

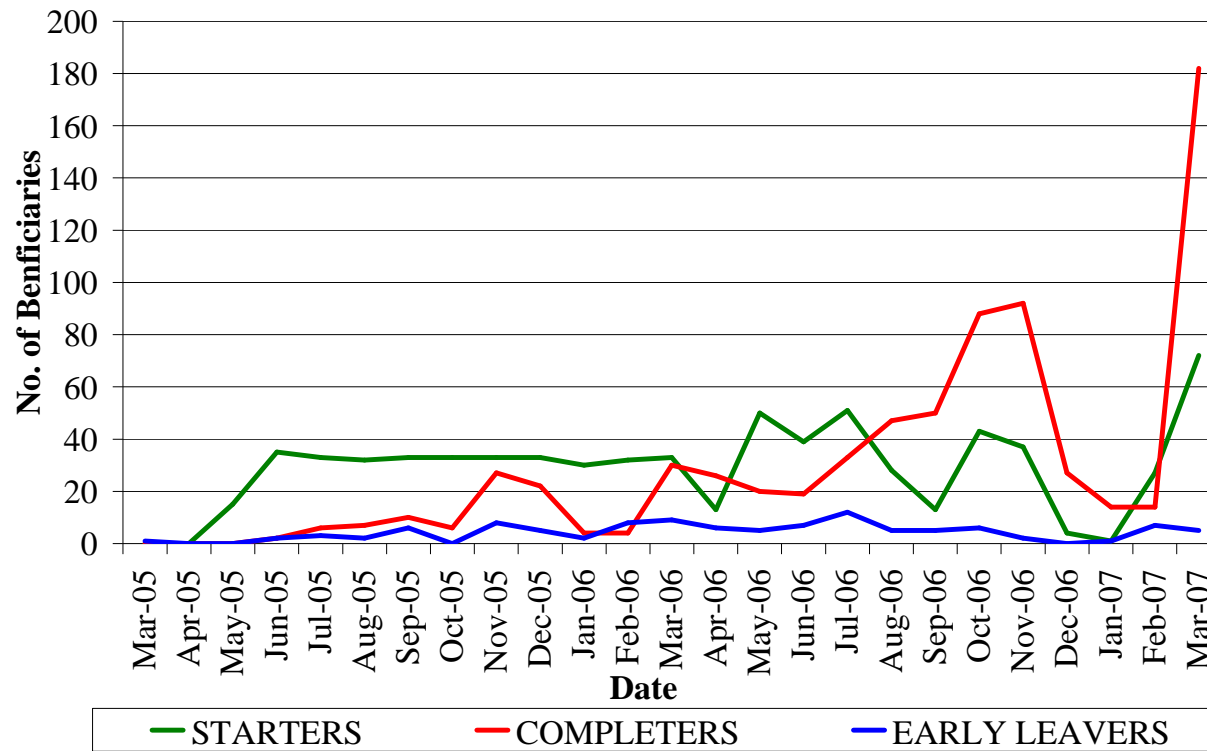

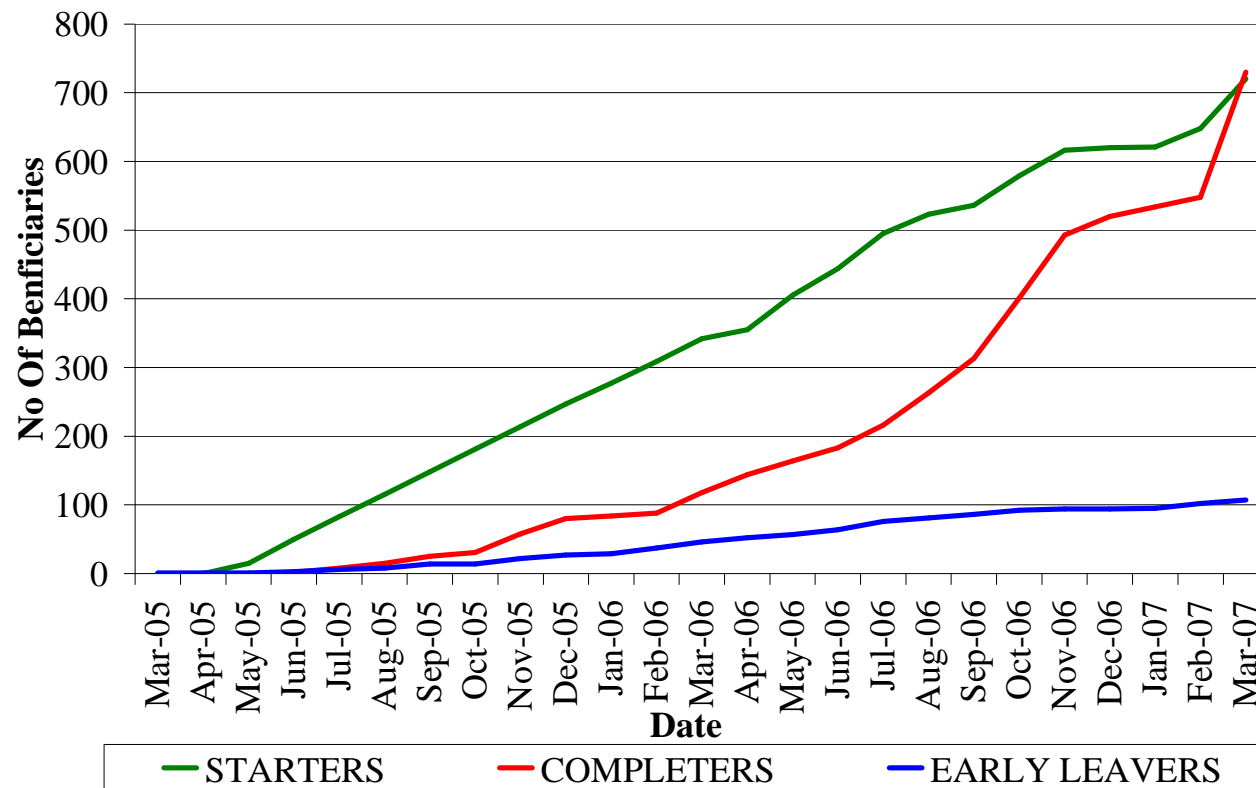

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



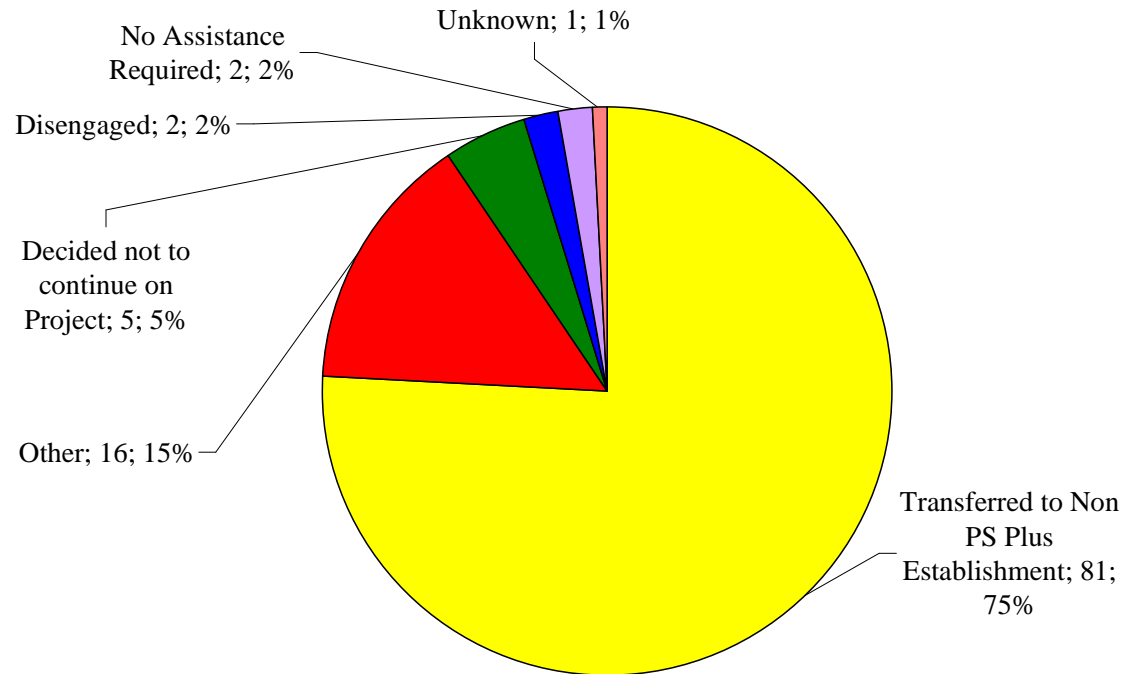
- Most months, Guys Marsh started between 30 and 50 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 6 months of the project (project closure), no more than 50 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Over 700 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Guys Marsh.
- Approximately 837 beneficiaries finished in Guys Marsh – 730 completed the project and 107 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

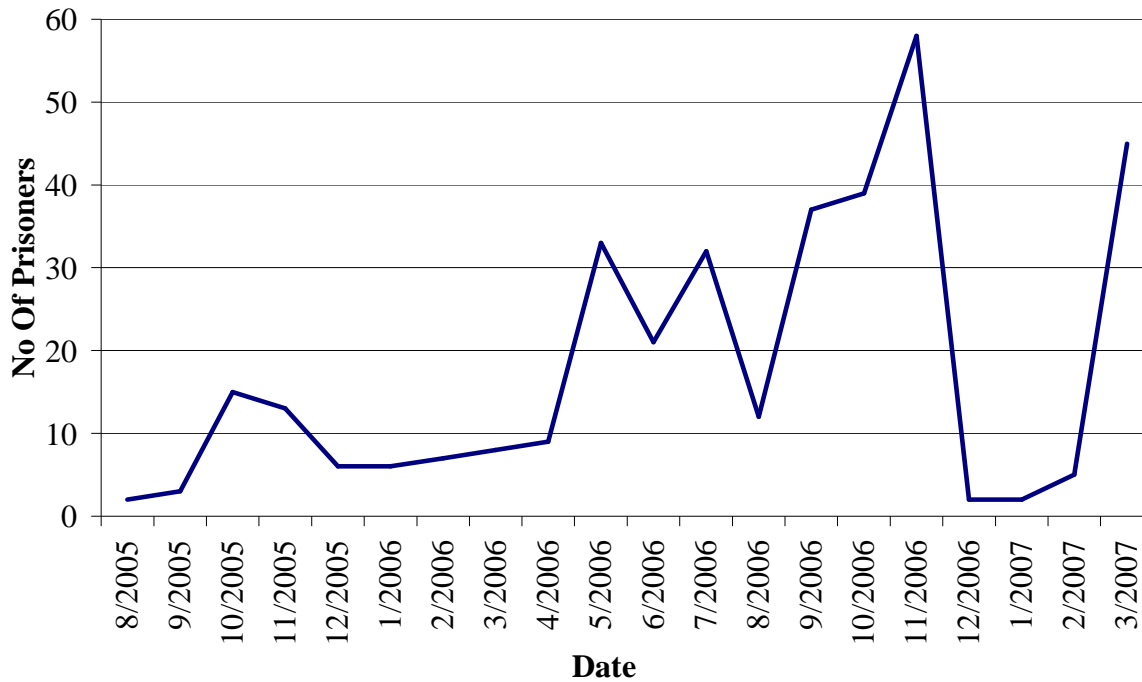

- Of the 107 beneficiaries who left the project early, 75% (81) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- 5 beneficiaries decided not to continue on the project.

Non-Starters Per Month

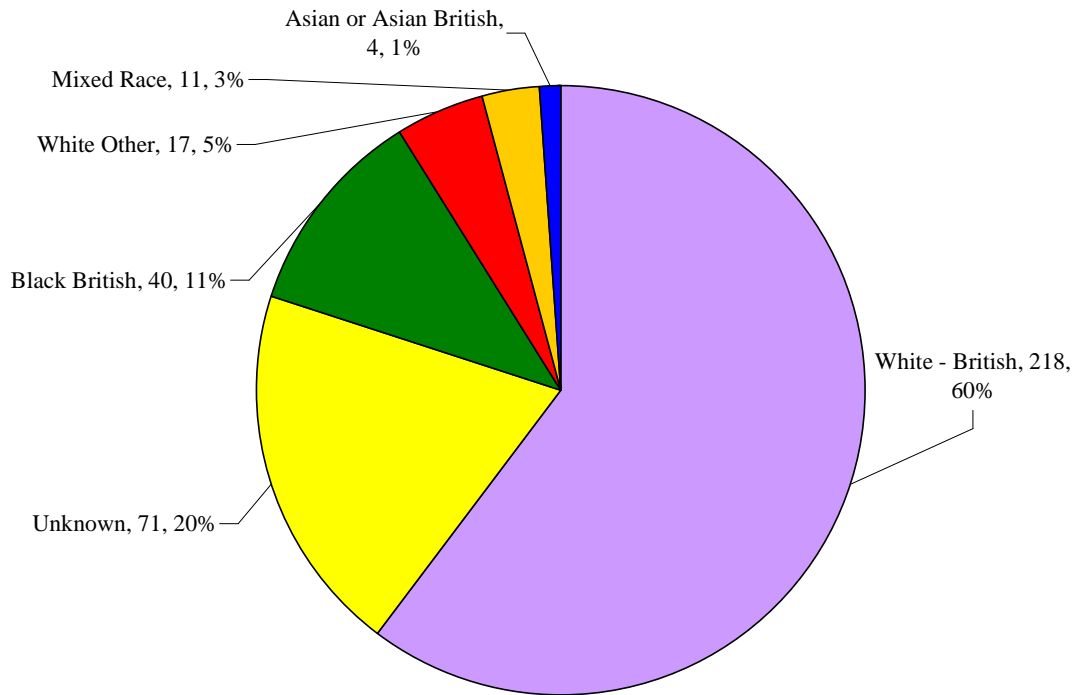

- Most months, more than 10 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 360 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Guys Marsh.
- 146 of the prisoners not started in Guys Marsh did not require PS Plus Services and 65 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (12 transferred before the assessment entered and 53 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



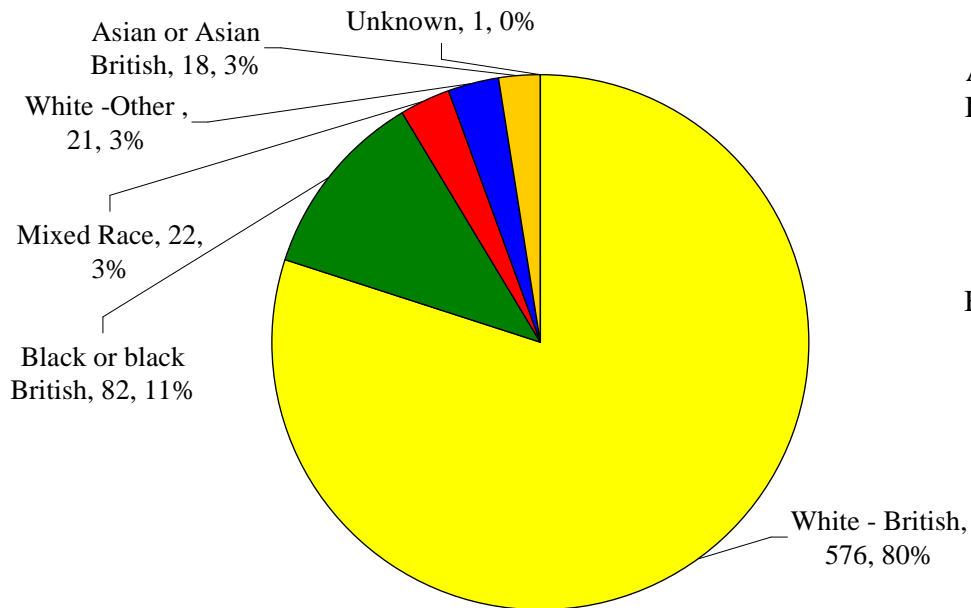

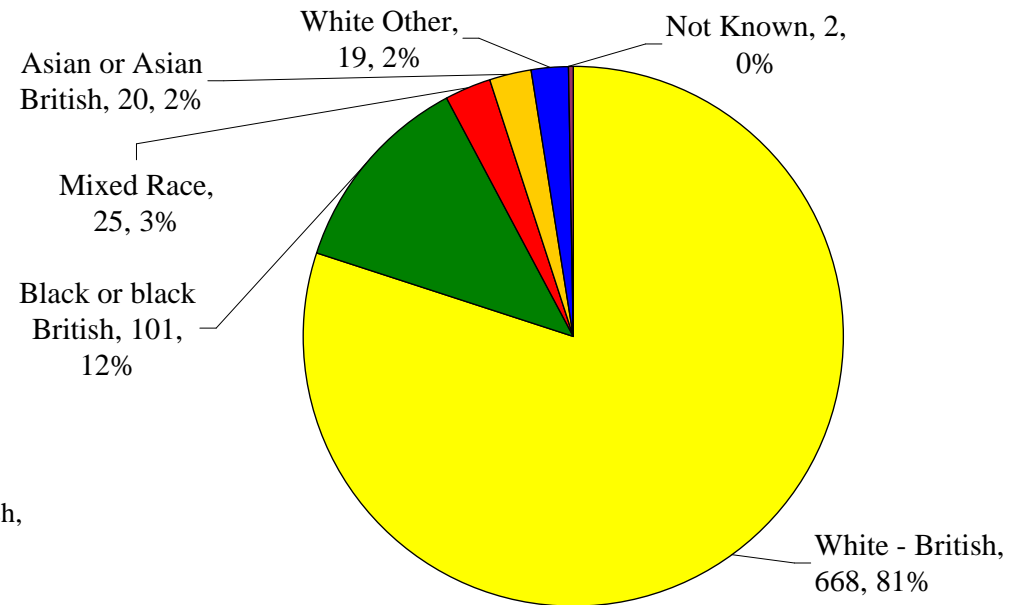
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (60%) and from United Kingdom (88%).
- The ethnic origin for 1 in 5 (71) and the nationality of 1 in 50 (7) of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 20% (72 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 80% (576) of the beneficiaries started and 81% (668) of the beneficiaries who finished in Guys Marsh were White-British.
- 20% (143) of the beneficiaries started and 19% (165) of the beneficiaries who finished in Guys Marsh were from ethnic minorities.

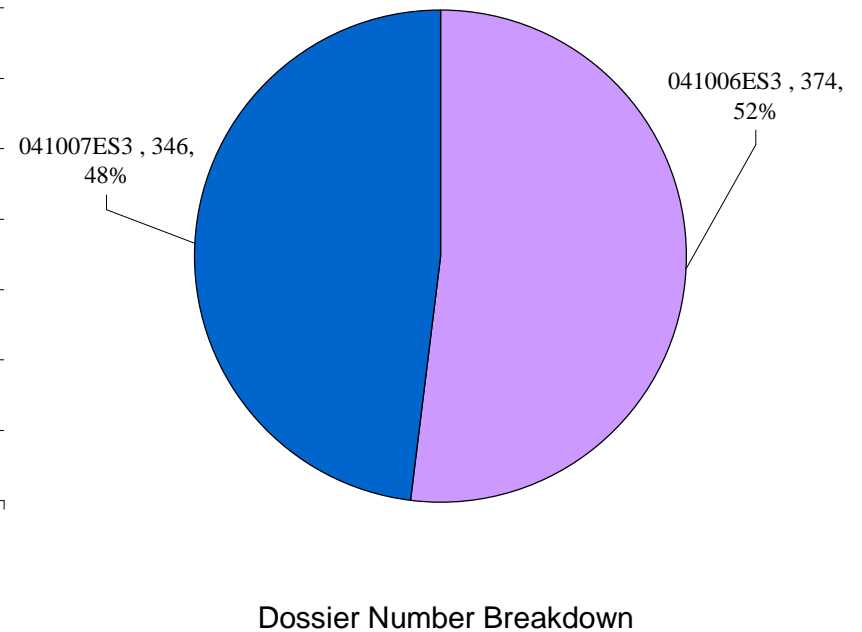
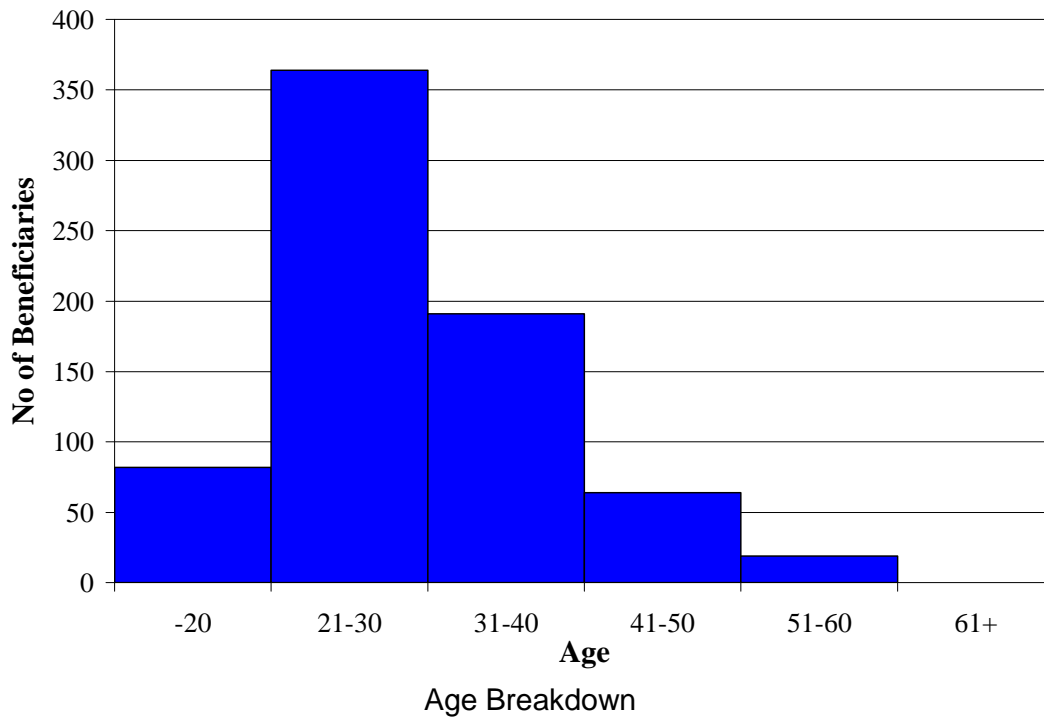

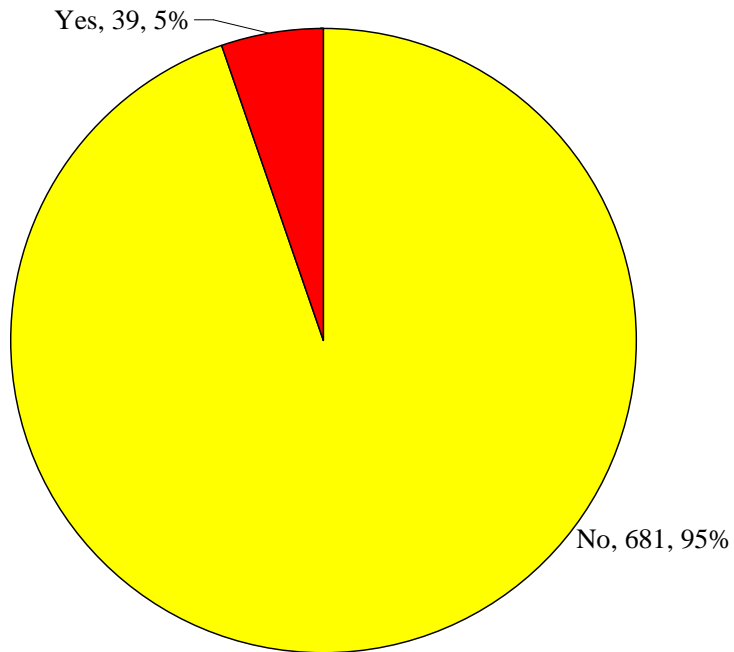
- 93% (667) of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- 93% (780) of the beneficiaries who finished in Guys Marsh stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationality of 30 of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh and 20 of the beneficiaries that finished in Guys Marsh was unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

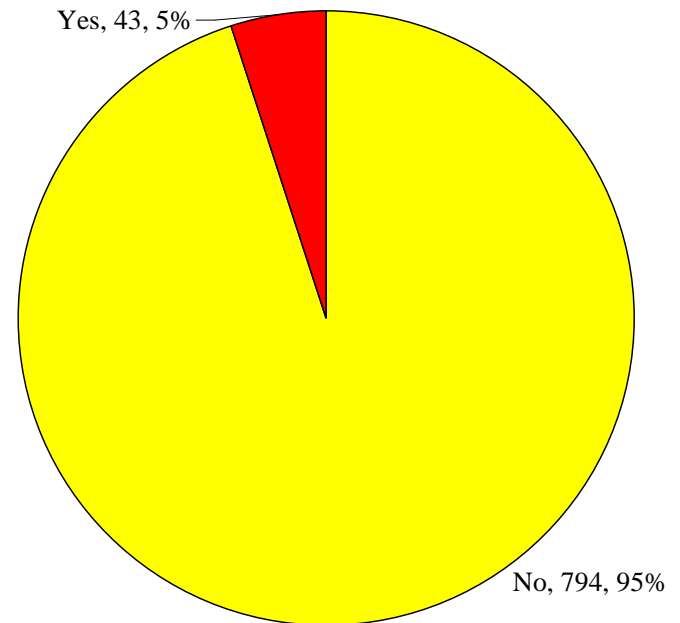


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Guys Marsh is 29 years and 6 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 52% (374) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041006ES3 (male beneficiaries aged under 28).

Disabled Beneficiaries



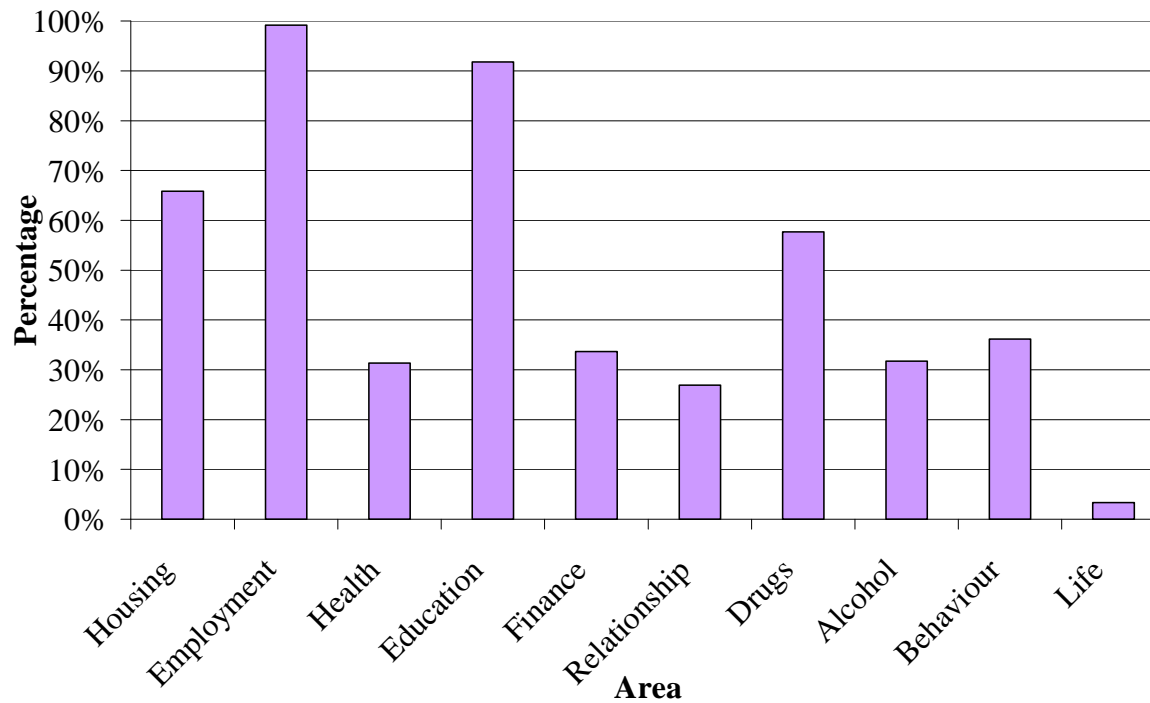
Beneficiaries Starting in Guys Marsh



Beneficiaries Finishing in Guys Marsh

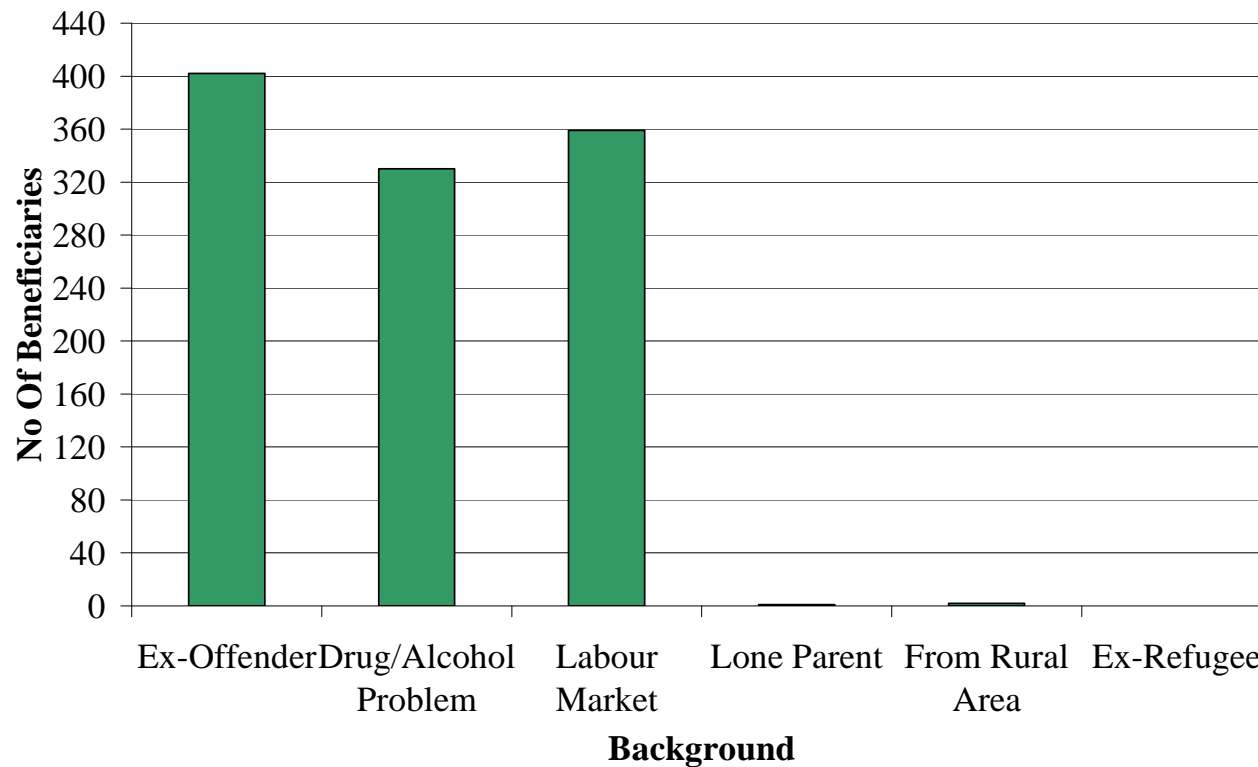
- 5% (39) of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh were classified as being disabled.
- 5% (43) of the beneficiaries who finished in Guys Marsh were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Guys Marsh



- Almost all of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh needed help with employment and over 90% needed help with education.
- Over 60% of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh needed help with housing.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh needed help with drug issues.

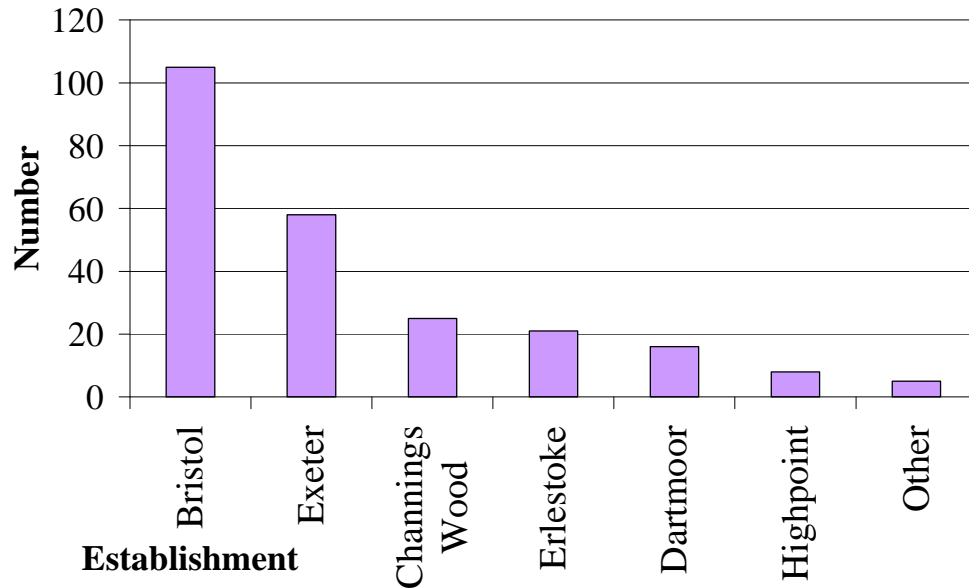

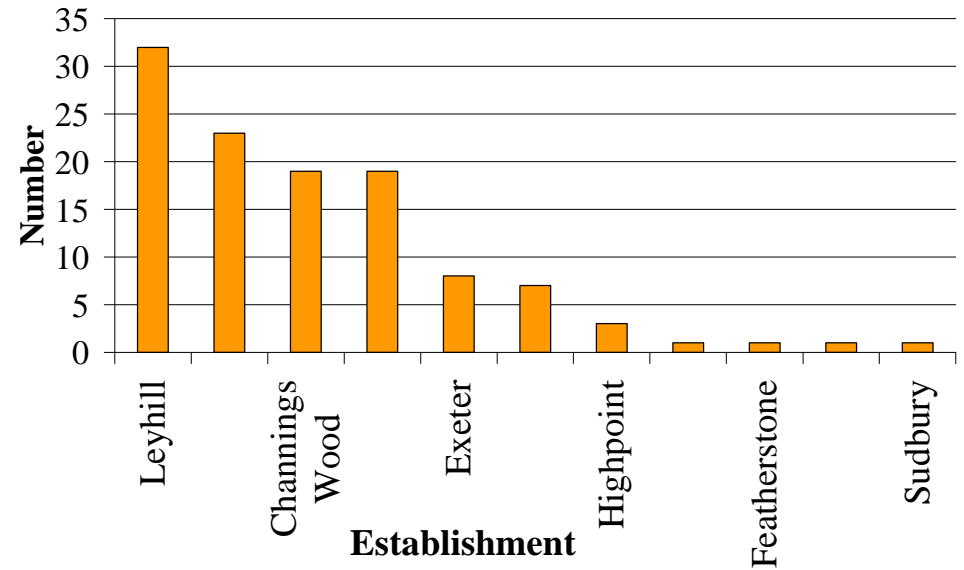
- Over 400 of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh were ex-offenders.
- Over 320 of the beneficiaries who started in Guys Marsh had a drug or alcohol problem.

Transfers into Guys Marsh

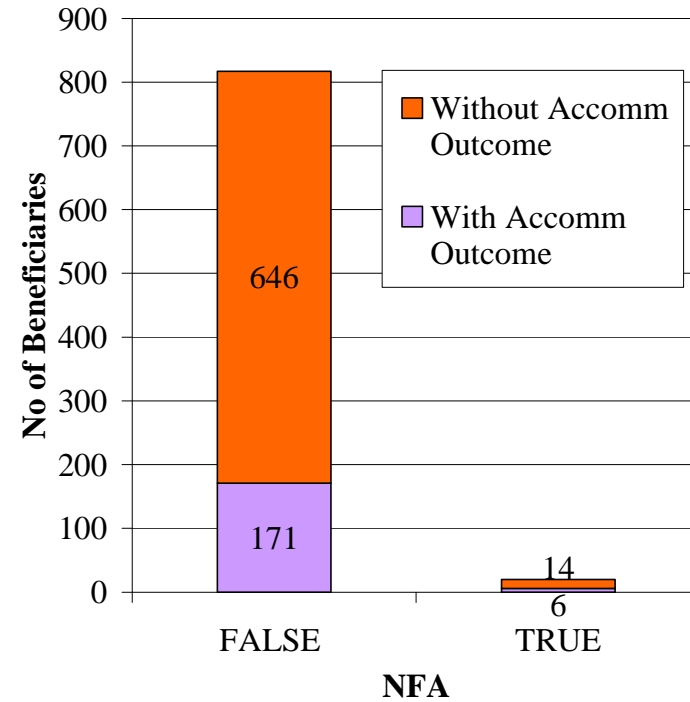
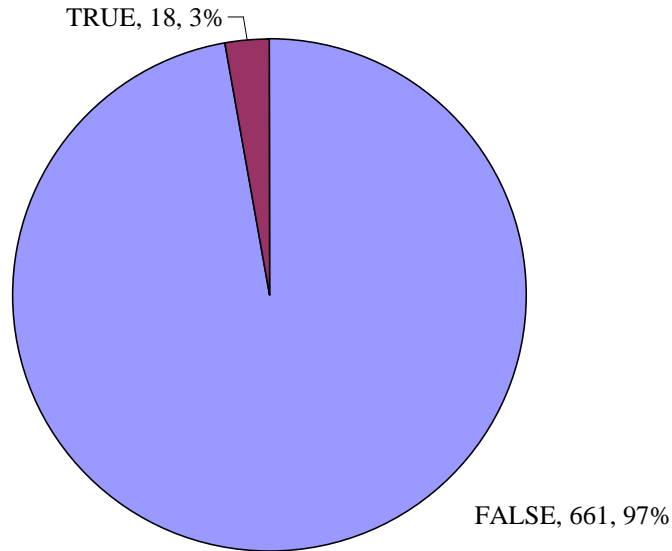


Transfers from Guys Marsh



- 238 beneficiaries have transferred into Guys Marsh – 68% transferred to Guys Marsh from Bristol and Exeter.
- 115 beneficiaries have transferred from Guys Marsh – 81% transferred from Guys Marsh to Leyhill, Bristol, Channings Wood and Erlestoke.

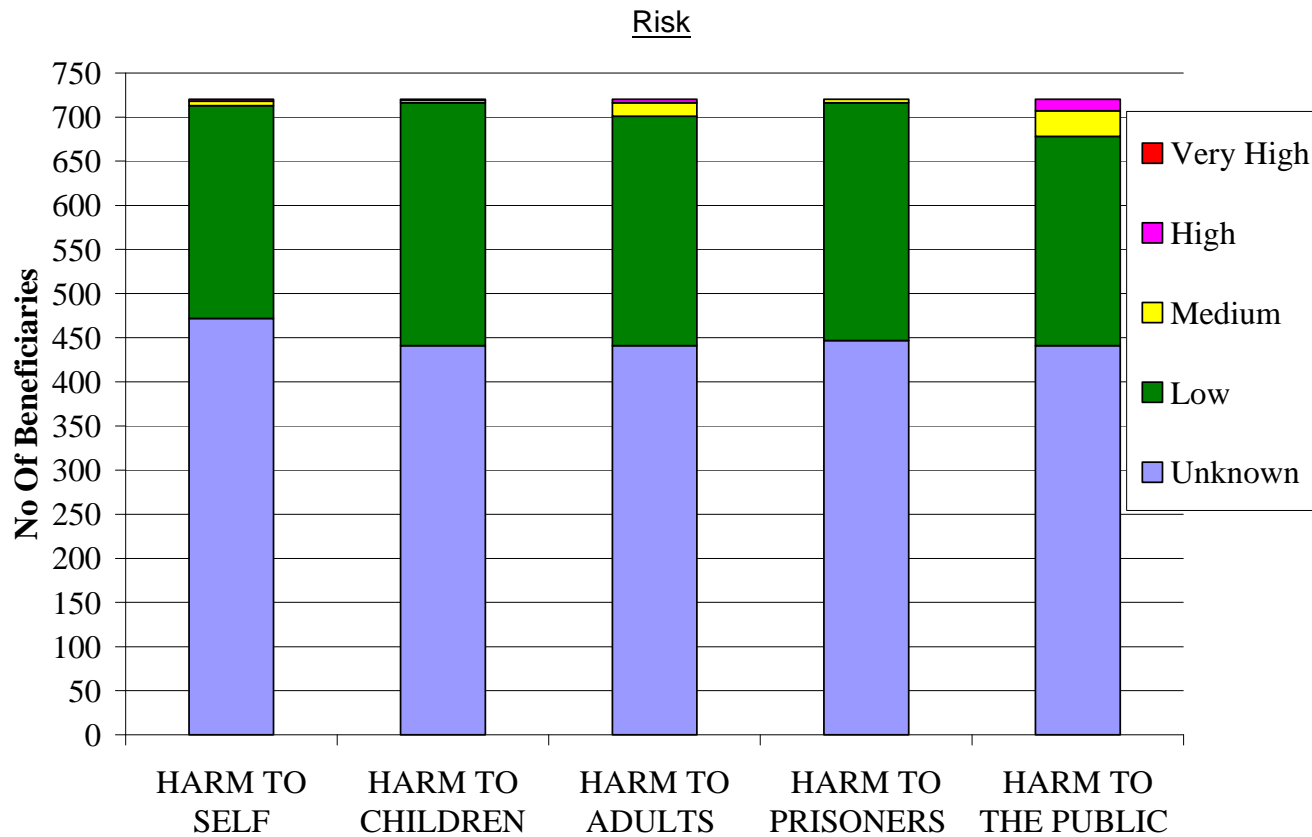
Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

Beneficiaries Finishing in Guys Marsh

- 3% (18) of the beneficiaries started in Guys Marsh were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 20 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 6 had an accommodation outcome secured.



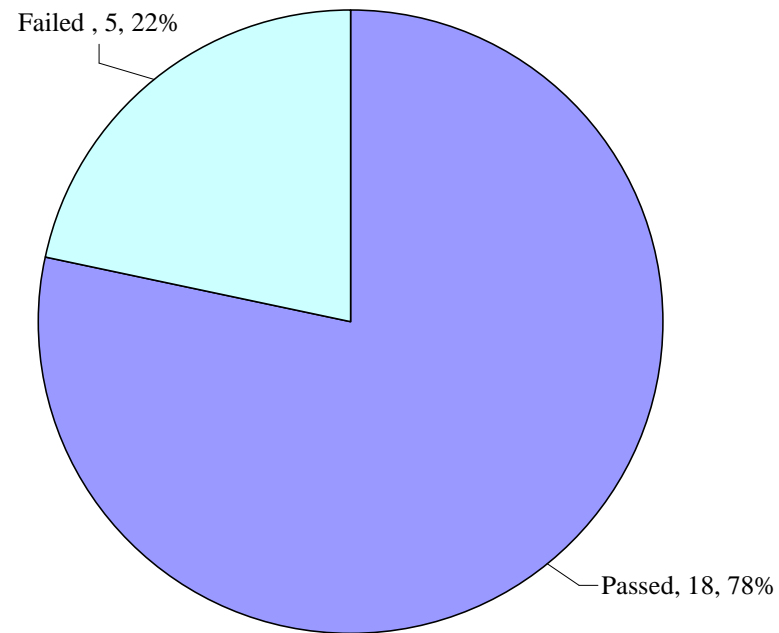
- For almost 450 beneficiaries, level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

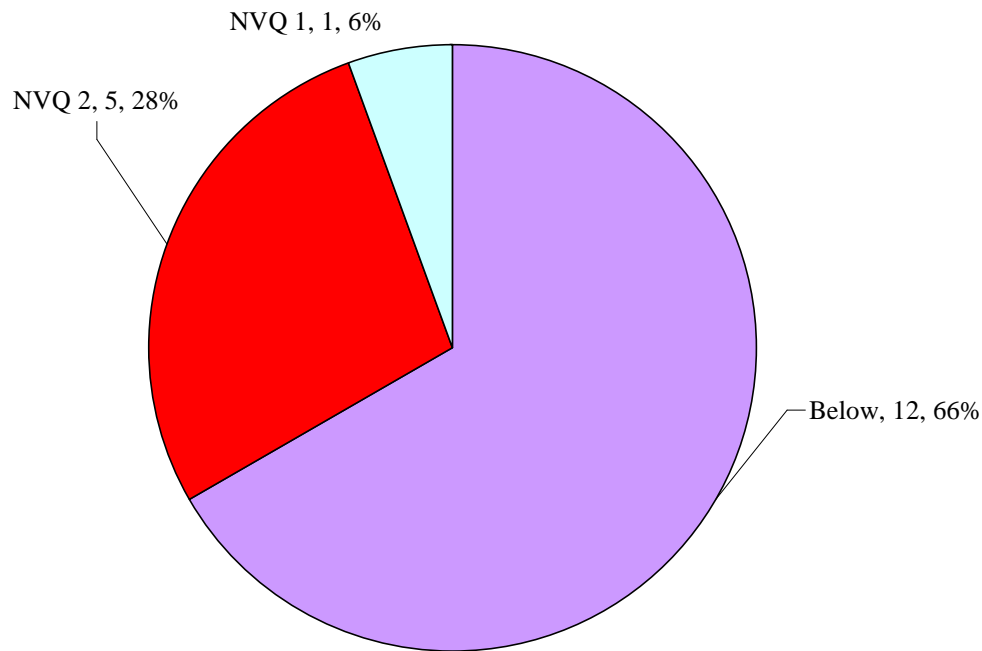
- 376 soft outcomes were gained by Guys Marsh beneficiaries.
- 112 beneficiaries received Advice on Disclosure.
- 66 beneficiaries had assistance in writing a CV.
- Beneficiaries in Guys Marsh attended 45 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 21 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.

Exam Results



- 78% (18) of the exams taken were passed.
- 5 exams were failed.

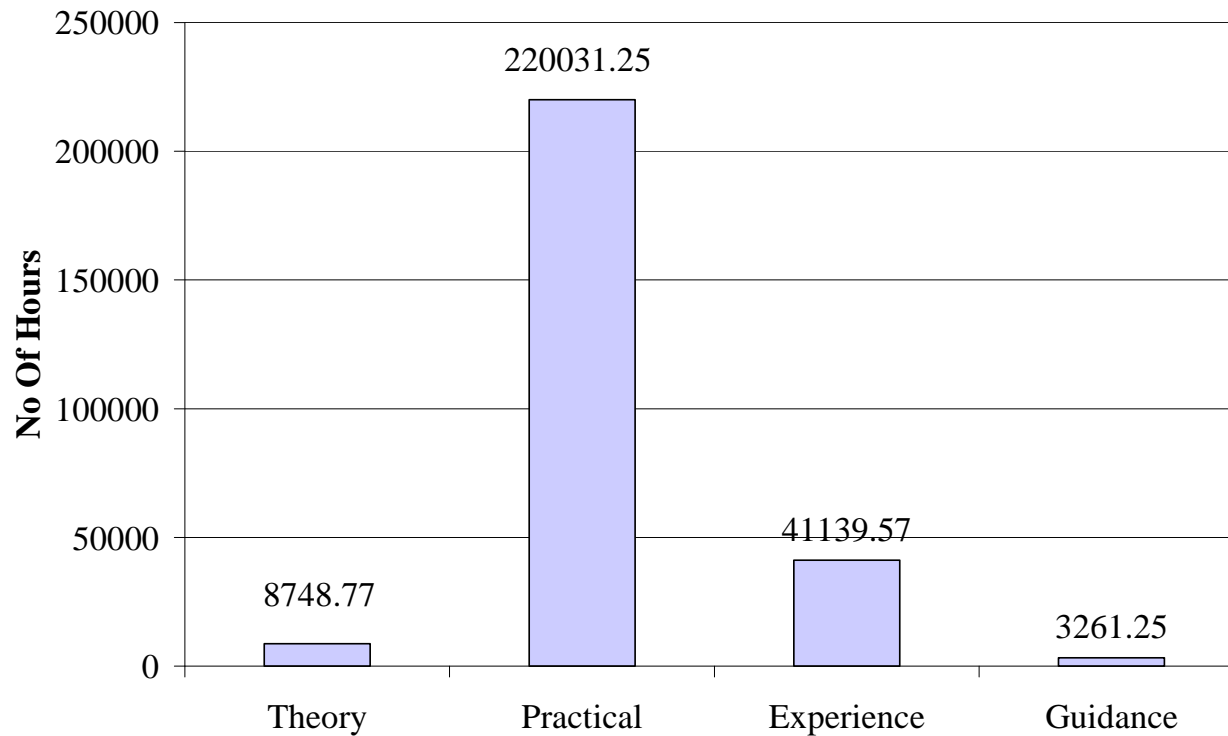

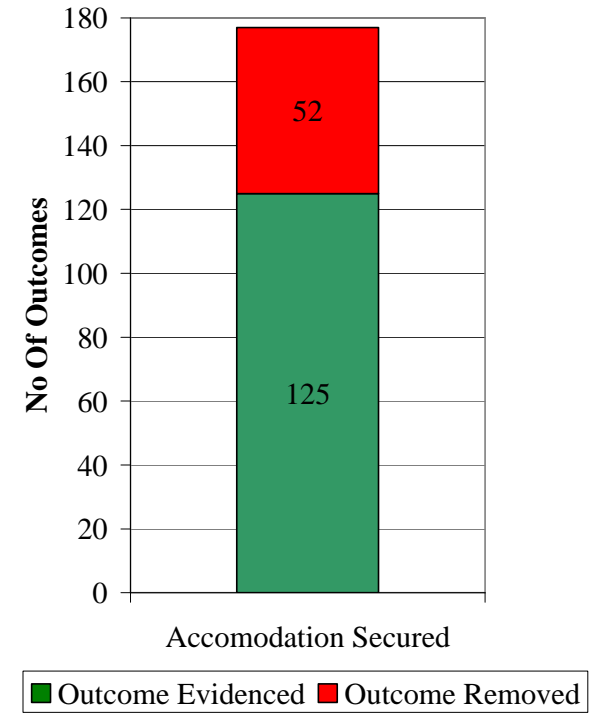
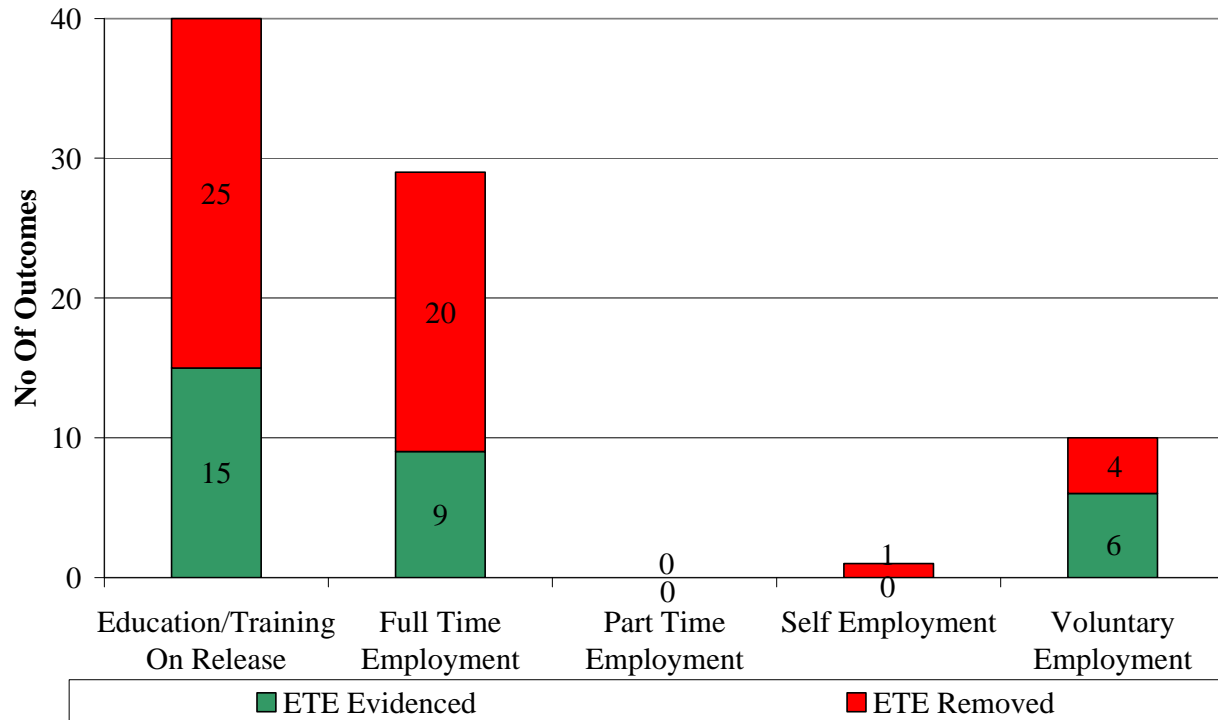
- 6 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Guys Marsh.
- 8 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Guys Marsh.

Timesheet Hours



- 273,181 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 220,031 (81%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 80 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Guys Marsh with evidence for 30 of these outcomes (38% evidence for outcome rate).
- 177 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded, with evidence for 125 outcomes (71% evidence for outcome rate).
