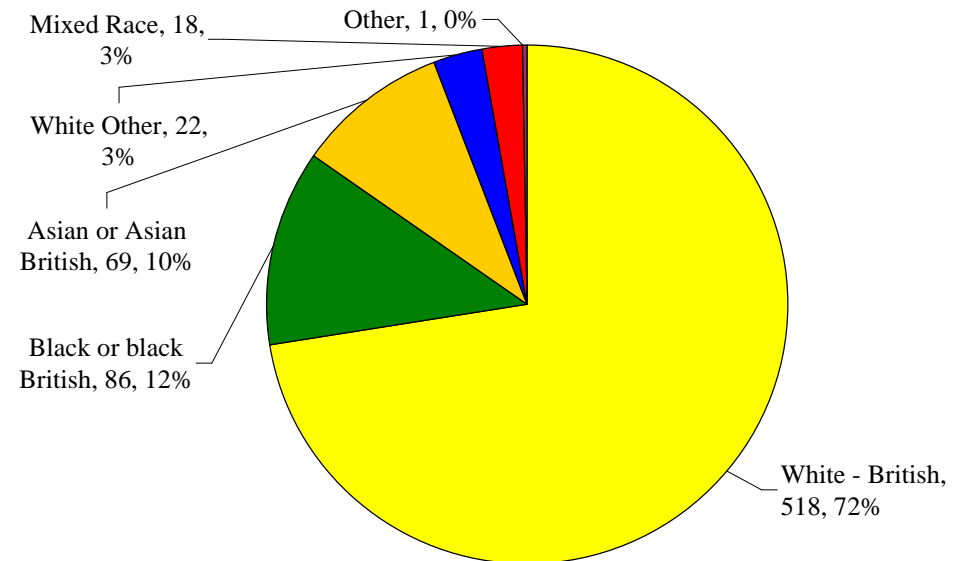
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (58%) and from United Kingdom (73%).
- The Ethnic origin for 2 in 9 and the nationality of 1 in 5 of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities accounted for 20% (55 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 70% (489) of the beneficiaries started and 72% (518) of the beneficiaries who finished in Ashwell were White-British.
- 30% (207) of the beneficiaries started and 28% (195) of the beneficiaries who finished in Ashwell were from ethnic minorities.

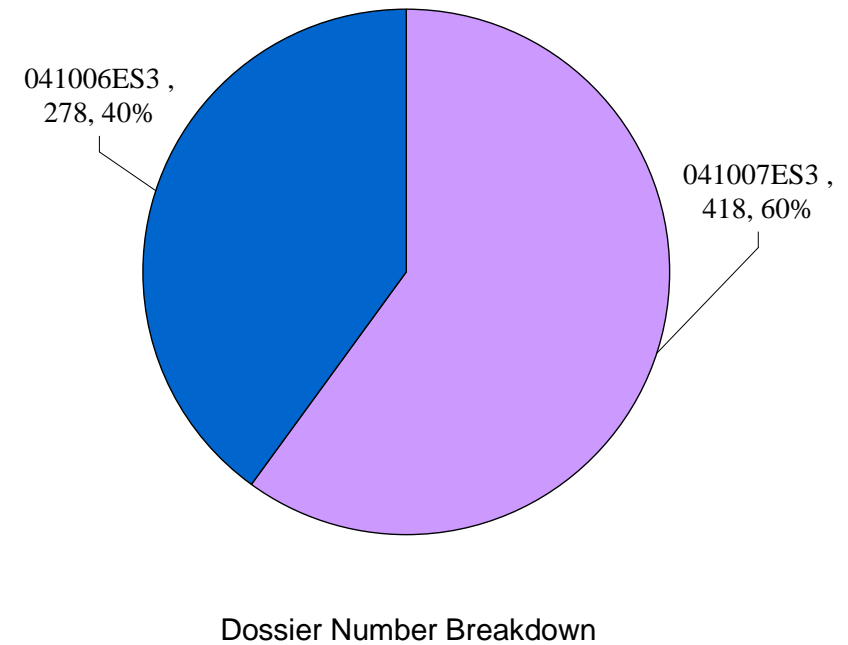
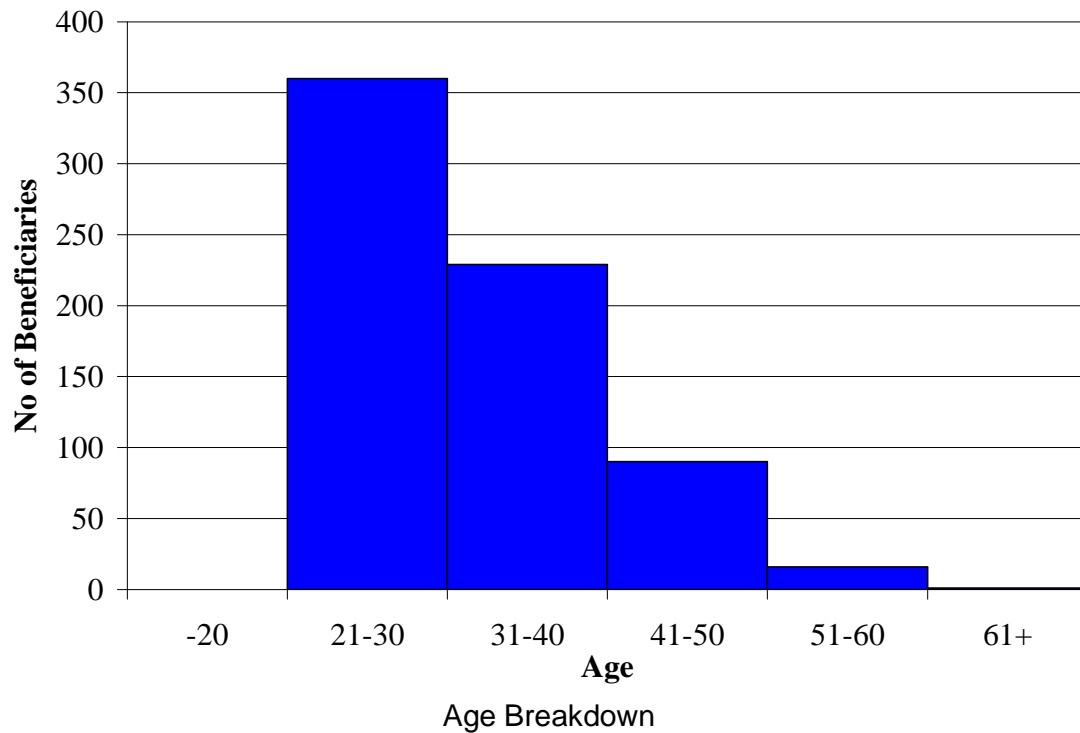

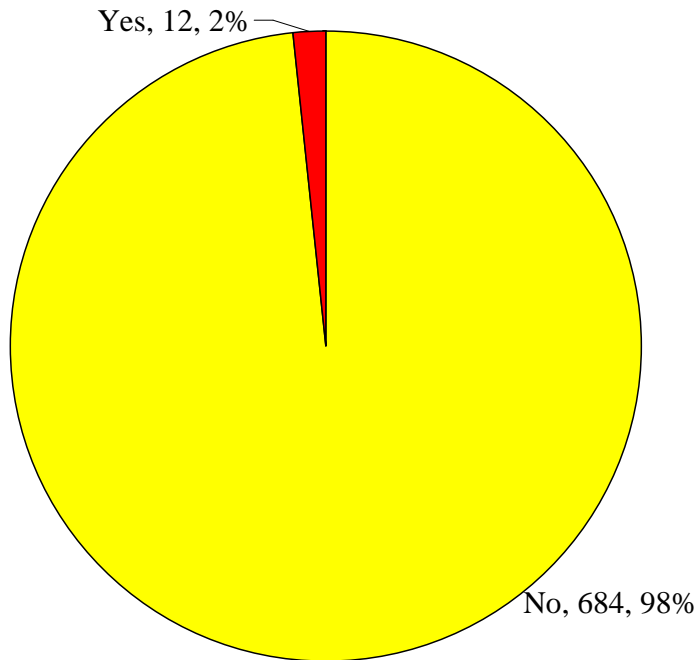
- 80% (557) of the beneficiaries started in Ashwell stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 81% (575) of the beneficiaries who finished in Ashwell stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 126 of the beneficiaries started in Ashwell and 118 of the beneficiaries that finished in Ashwell are unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

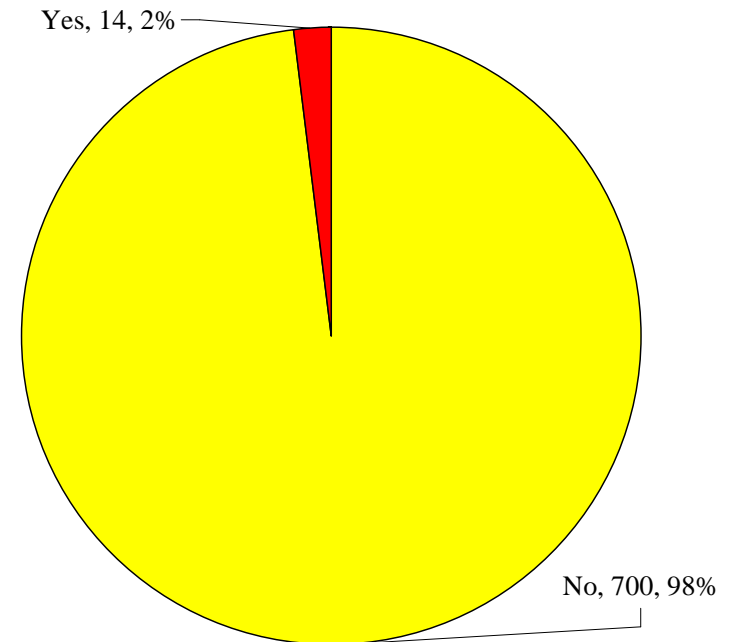


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Ashwell is 31 years and 10 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 60% (418) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



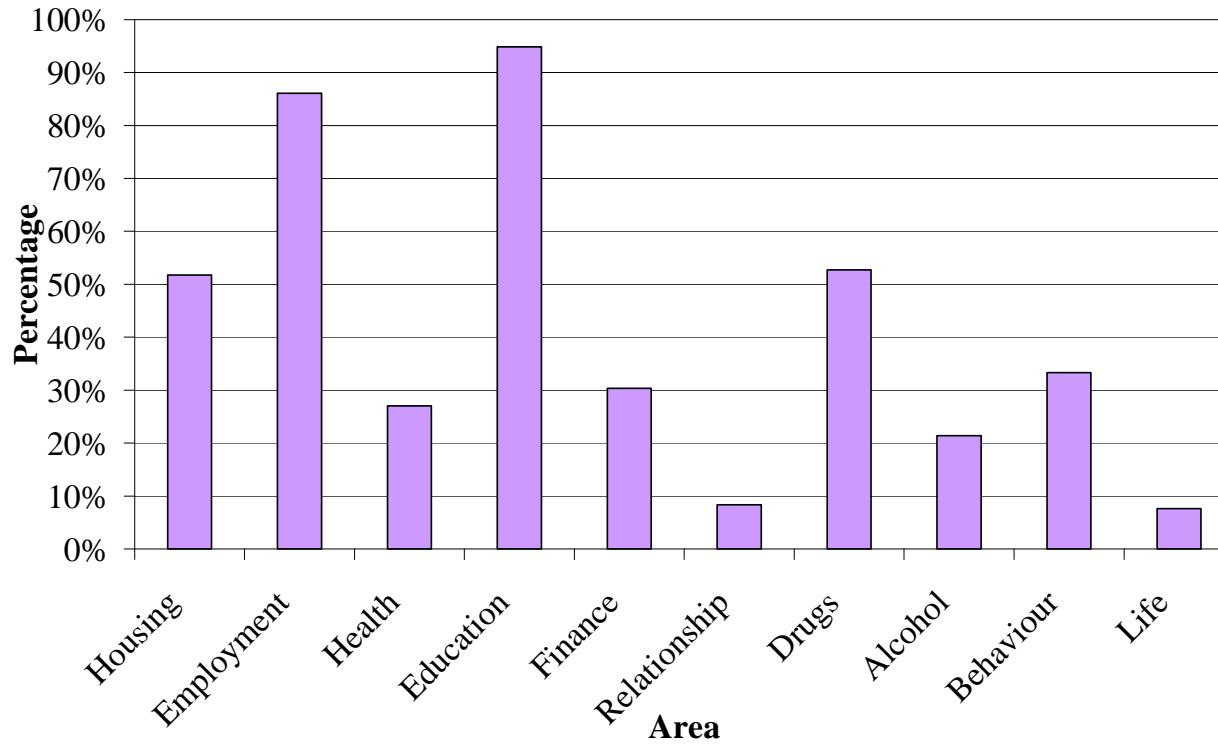
Beneficiaries Starting in Ashwell



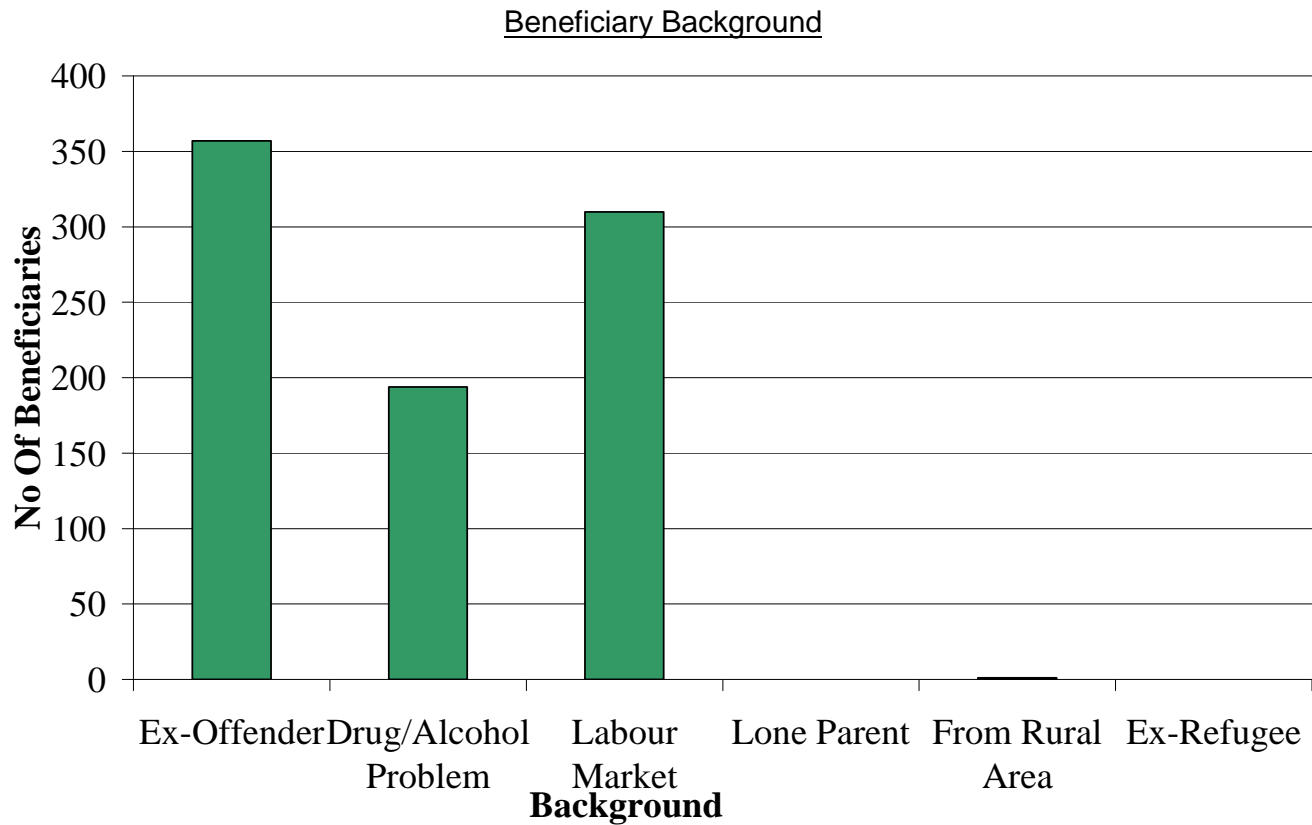
Beneficiaries Finishing in Ashwell

- 2% (12) of the beneficiaries who started in Ashwell were classified as being disabled.
- 2% (14) of the beneficiaries who finished in Ashwell were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Ashwell



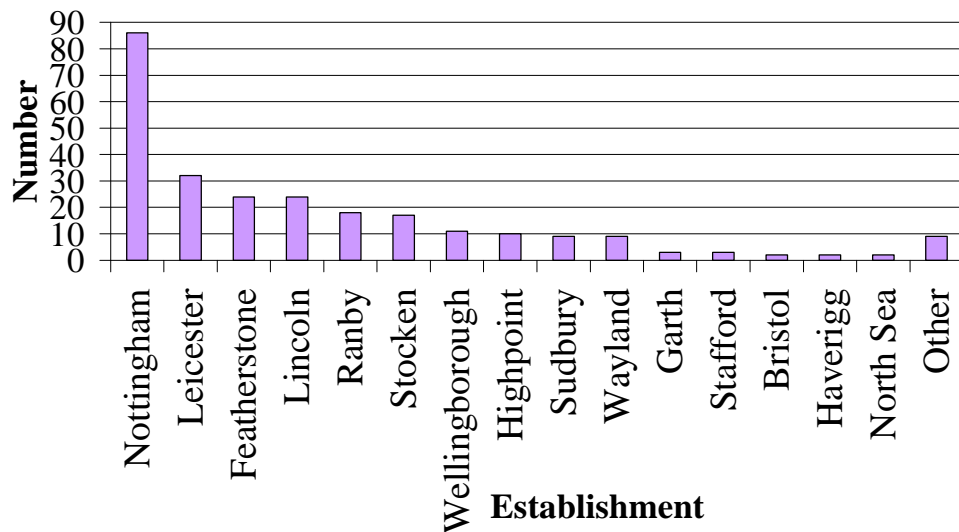
- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Ashwell needed help with education.
- Over 80% of the beneficiaries who started in Ashwell needed help with employment issues.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Ashwell needed help with housing issues and over 50% needed help with drugs issues.



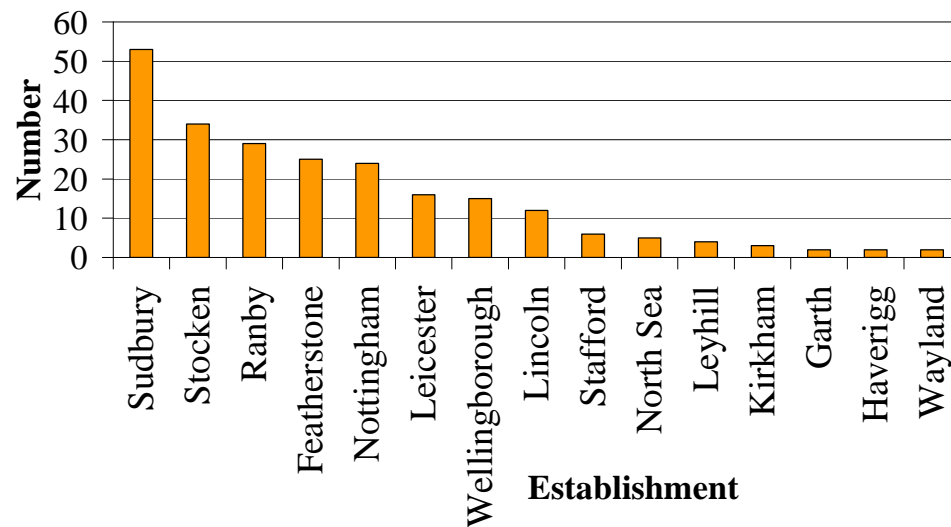
- Over 350 of the beneficiaries who started in Ashwell were ex-offenders.
- Over 300 of the beneficiaries who started in Ashwell are on the labour market.

Transfers into Ashwell

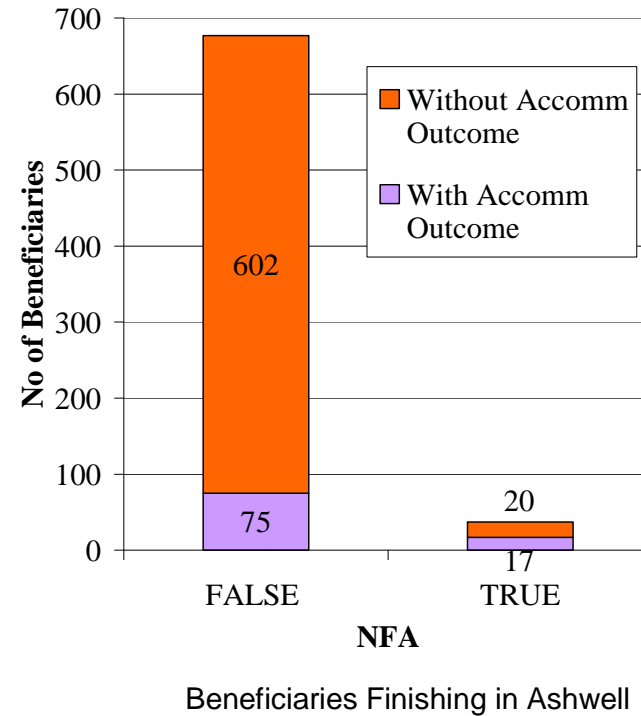
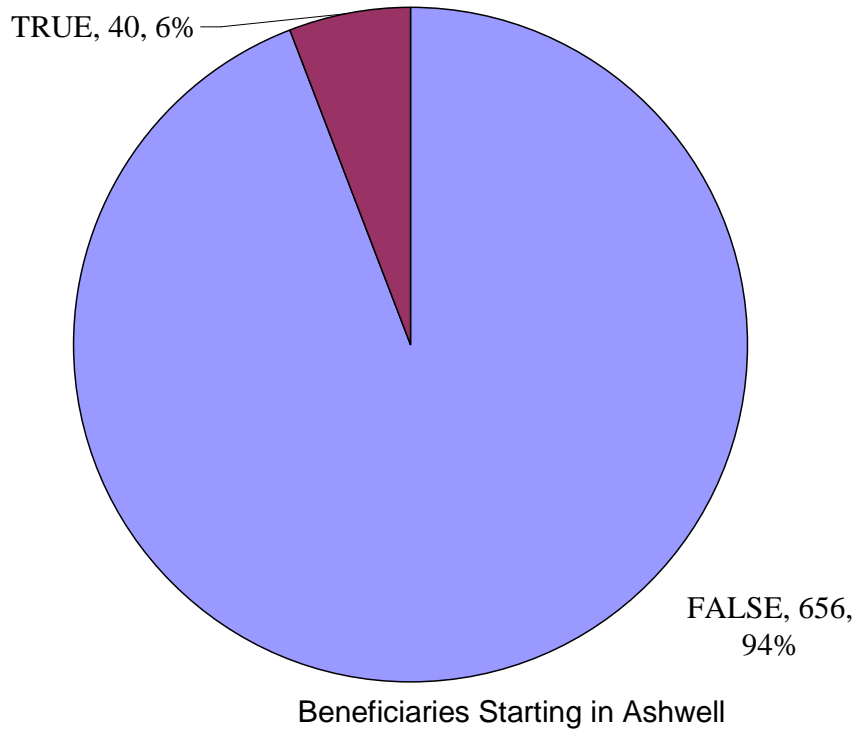


Transfers from Ashwell

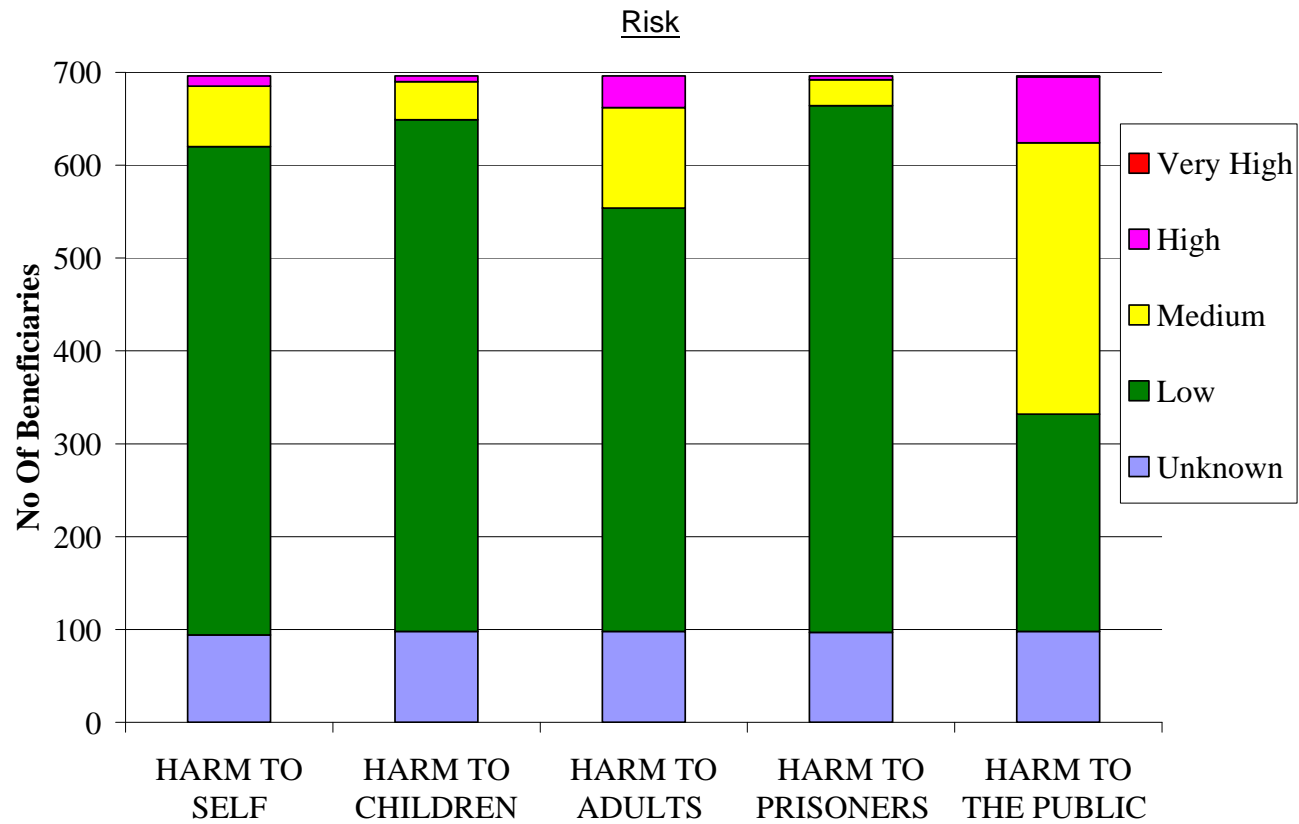


- 261 beneficiaries have transferred into Ashwell – 64% have transferred to Ashwell from Nottingham, Leicester, Featherstone or Lincoln.
- 232 beneficiaries have transferred from Ashwell – 71% have transferred from Ashwell to Sudbury, Stocken, Ranby, Featherstone or Nottingham.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode



- 6% (40) of the beneficiaries started in Ashwell were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 37 beneficiaries had no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 17 beneficiaries had an accommodation outcome secured.



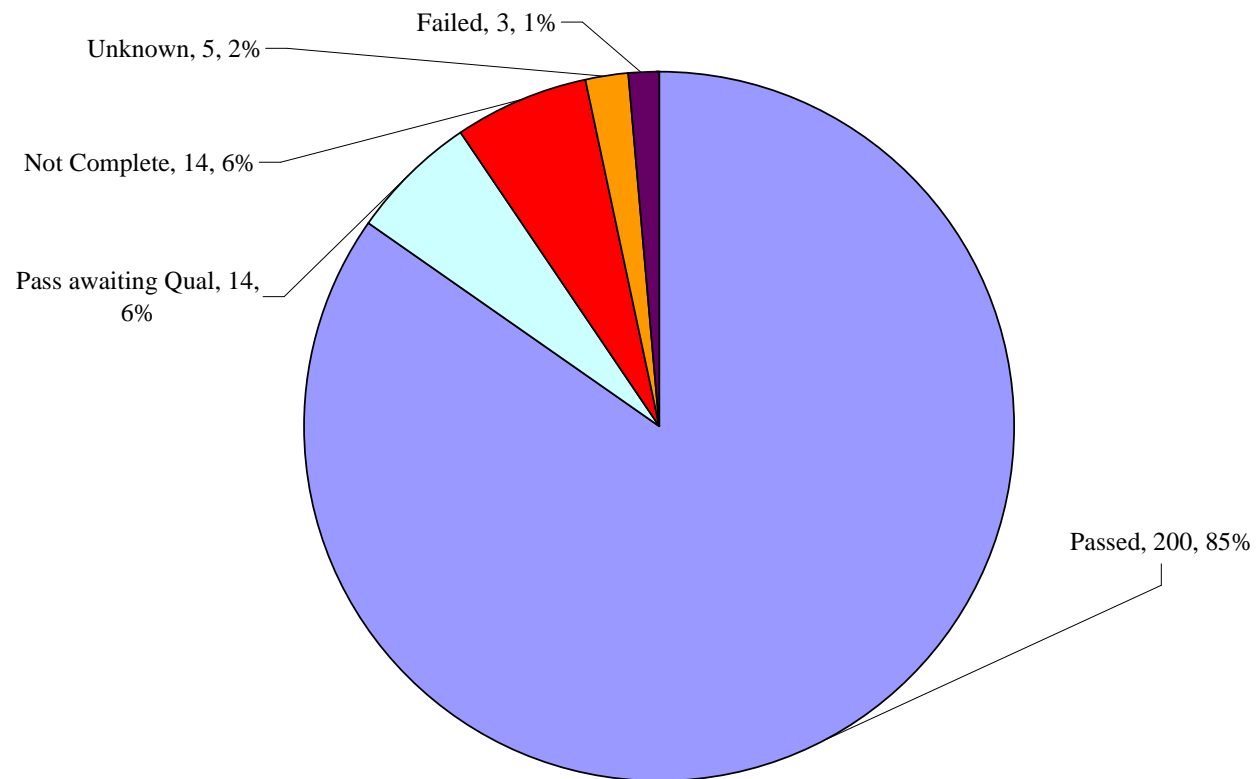
- For almost 100 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, children, adults, prisoners, and medium risk towards the public.

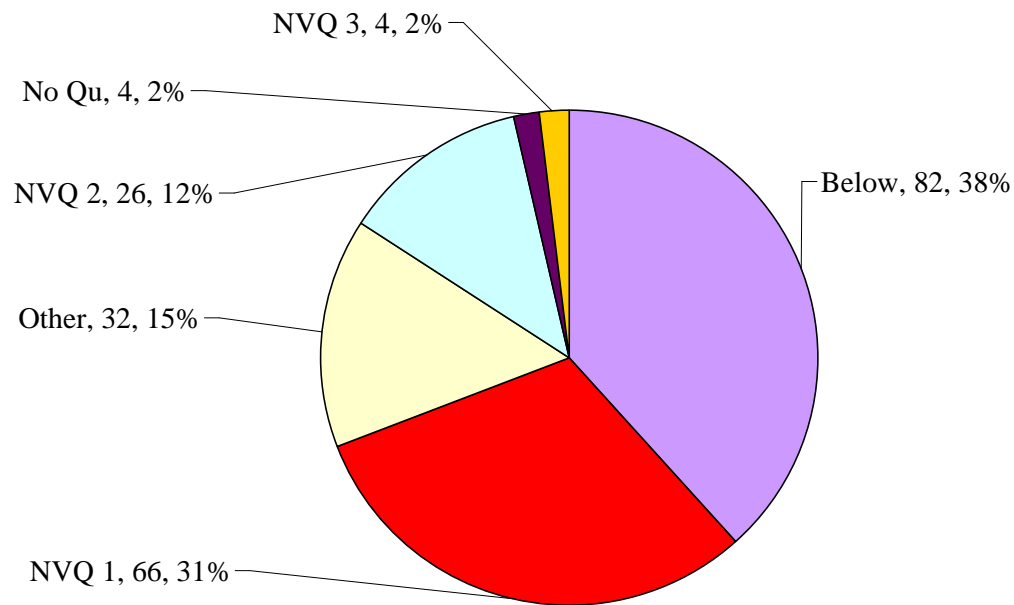
- 899 soft outcomes were gained by Ashwell beneficiaries.
- 212 beneficiaries received Advice on Disclosure.
- Beneficiaries in Ashwell attended 231 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 54 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.

Exam Results



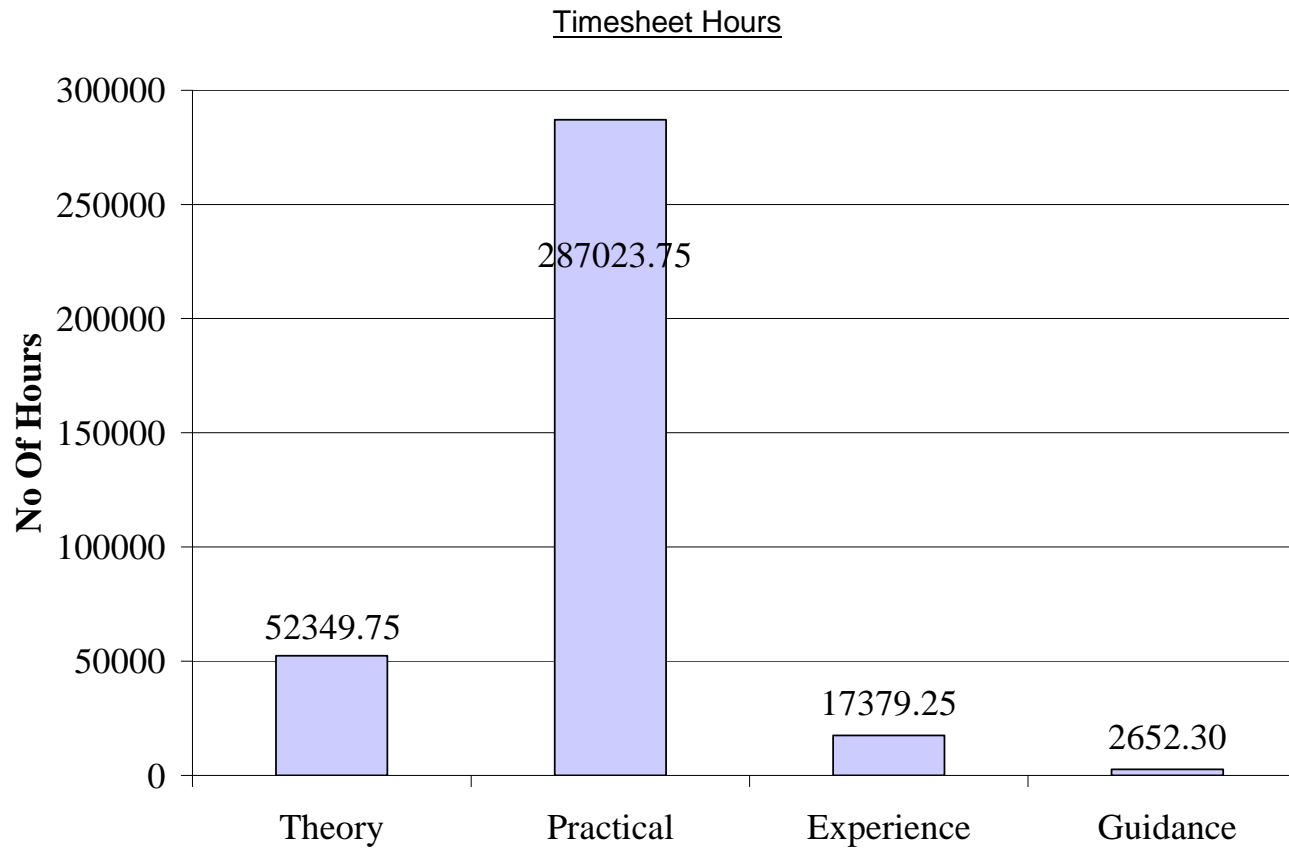
- 91% (214) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only 3 exams were failed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



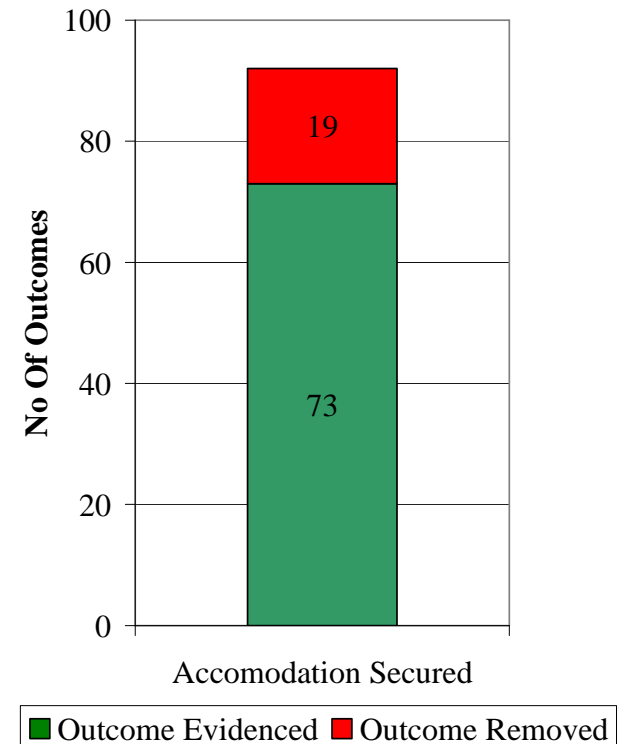
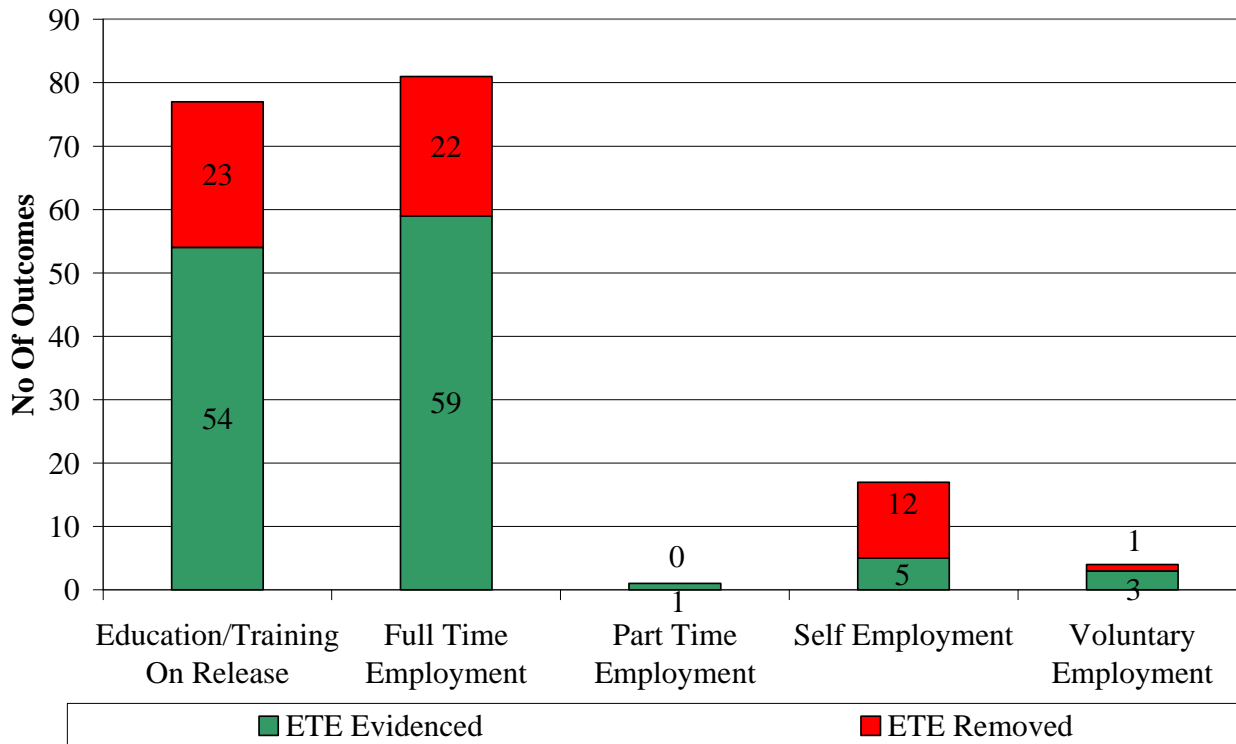

- 96 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Ashwell.
- 23 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Ashwell.



- 359,405 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 287,024 (80%) hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 180 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Ashwell with evidence for 122 of these outcomes (68% evidence for outcome rate).
- 92 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 73 outcomes (79% evidence for outcome rate).
