


Working together to reduce re-offending









- o Buckley Hall started less then 55 beneficiaries each month on the PS Plus 2 project.
- The number of project completers remained steady, until the penultimate month on the project, when all the beneficiaries were made completers.



- o 226 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Buckley Hall.
- Approximately 300 beneficiaries finished in Buckley Hall 271 completed the project and 37 left early.





#### Nationality of Prisoners Not Started



- Where known, the majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (13%) and from United Kingdom (32%).
- The ethnic origin for 79% and the nationality of 62% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 8% (34) of the prisoners not started.








#### Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus

- o 73% (165) of the beneficiaries started and 74% (225) of the beneficiaries who finished in Buckley Hall were White-British.
- o 27% (61) of the beneficiaries started and 26% (82) of the beneficiaries who finished were from ethnic minorities.



Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2


Dossier Number Breakdown


- $\circ$  2% (5) of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall were classified as being disabled.

### Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Buckley Hall


- Almost every beneficiary who started in Buckley Hall needed help with employment and over 80% needed help with education.
- Over 30% of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall needed help with housing issues.
- o Over 25% of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall needed help with drug issues.

- Nearly 200 of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall are on the labour market.



#### Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode




 3% (7) of the beneficiaries started and 5% (14) of the beneficiaries finishing in Buckley Hall have been classed as having no fixed abode.

- o For approximately 70 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- o The majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.
- There were 12 beneficiaries that were very high risk to themselves and the public, and 11 beneficiaries that were very high risk to children, adults and prisoners.

- o 13 Beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.



- No exams were failed.




- o 23 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Buckley Hall.


- o 105,803 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
