

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month




- o Most months, Dartmoor started between 20 and 50 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project per month.
- Up until the last 6 months of the project (project closure), no more than 40 beneficiaries were completing the PS plus 2 project per month.





Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers




- o Nearly 800 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Dartmoor.
- o Approximately 875 beneficiaries finished in Dartmoor 811 completed the project and 64 left the project early.


- o Of the 64 early leavers, 59% (38) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- o 13% (8) of the beneficiaries who left the project early decided not to continue on the project.
- o 7 of the early leavers were disengaged.


- o Most months, less than 30 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- o In total, 420 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Dartmoor.
- o 170 of the prisoners not started in Dartmoor did not require PS Plus Services and 51 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (17 transferred before the assessment entered and 34 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

- o The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (66%) from United Kingdom (75%).
- o The ethnic origin of 24% and the nationality of 16% of the prisoners not started were unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 10% (43 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.








Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus

Ethnic Breakdown of Beneficiaries in Dartmoor



- o 87% (683) of the beneficiaries started and 89% (775) of the beneficiaries who finished in Dartmoor were White-British.
- o 13% (102) of the beneficiaries started and 11% (98) of the beneficiaries who finished in Ashwell were from ethnic minorities.



- o 86% (676) of the beneficiaries started in Dartmoor stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British, English or Welsh.
- o 87% (760) of the beneficiaries who finished in Dartmoor stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British, English or Welsh.
- The nationalities of 88 of the beneficiaries started in Dartmoor and 88 of the beneficiaries that finished in Dartmoor are unknown.





Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2




- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Dartmoor is 32 years and 10 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- o 62% (491) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).








Disabled Beneficiaries




Beneficiaries Finishing in Dartmoor

- o 3% (21) of the beneficiaries who started in Dartmoor were classified as being disabled.
- o 3% (23) of the beneficiaries who finished in Dartmoor were classified as being disabled.



Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Dartmoor




- Over 95% of the beneficiaries who started in Dartmoor needed help with employment.
- o Over 80% of the beneficiaries who started in Dartmoor needed help with education issues.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Dartmoor needed help with housing issues.





Beneficiary Background




- o Over 700 of the beneficiaries who started in Dartmoor were ex-offenders and almost 700 were on the labour market.
- o Over 400 of the beneficiaries who started in Dartmoor have a drug or alcohol problem.





Transfers from other PS Plus Establishments





- o 388 beneficiaries have transferred into Dartmoor 95% transferred to Dartmoor from Exeter, Bristol, or Channings Wood.
- 260 beneficiaries have transferred from Dartmoor 87% transferred from Dartmoor to Channings Wood, Leyhill, Exeter or Bristol.





Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode







Beneficiaries Finishing in Dartmoor

- o 9% (72) of the beneficiaries started in Dartmoor were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- o 92 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 30 had an accommodation outcome secured.



Risk



- o For almost 500 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.



- o 806 soft outcomes were gained by Dartmoor beneficiaries.
- o 102 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- o Beneficiaries in Dartmoor attended 42 interviews Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- o 18 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.





Exam Results




- o 95% (18) of the exams taken were passed.



Timesheet Hours




- o 397,429 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- o 270,446 (68%) of the hours collected were for experience activities.








Hard Outcomes





- 128 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Dartmoor with evidence for 70 of these outcomes (55% evidence for outcome rate).
- o 112 accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 82 outcomes (73% evidence for outcome rate).
