

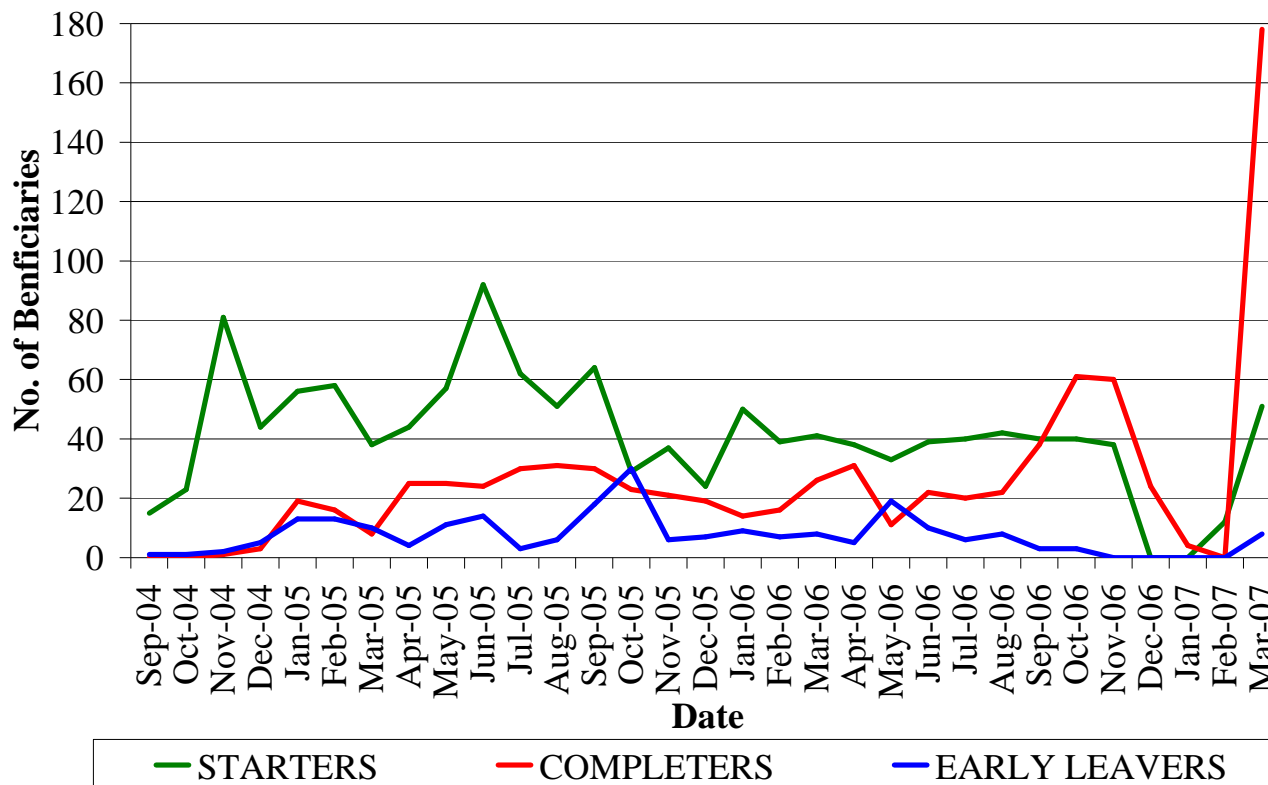

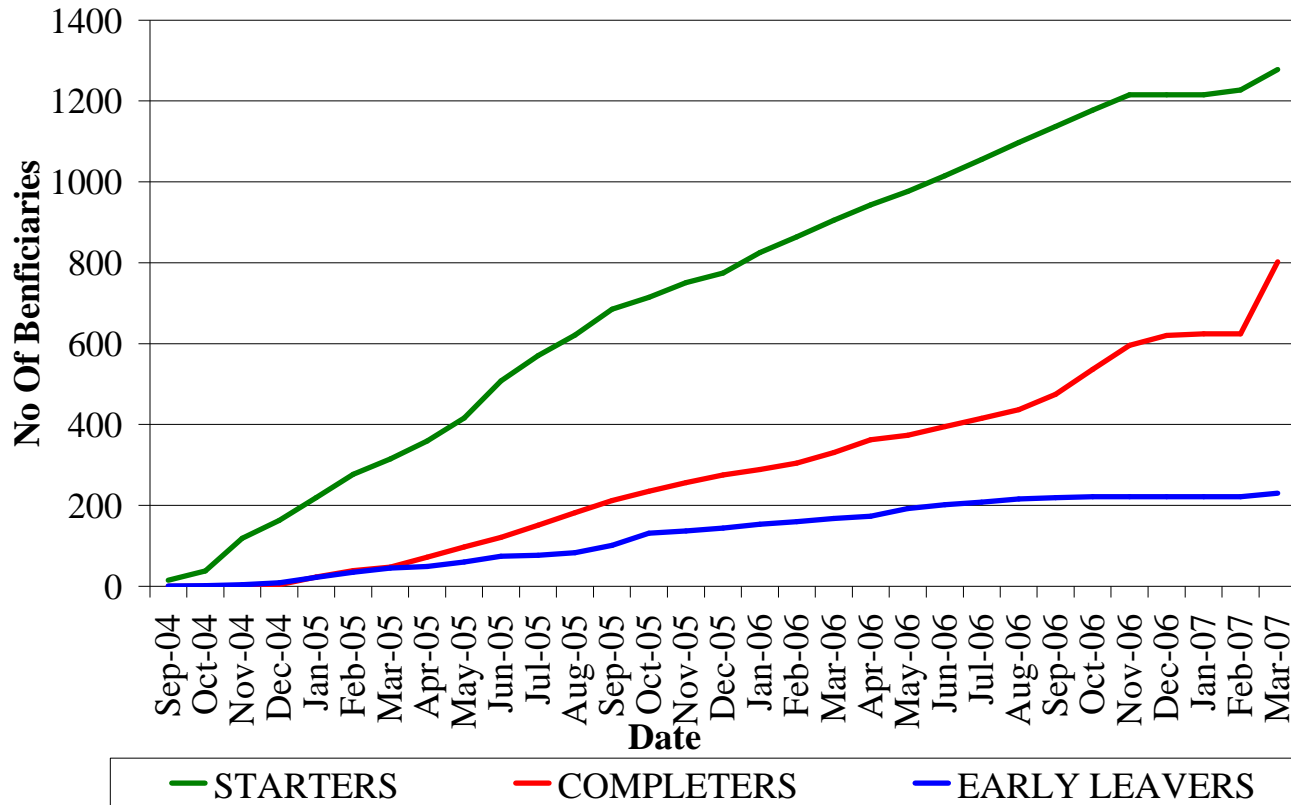

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



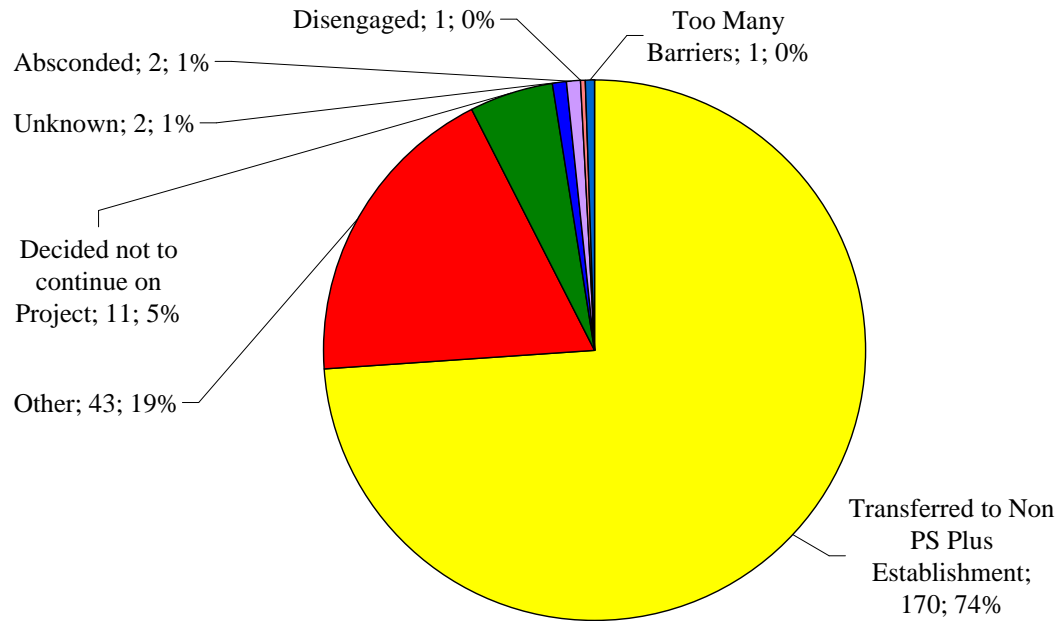
- Most months, Hindley started between 35 and 60 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 6 months of the project (project closure), no more than 40 beneficiaries were completing the PS plus 2 project per month

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 1300 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Hindley.
- Over 1000 beneficiaries finished in Hindley – 802 completed the project and 230 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

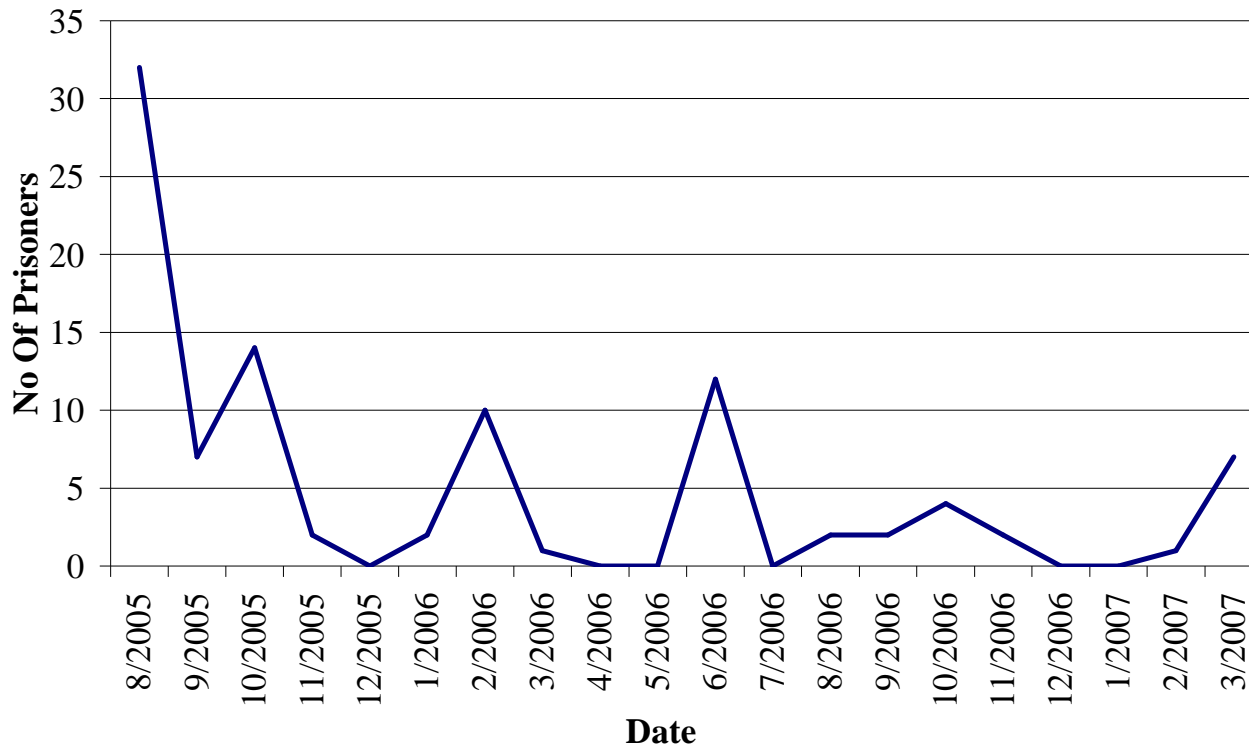

- Of the 230 beneficiaries who left the project early, 74% (170) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- 11 beneficiaries decided not to continue on the project.

Non-Starters Per Month

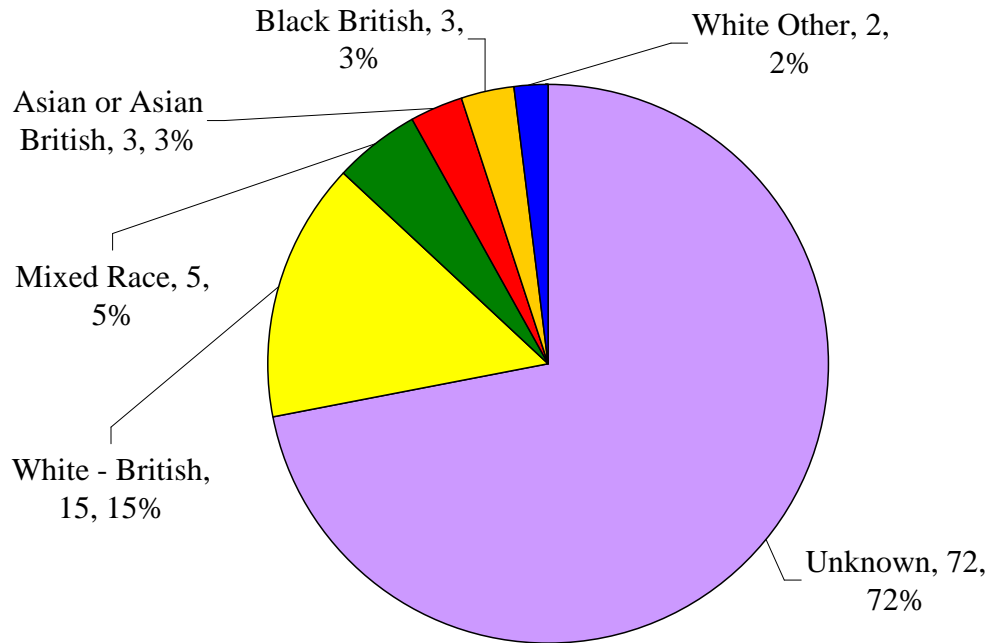

- With the exception of August 2004, less than 15 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project each month.
- Of the 100 prisoners not started, 59 transferred to a non PS Plus establishment.

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



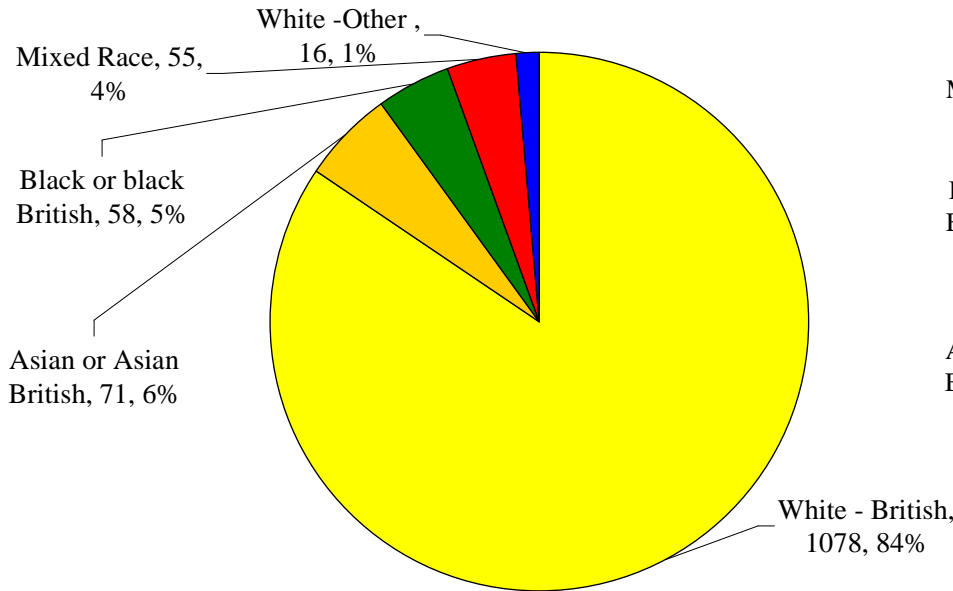

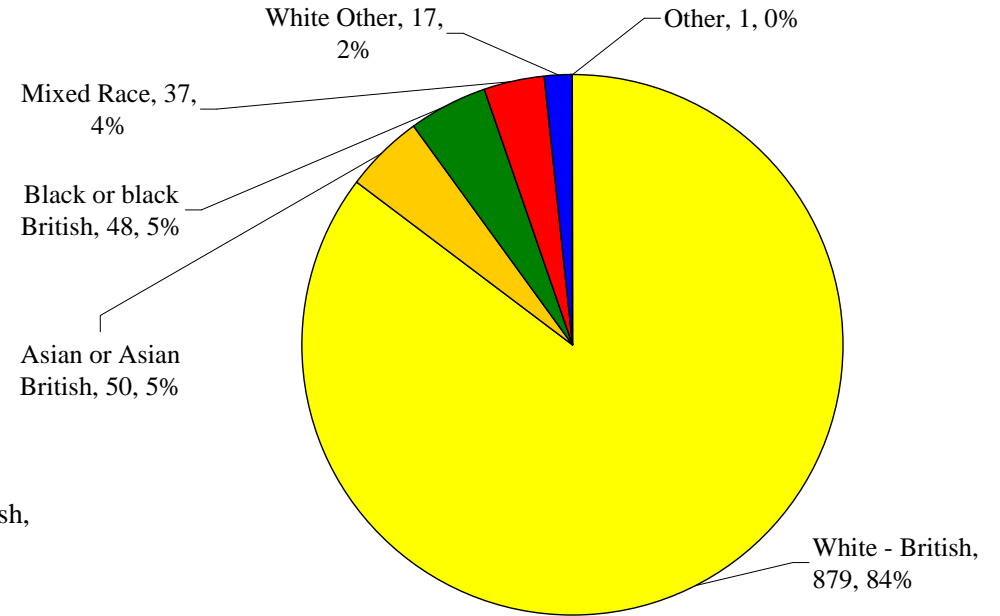
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project had unknown ethnic origin (72%) and unknown nationality (55%).
- Where ethnic origin and nationality were known, the majority were White-British (15 prisoners) and from United Kingdom (32 prisoners).
- Ethnic Minorities account for 13% (13 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 84% (1078) of the beneficiaries who started and 84% (879) of the beneficiaries who finished in Hindley were White-British.
- 16% (200) of the beneficiaries who started and 16% (152) of the beneficiaries who finished in Hindley were from ethnic minorities.

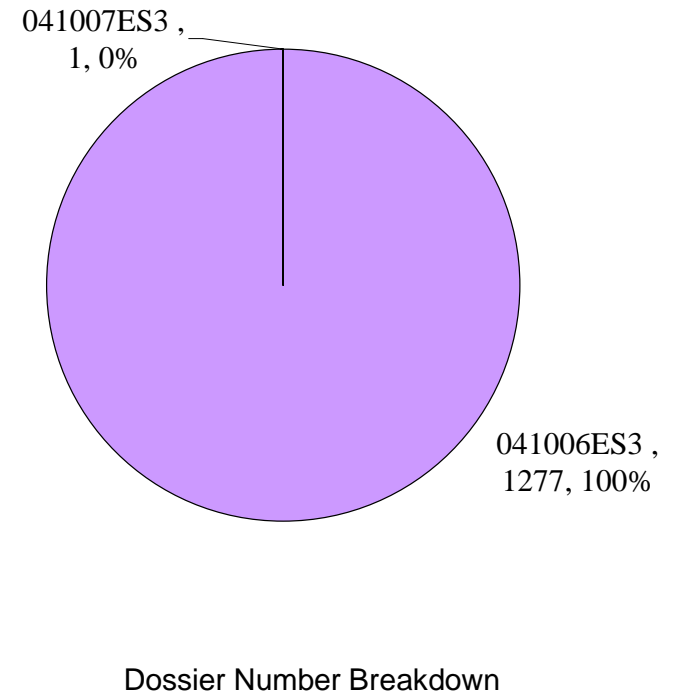
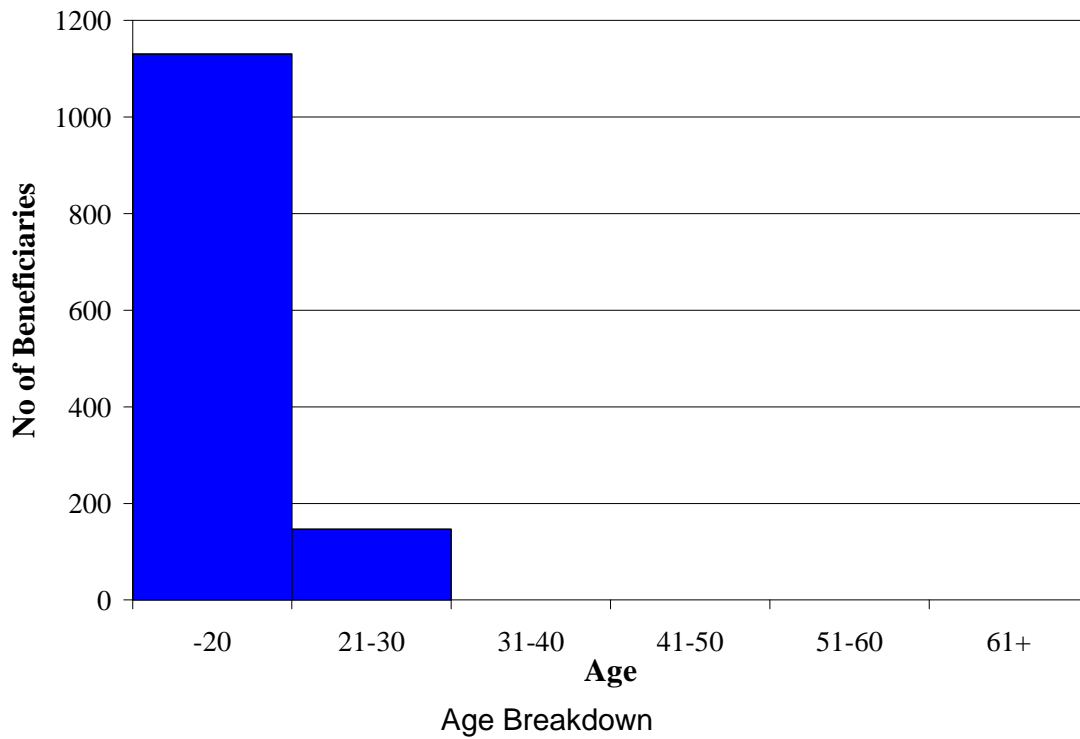

- 77% (979) of the beneficiaries started in Hindley stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- 75% (770) of the beneficiaries who finished in Hindley stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 282 of the beneficiaries started in Hindley and 256 of the beneficiaries that finished in Hindley are unknown.

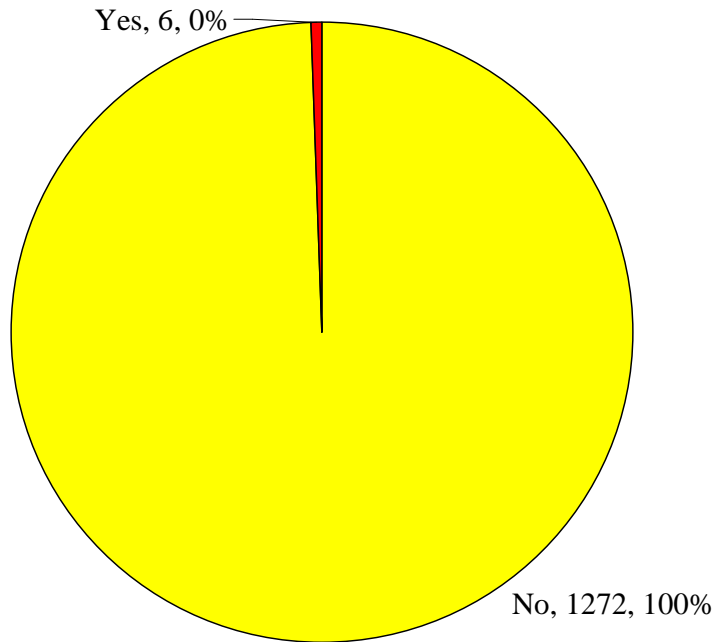


Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

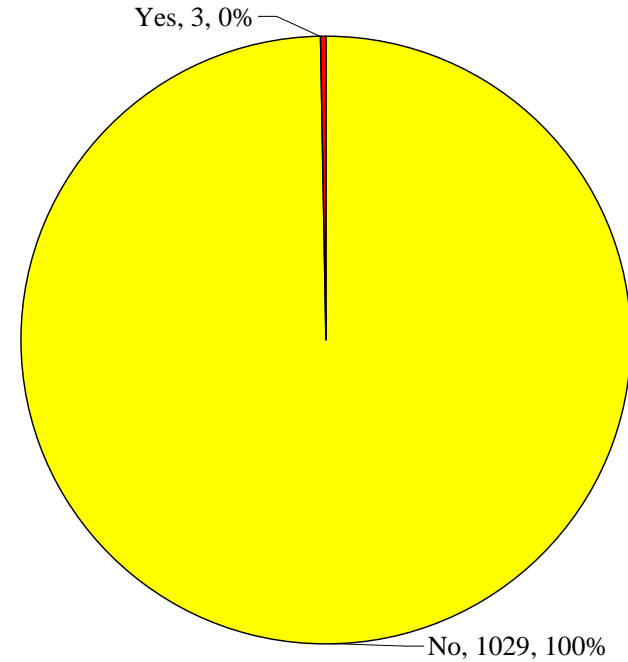


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Hindley is 18 years and 5 months. The average (mode) age group is -20 years old.
- More than 99% (1277) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041006ES3 (male beneficiaries aged under 28).

Disabled Beneficiaries



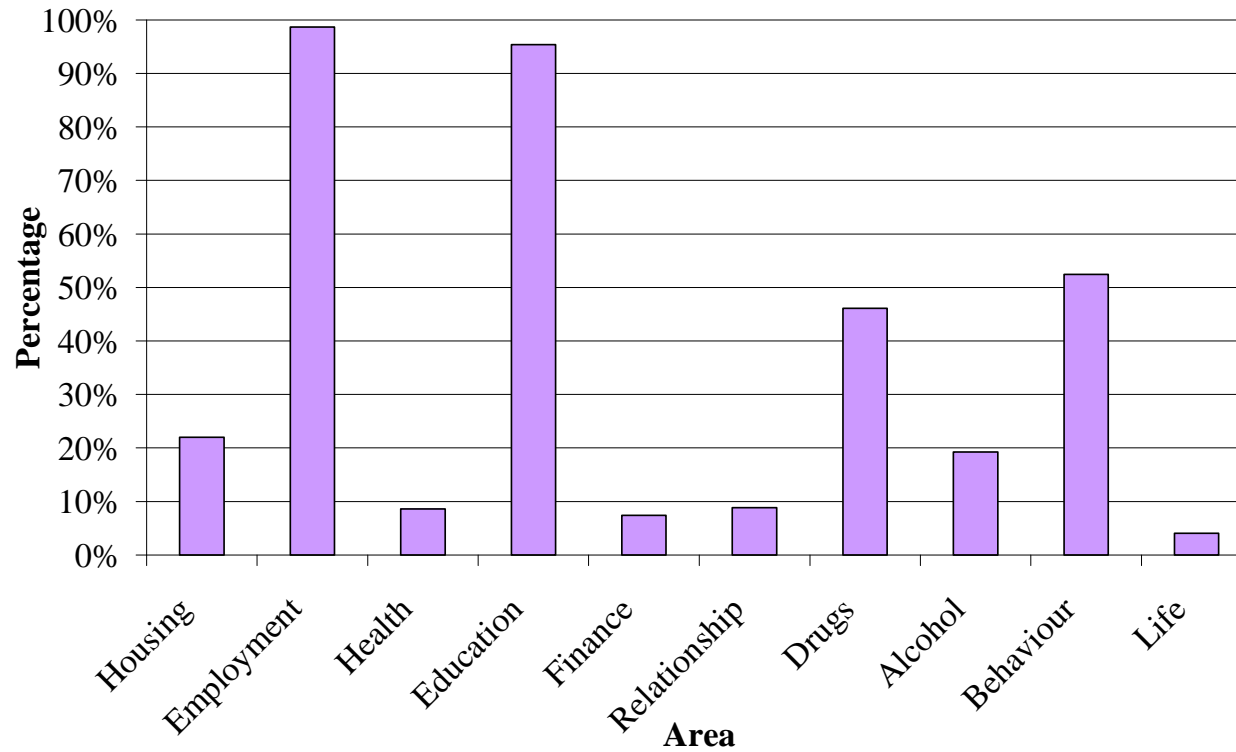

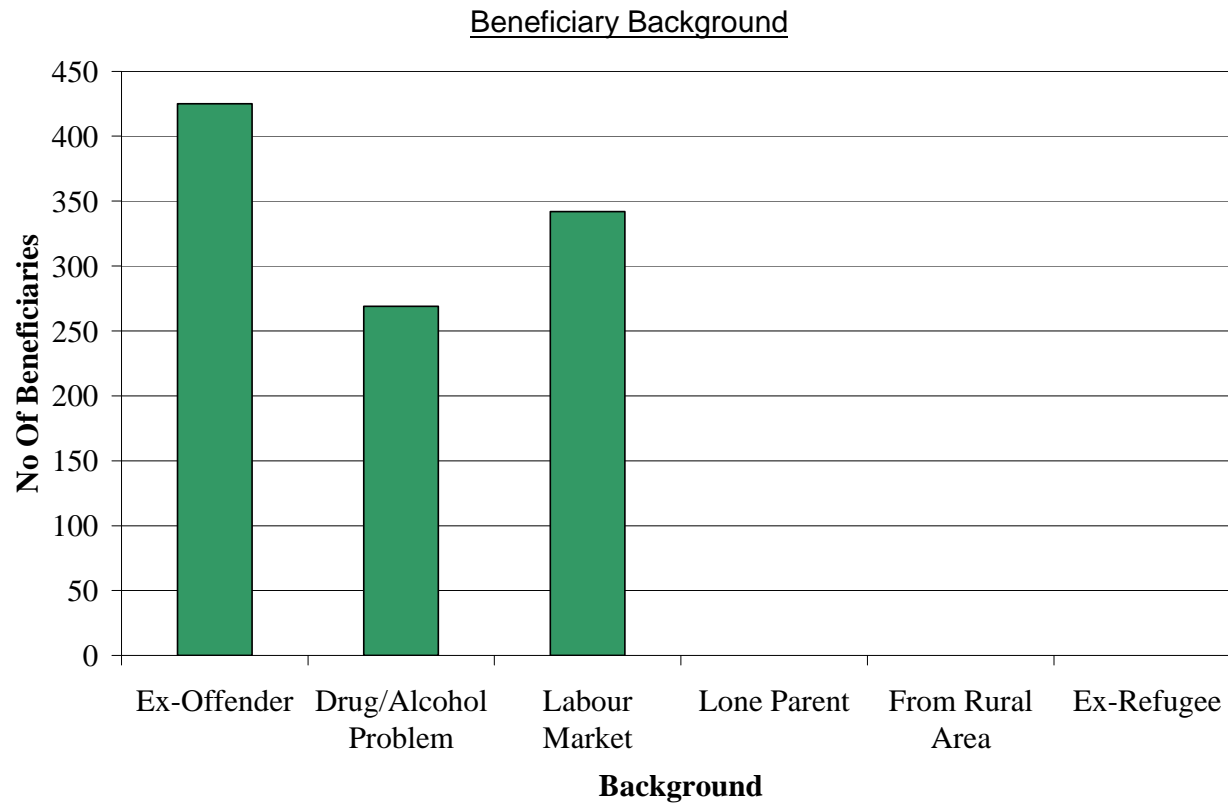
Beneficiaries Finishing in Hindley

- 6 of the beneficiaries who started in Hindley were classified as being disabled.
- 3 of the beneficiaries who finished in Hindley were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Hindley



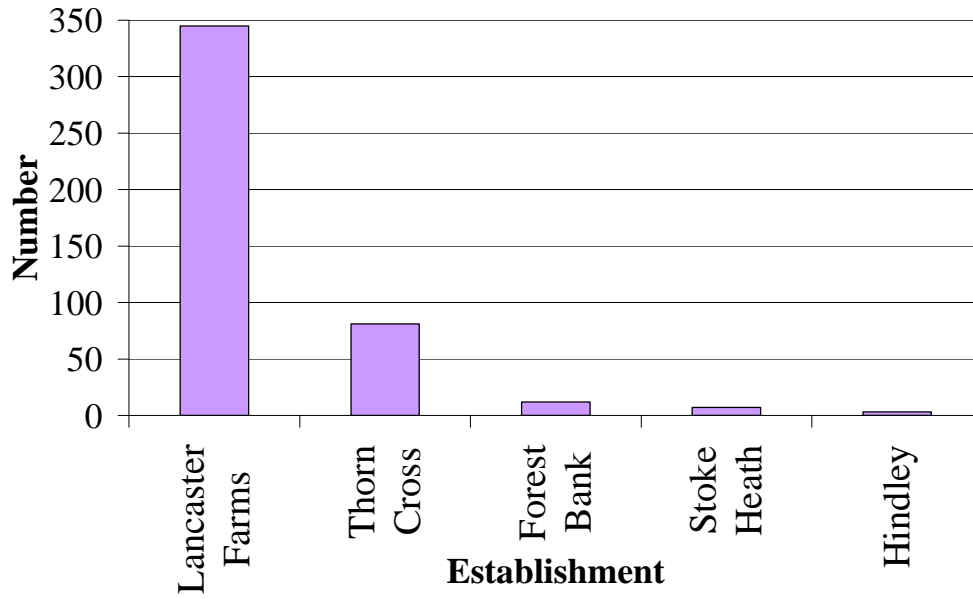
- Almost every beneficiary who started in Hindley needed help with employment and over 90% needed help with education.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Hindley needed help with behaviour issues.
- Over 40% of the beneficiaries who started in Hindley needed help with drugs issues.



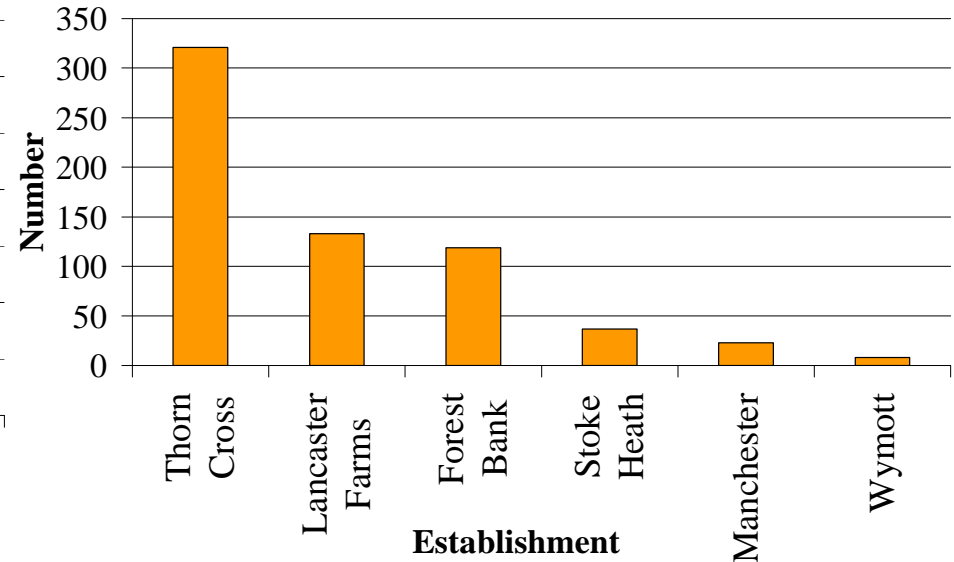
- Over 400 of the beneficiaries who started in Hindley were ex-offenders.
- Nearly 350 of the beneficiaries who started in Hindley are on the labour market.
- Over 250 of the beneficiaries who started in Hindley had drug or alcohol related problems.

Transfers into Hindley

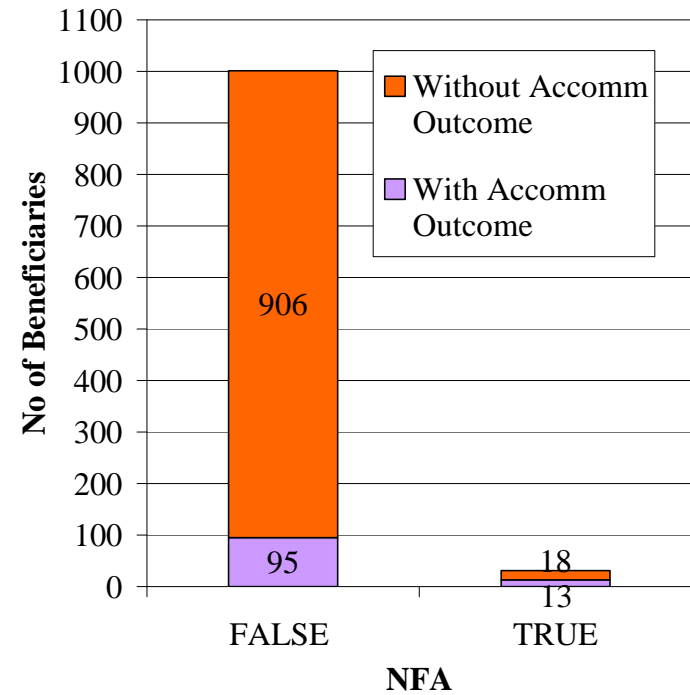
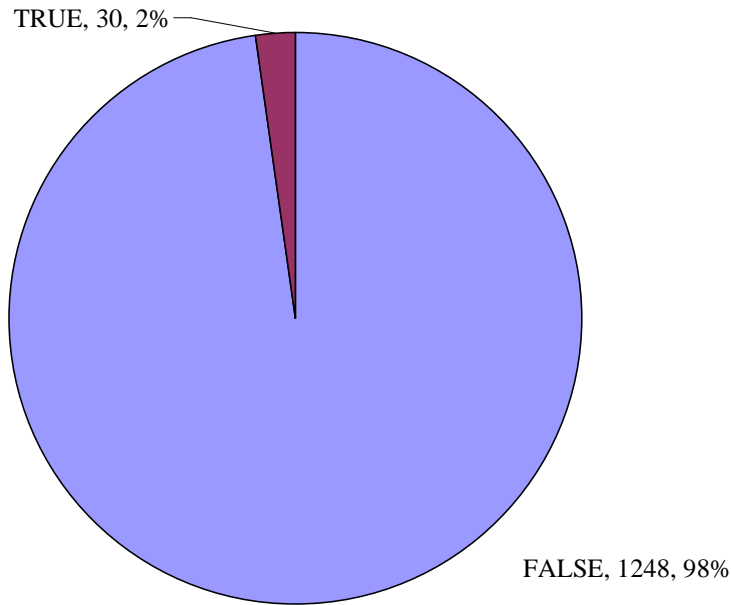


Transfers from Hindley



- 448 beneficiaries have transferred into Hindley – 77% transferred to Hindley from Lancaster Farms.
- 664 beneficiaries have transferred from Hindley – 86% transferred from Hindley to Thorn Cross, Lancaster Farms and Forest Bank.

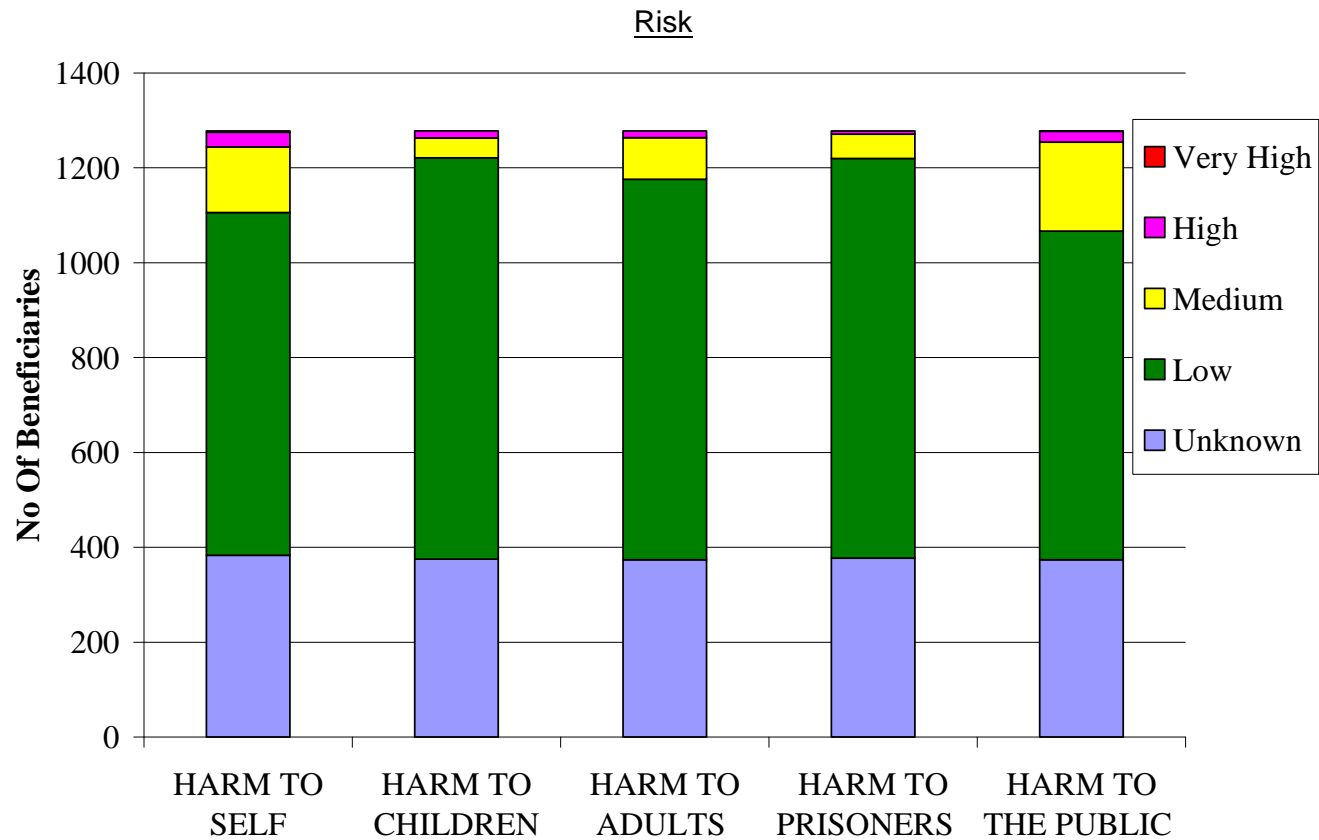
Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

Beneficiaries Finishing in Hindley

- 2% (30) of the beneficiaries started in Hindley were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 31 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 13 had an accommodation outcome secured.



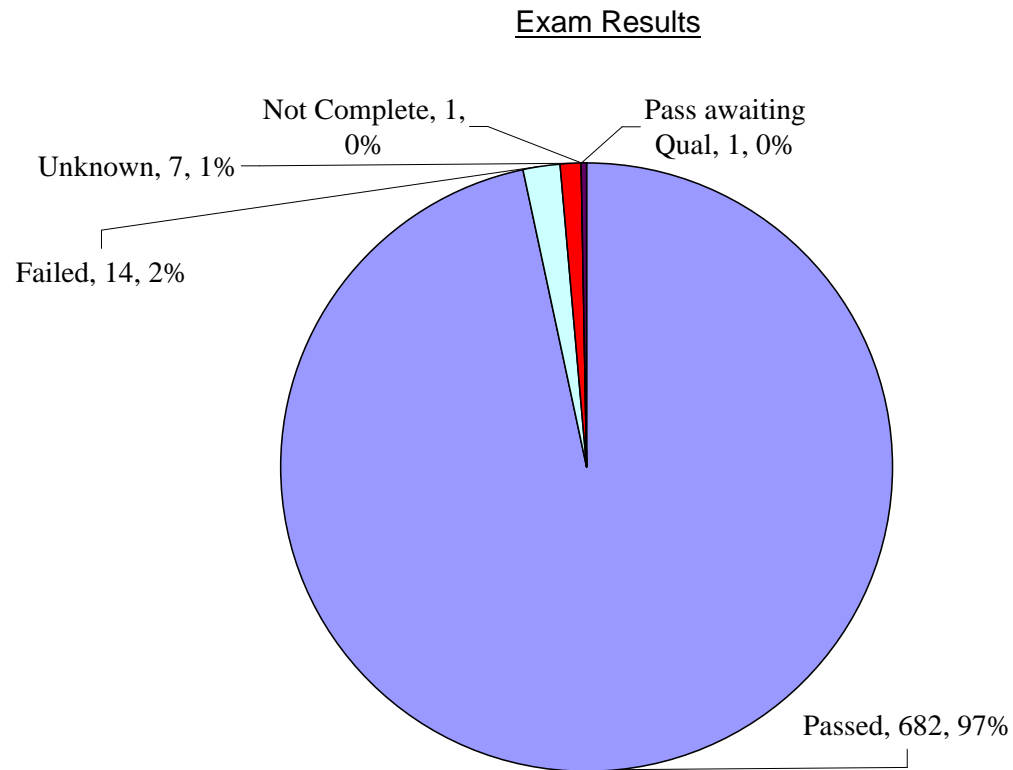
- For almost 400 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

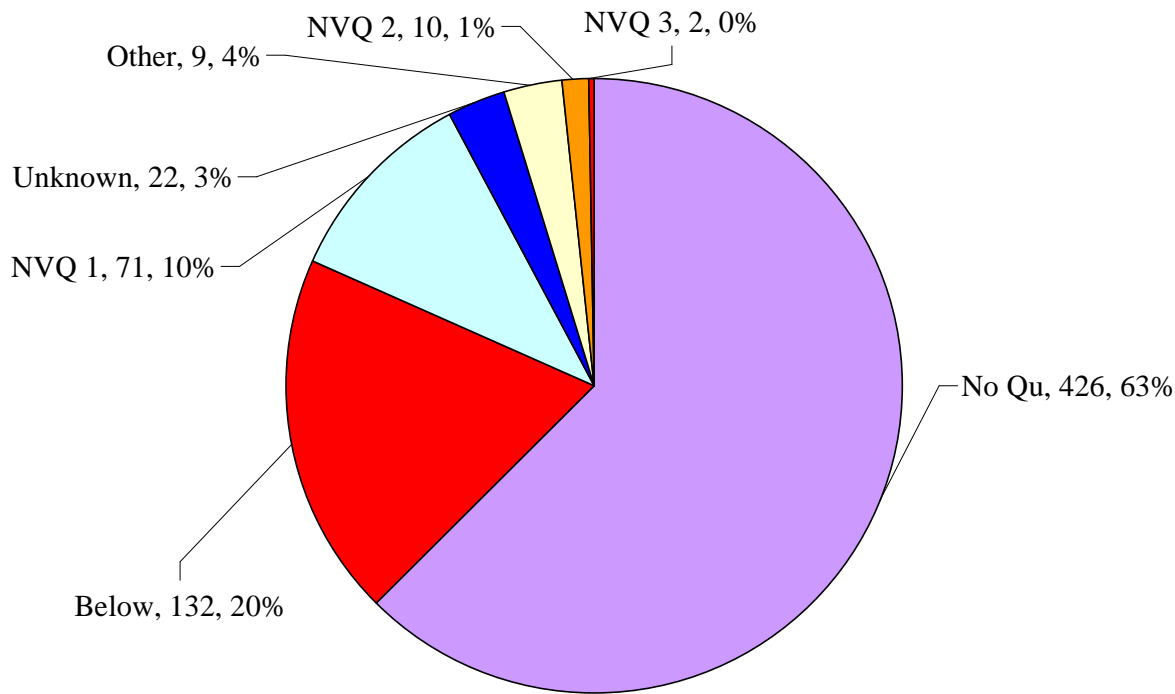
- 930 soft outcomes were gained by Hindley beneficiaries.
- 143 beneficiaries gained non-NVQ qualifications while in prison.
- 112 beneficiaries had assistance writing a CV.
- Beneficiaries in Hindley attended 194 interviews – Fresh Start, Progress to Work, Job, Further Education and New Deal interviews.
- 105 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.





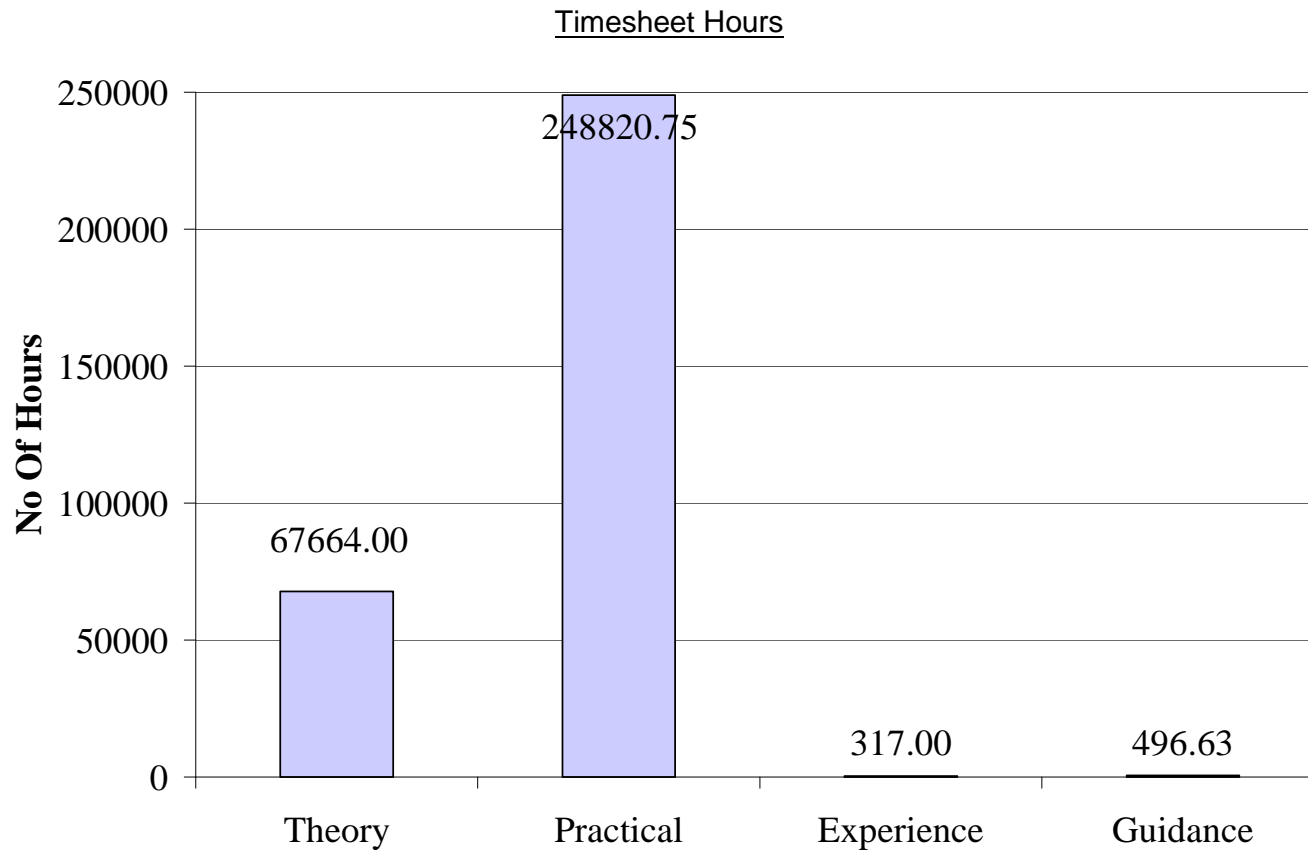
- 97% (683) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only 14 exams (2%) were failed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



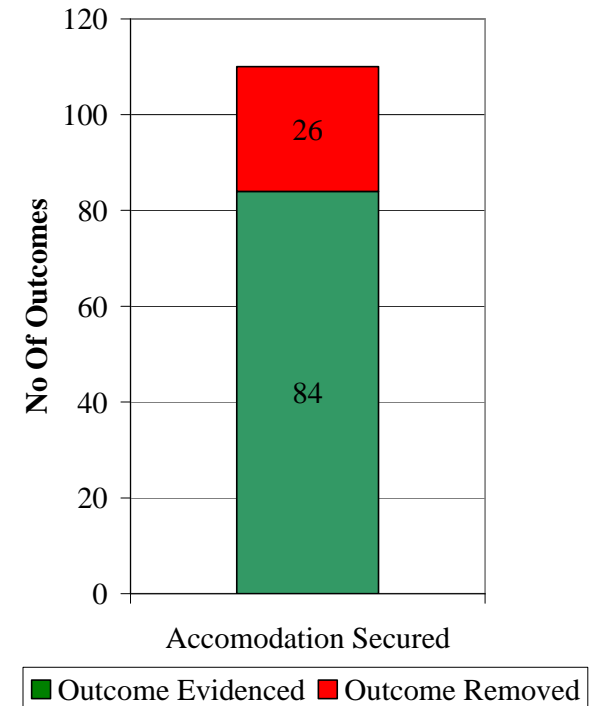
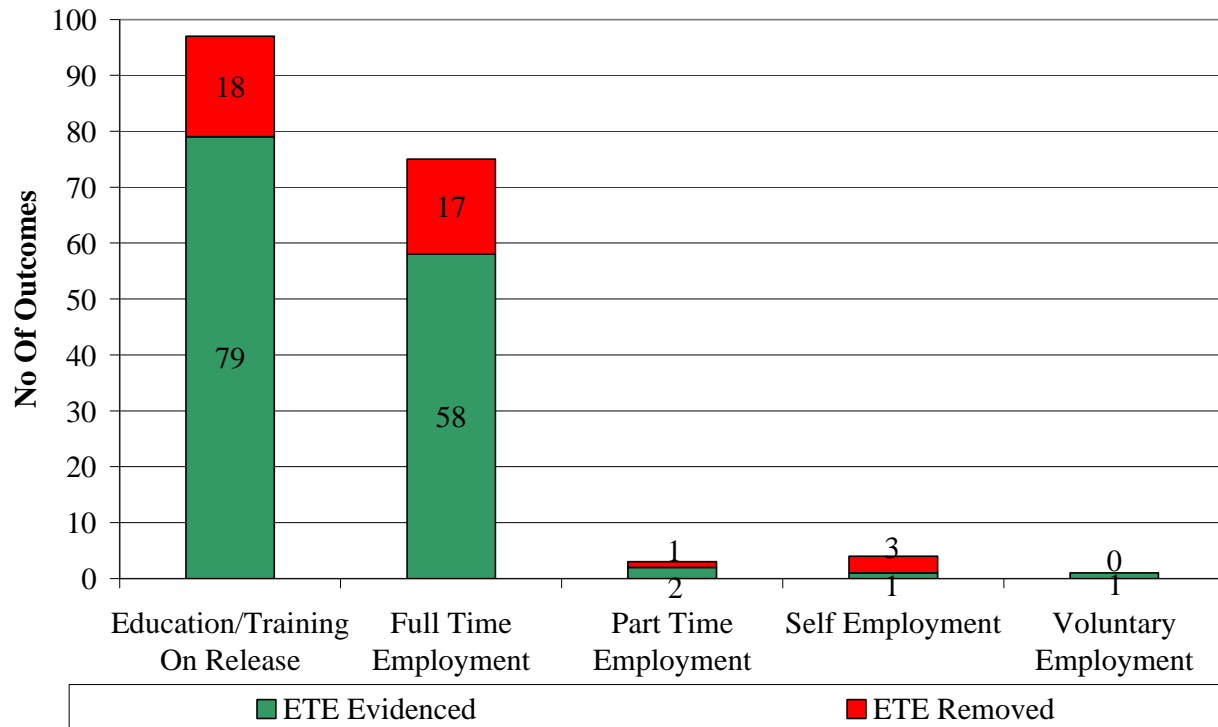

- 83 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Hindley.
- 192 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been completed.



- 317,298 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 248,821 (78%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

### Hard Outcomes



- 180 hard , training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Hindley with evidence for 141 of these outcomes (78% evidence for outcome rate).
- 110 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 84 outcomes (76% evidence for outcome rate).
