

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month


- o Most months, Drake Hall started less than 30 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 4 months of the project, no more than 26 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month. 214 beneficiaries were completed in the last 4 months due to project closure.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers


- o Over 300 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Drake Hall.
- 484 beneficiaries finished in Drake Hall 425 completed the project and 59 left the project early.

• Of the 59 early leavers, 38% (22) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.

- \circ 20% (12) of the early leavers decided not to continue on the project.
- o 2 of the early leavers did not require any assistance from PS Plus.



Non-Starters Per Month



- Every month, no more than 15 prisoners per month were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- o In total, over 127 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Drake Hall.
- o 55 prisoners transferred before being made starters 50 to non-PS Plus and 5 to PS Plus establishments.



Nationality of Prisoners Not Started



- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project (where the ethnic origin is known) were White-British (45%) and from United Kingdom (64%).
- The ethnic origin of 45% and the nationality of 31% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 10% (12 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus



- o 27% (81) of the beneficiaries who started and 20% (99) who finished in Drake Hall where from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of 5 beneficiaries who started (2%) and 5 beneficiaries who finished (1%) in Drake Hall is unknown.








- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Drake Hall is 32 years and 5 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 30 years old.


- \circ 1% (4) of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Drake Hall


- Over 95% of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall needed help with employment and over 85% needed help with education.
- o Over 40% of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall needed help with drug issues.
- Over 55% of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall needed help with housing issues.



Transfers from other PS Plus Establishments



- o 193 beneficiaries have transferred into Drake Hall including 106 from Styal and 70 from New Hall.
- o 55 beneficiaries have transferred from Drake Hall including 19 to Styal and 17 to Askham Grange.
- One beneficiary has moved on to Cheshire probation and one to Manchester probation as part of the PS Plus "Through the Gate" procedure.

- 51 beneficiaries who were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 3 had an accommodation outcome secured.




o 591 soft outcomes were gained by Drake Hall beneficiaries.

- o 95 beneficiaries have written CVs, either independently or with assistance.


- o 27 NVQ levels 1,2 and 4 have been gained by beneficiaries in Drake Hall.

- 119 hard education, training and employment (ETE) have been recorded at Drake Hall with evidence for 58 of these outcomes (49% evidence for outcome rate).
- 145 accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 100 outcomes (69% evidence for outcome rate).
