

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month




- o In the first 9 months, Forest Bank started less than 60 beneficiaries per month on the PS Plus 2 project. This increased to over 80 beneficiaries per month, until the winding down phase of the project.
- o Less then 50 beneficiaries left the PS Plus 2 project early per month.





Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers




- o Nearly 2300 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Forest Bank.
- o 1825 beneficiaries finished in Forest Bank 1524 completed the project and 301 left the project early.


- o Of the 301 beneficiaries who left the project early, 90% (274) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- o 6 of the beneficiaries who left the project early did so because they absconded.


- o Most months, over 50 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- o In total, over 1500 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Forest Bank.
- 883 prisoners transferred before being started on PS Plus 2, 679 to a Non-PS Plus, 40 to a PS Plus Establishment and 164 transferred before the assessment was entered.

- o The majority of the prisoners not started (where the ethnic origin and nationality were known) on the PS Plus project were White-British (36%) and from United Kingdom (65%).
- o The ethnic origin for 56% and the nationality of 31% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- o Ethnic minorities account for 8% (123 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.








Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus

Ethnic Breakdown of Beneficiaries in Forest Bank



- o 85% (1901) of the beneficiaries who started and 84% (1531) of the beneficiaries who finished in Forest Bank were White-British.
- o 15% (386) of the beneficiaries who started and 16% (292) of the beneficiaries who finished in Forest Bank were from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of 4 beneficiaries who started and 2 beneficiaries who finished in Forest Bank was unknown.



- o 82% (1857) of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- o 80% (1467) of the beneficiaries who finished in Forest Bank stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- The nationalities of 330 of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank and 286 of the beneficiaries who finished in Forest Bank is unknown.

Dossier Number Breakdown


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Forest Bank is 29 years and 6 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- o 51% (1167) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041006ES3 (male beneficiaries aged under 28).








Disabled Beneficiaries






Beneficiaries Starting in Forest Bank

Beneficiaries Finishing in Forest Bank

- o 2% (54) of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank were classified as being disabled.
- o 3% (46) of the beneficiaries who finished in Forest Bank were classified as being disabled.



Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Forest Bank




- 97% of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank needed help with employment and 89% needed help with education.
- o Approximately 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank needed help with drug issues.
- o Nearly 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank needed help with housing issues.





Beneficiary Background




- o Over 1200 of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank were ex-offenders and over 1200 were on the labour market.
- o 77 of the beneficiaries who started in Forest Bank had a drug or alcohol problem.





Transfers from other PS Plus Establishments





- 452 beneficiaries have transferred into Forest Bank 46% transferred to Forest Bank from Hindley and Lancaster Farms.
- 987 beneficiaries have transferred from Forest Bank 56% transferred from Forest Bank to Risley, Lancaster Farms or Kirkham.





Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode






Beneficiaries Starting in Forest Bank

Beneficiaries Finishing in Forest Bank

- o 3% (54) of the beneficiaries started in Forest Bank were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- o 67 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 13 had an accommodation outcome secured.





- o For over 1000 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- $\circ\quad$ Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.



- o 1123 soft outcomes were gained by Forest Bank beneficiaries.
- o 153 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- o 176 beneficiaries attended the Fresh Start Programme.
- Beneficiaries in Forest Bank attended 461 interviews Further Education, Fresh Start, Job, New Deal and Progress To Work interviews.
- o 30 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.






Exam Results



- o 62 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Forest Bank.
- o 58 adult Literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Forest Bank.





Timesheet Hours




- o 354,541 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- \circ 315,127 (89% of the hours collected) were for practical activities.







Hard Outcomes



- 146 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Forest Bank with evidence for 94 of these outcomes (64% evidence for outcome rate).
- 200 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 122 outcomes (61% evidence for outcome rate).
