

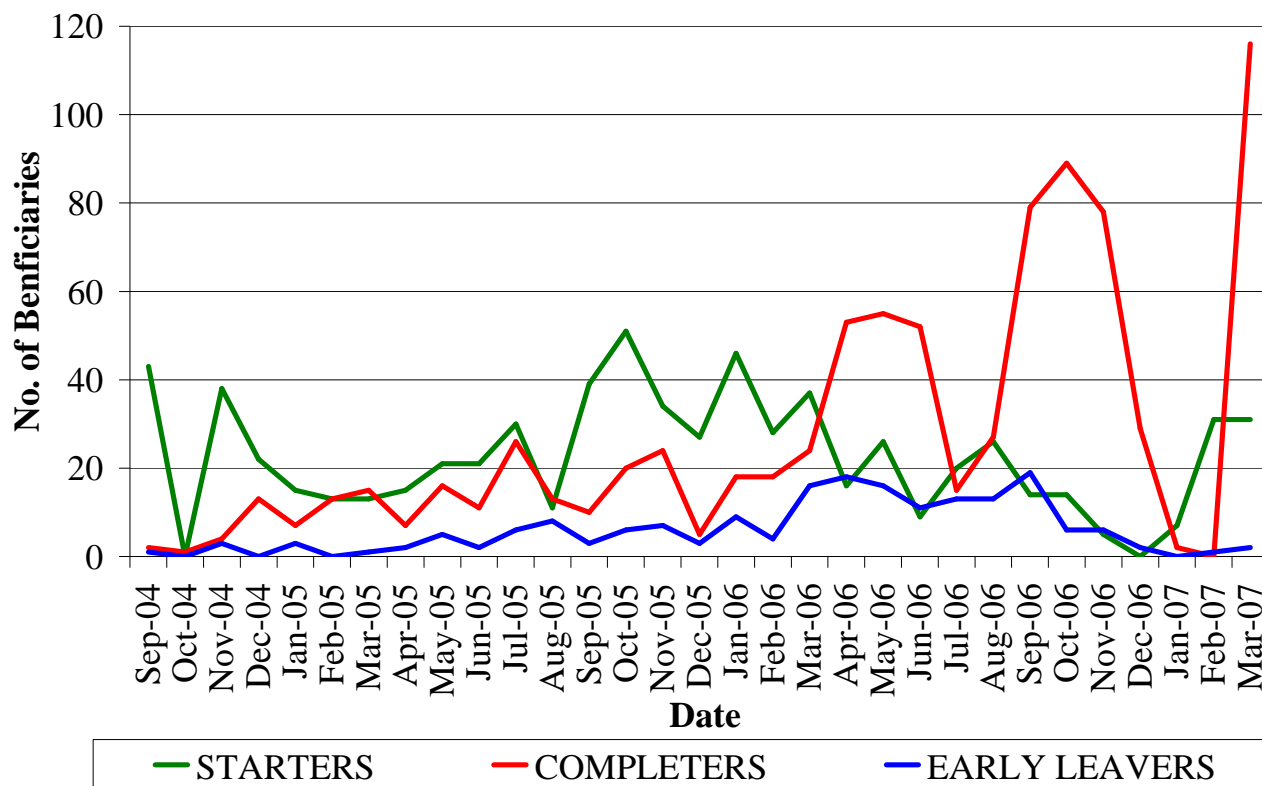

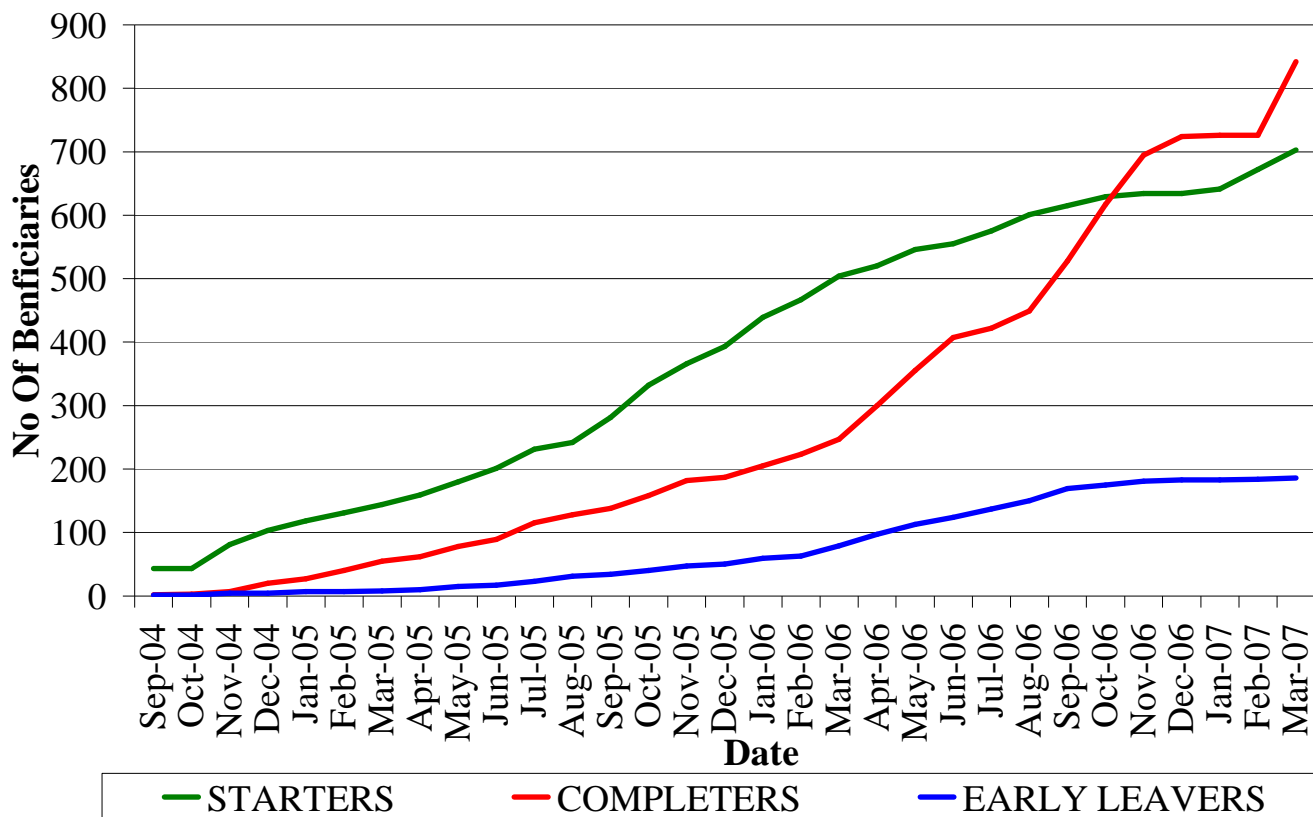

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



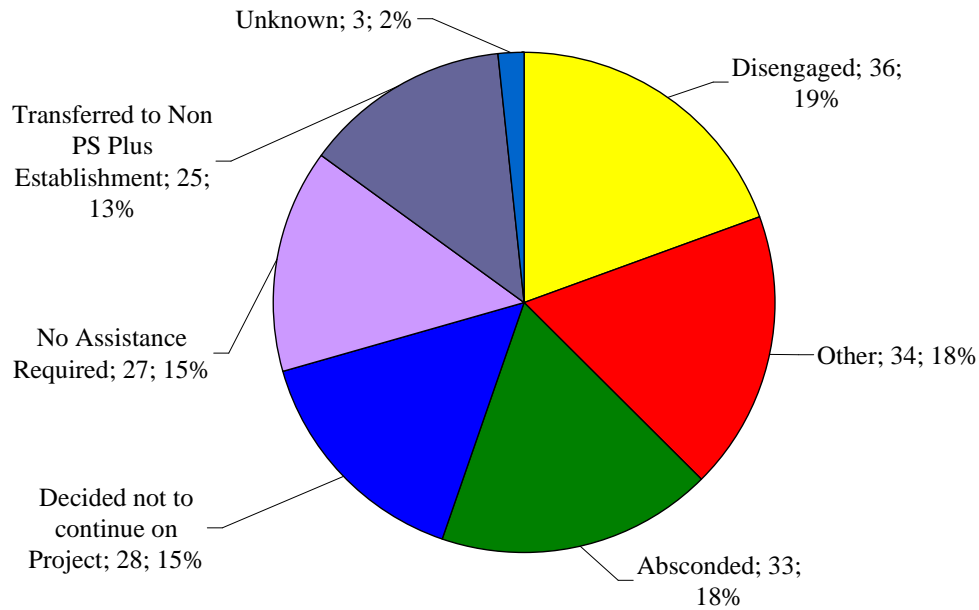
- Most months, Kirkham started between 10 and 40 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 60 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Over 700 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Kirkham.
- Over 1000 beneficiaries finished in Kirkham – 842 completed the project and 186 left the project early.

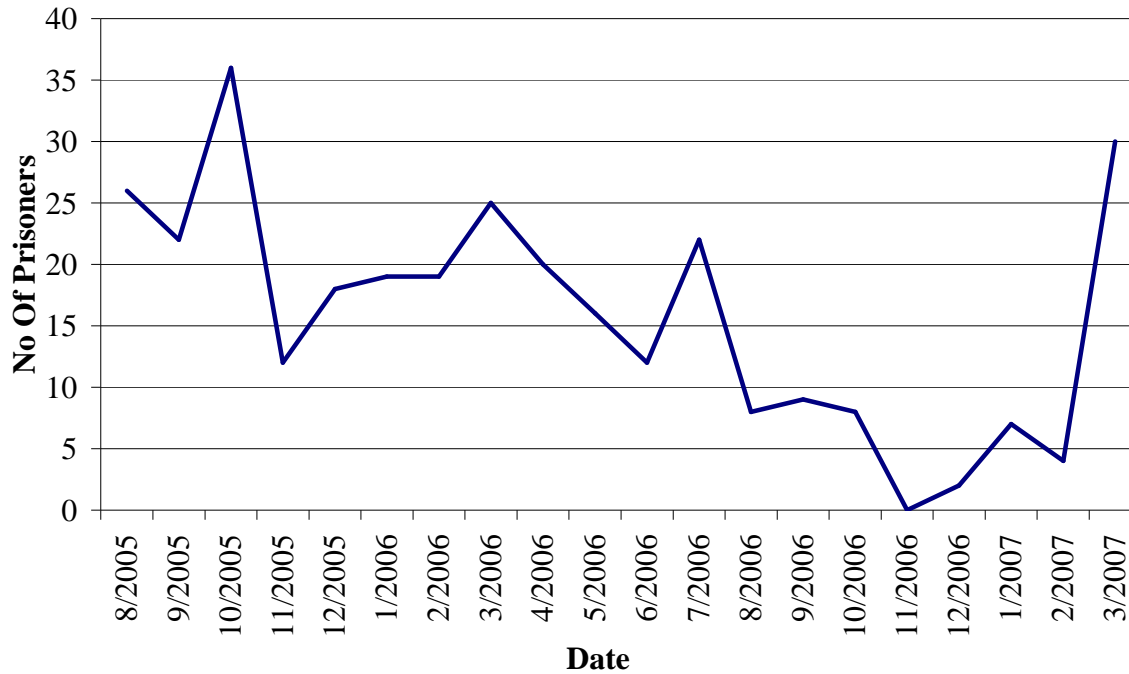

- Of the 186 beneficiaries who left the project early, 19% (36) were disengaged.
- 18% (33) of early leavers absconded.

Non-Starters Per Month



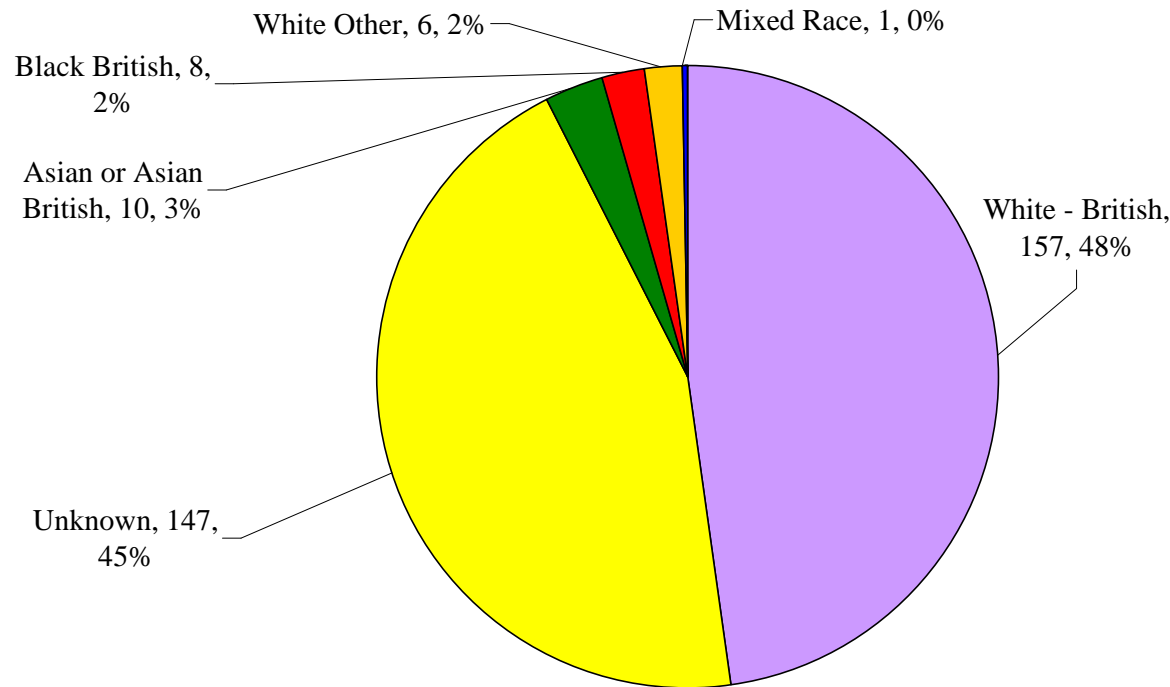

- Most months, less than 25 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 300 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Kirkham.
- 149 of the prisoners not started in Kirkham did not require PS Plus Services and 137 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (22 transferred before the assessment entered and 115 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

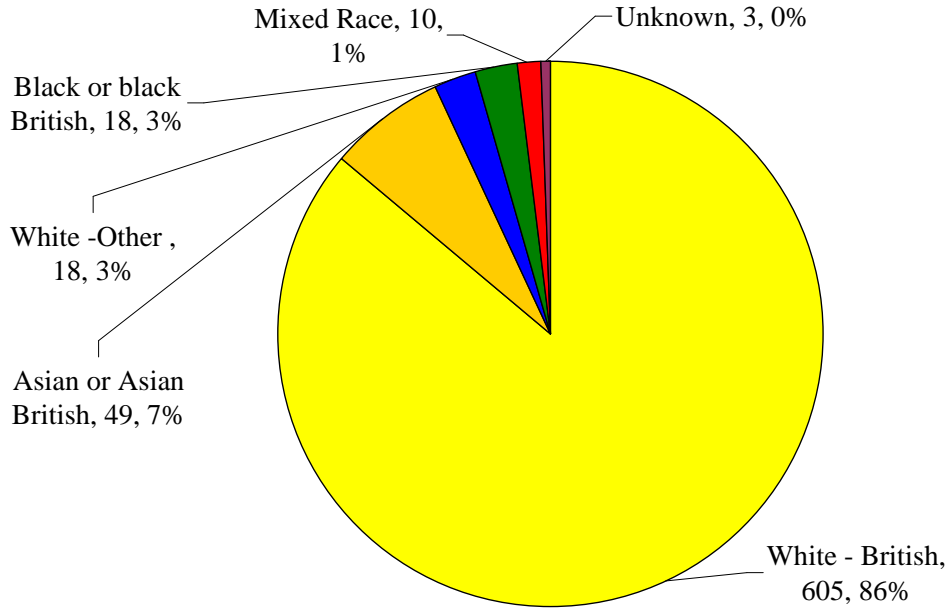

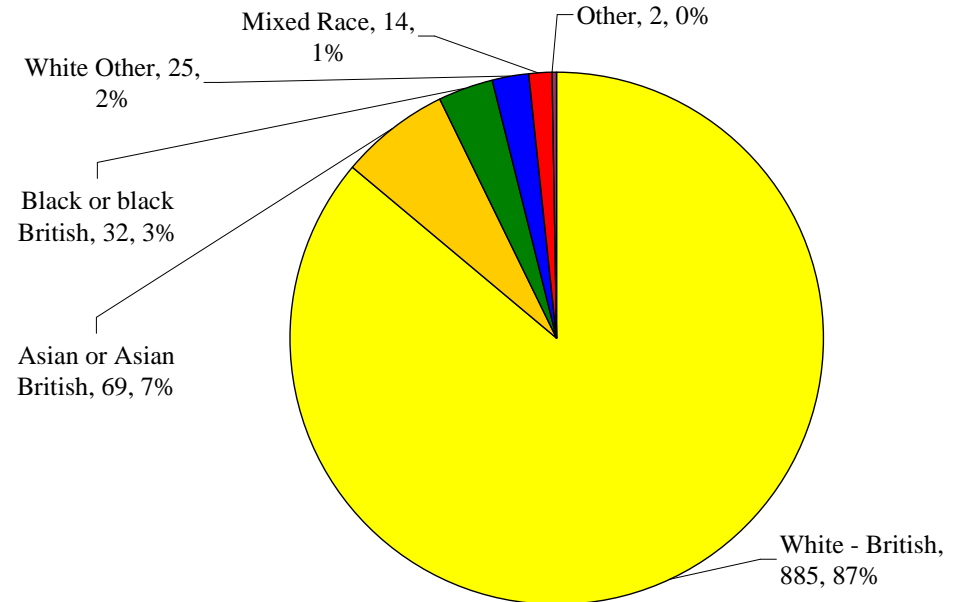
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (48%) and from United Kingdom (78%).
- The ethnic origin for 45% and the nationality of 1 in 5 of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 8% (25) of the prisoners not started.

- 86% (605) of the beneficiaries started and 87% (885) of the beneficiaries who finished in Kirkham were White-British.
- 14% (95) of the beneficiaries started and 13% (140) of the beneficiaries who finished in Kirkham were from ethnic minorities.

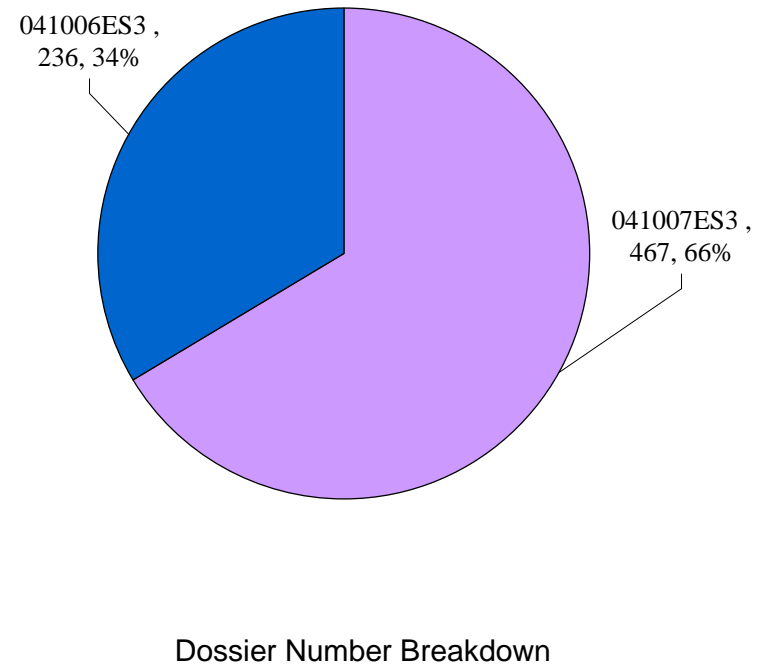
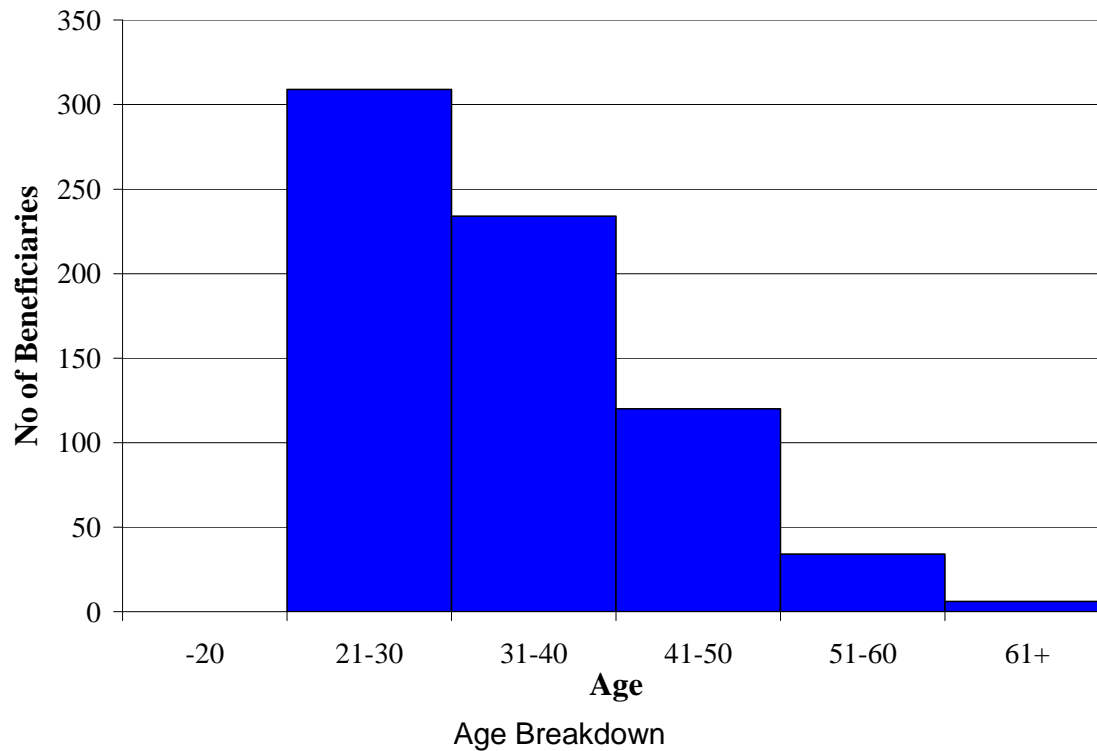

- 70% (494) of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British, English or Scottish.
- 68% (694) of the beneficiaries who finished in Kirkham stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.

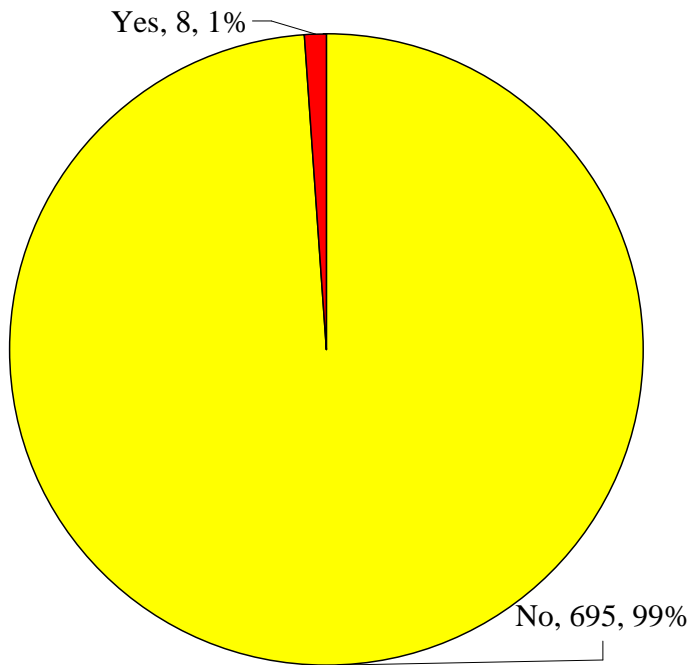


Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

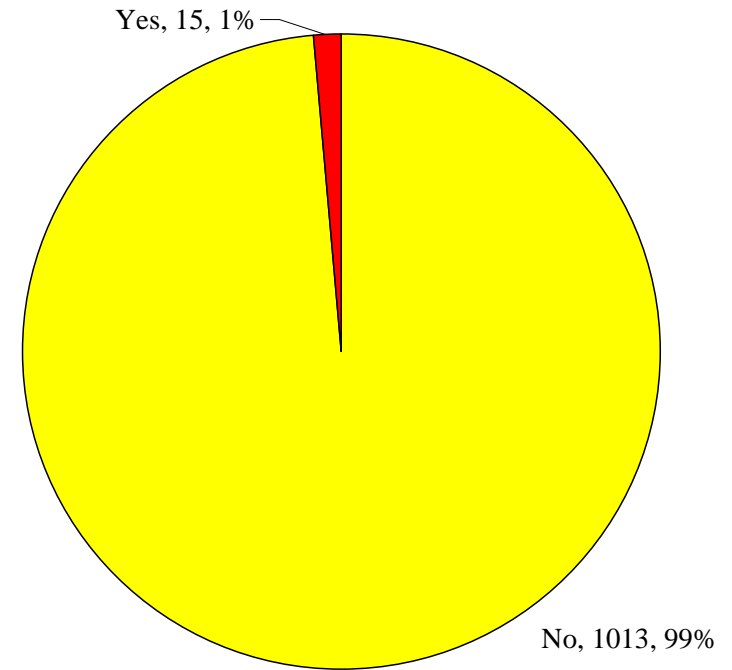


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Kirkham is 33 years and 8 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 66% (467) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



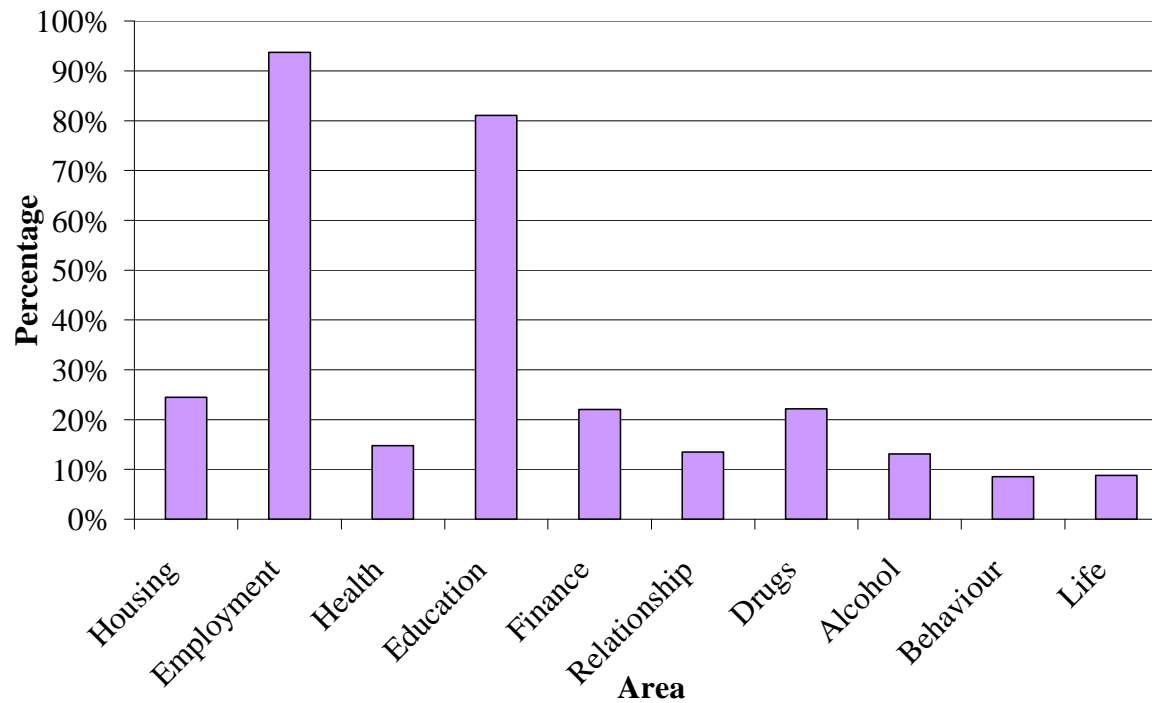
Beneficiaries Starting in Kirkham



Beneficiaries Finishing in Kirkham

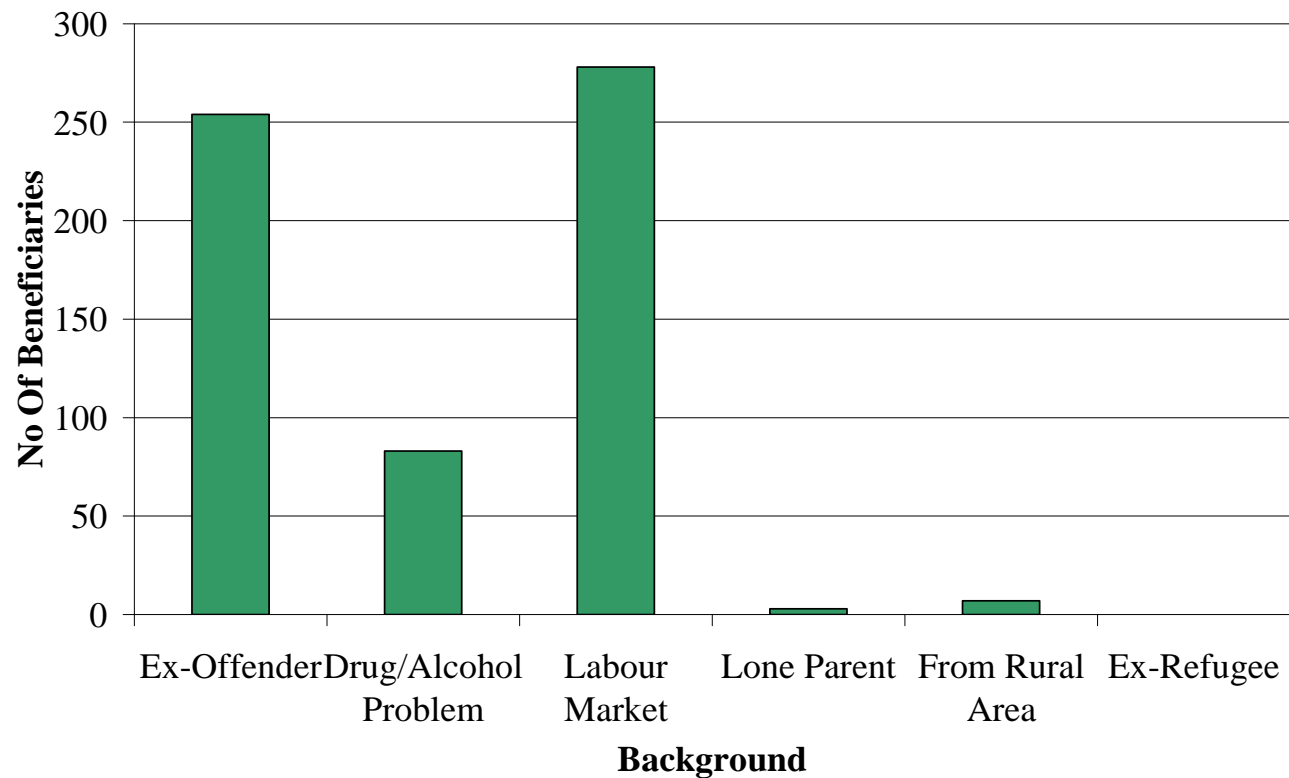
- 8 of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham were classified as being disabled.
- 15 of the beneficiaries who finished in Kirkham were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Kirkham



- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham needed help with employment.
- Over 80% of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham needed help with education.
- Over 20% of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham needed help with housing issues.

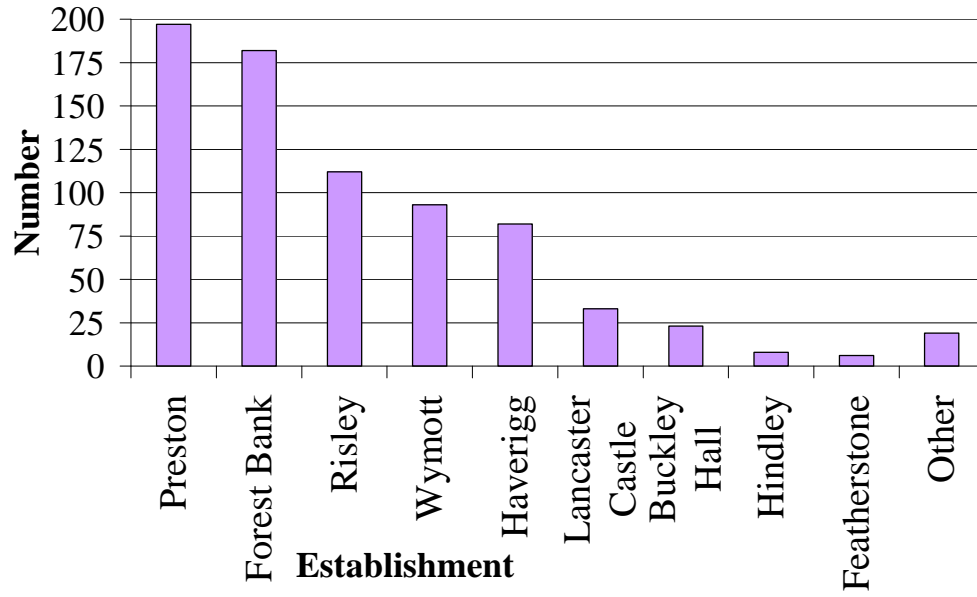
Beneficiary Background



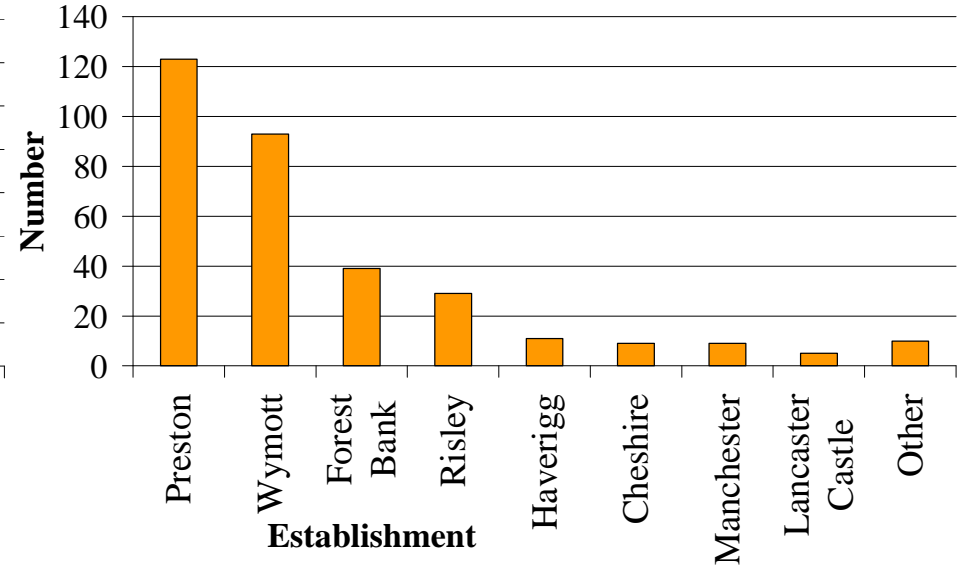
- Over 250 of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham were ex-offenders.
- Approximately 80 of the beneficiaries who started in Kirkham had a drug or alcohol problem.

Transfers into Kirkham

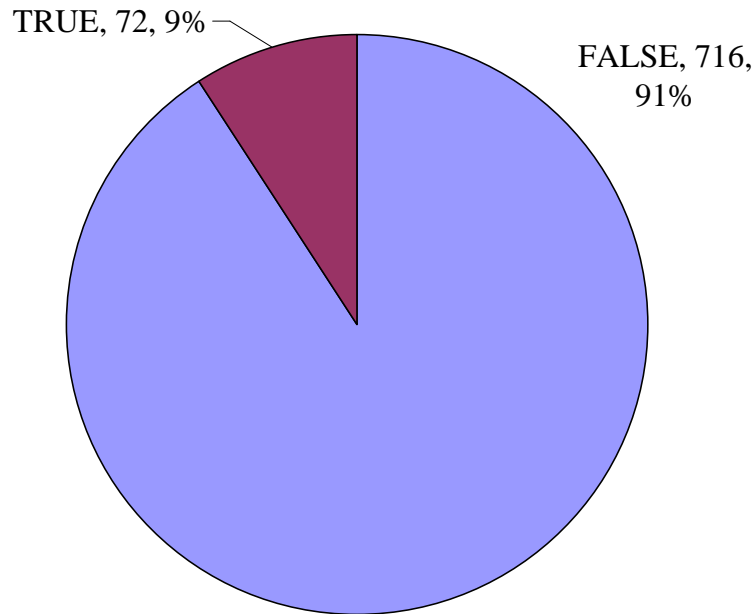


Transfers from Kirkham

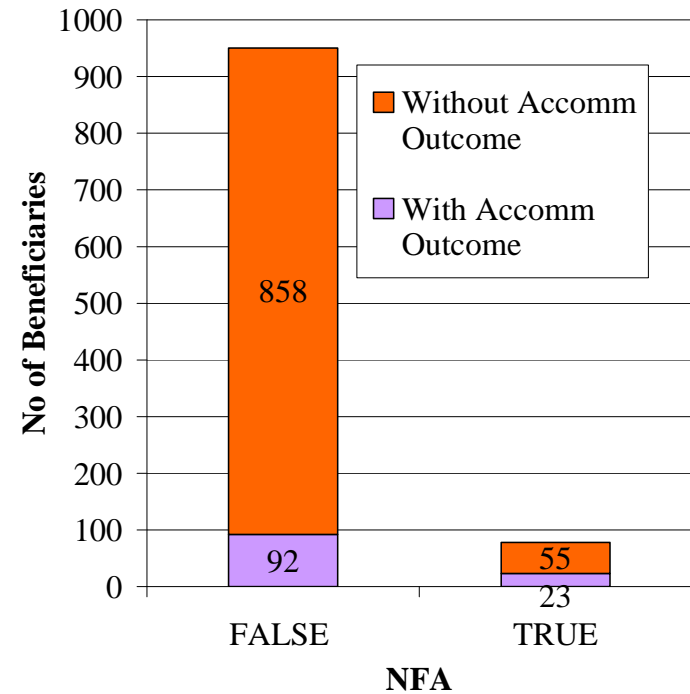


- 755 beneficiaries have transferred into Kirkham – 50% transferred to Kirkham from Preston and Forest Bank.
- 328 beneficiaries have transferred from Kirkham – 66% transferred from Kirkham to Preston and Wymott.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode



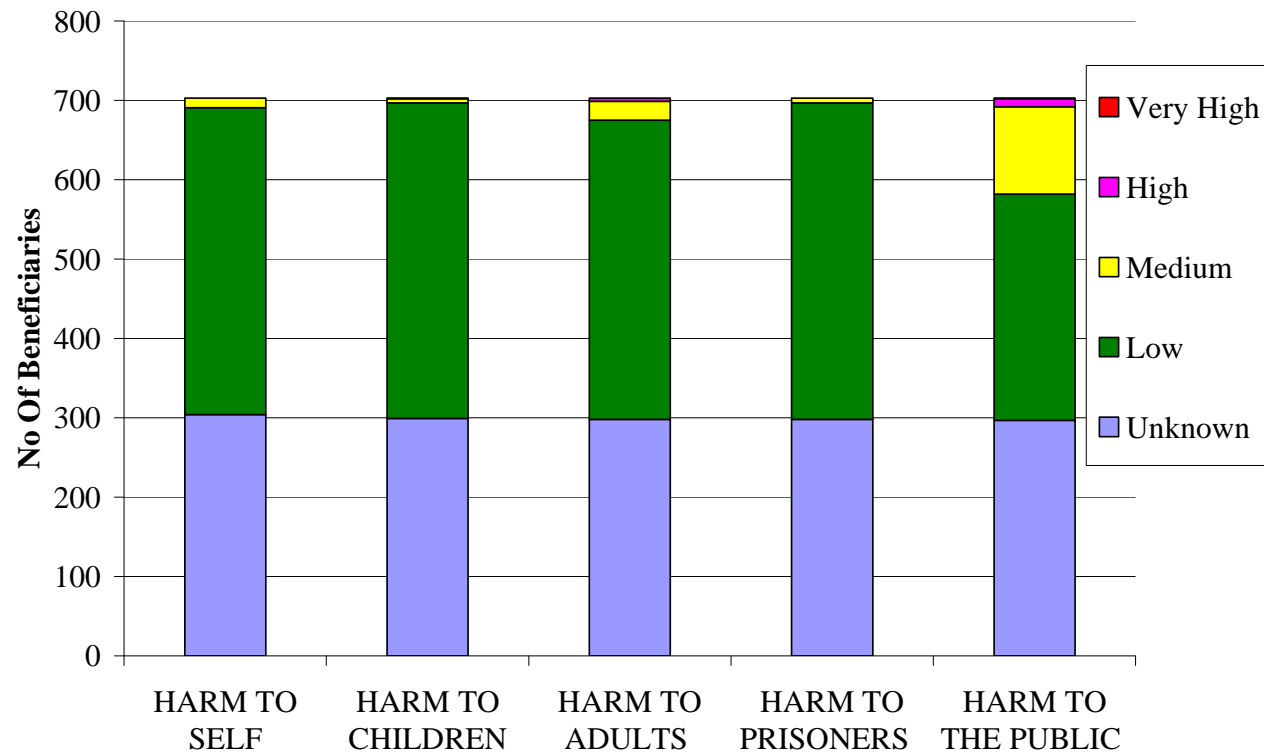
Beneficiaries Starting in Kirkham



Beneficiaries Finishing in Kirkham

- 9% (72) of the beneficiaries started in Kirkham were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 78 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 23 had an accommodation outcome secured.

Risk



- For approximately 300 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

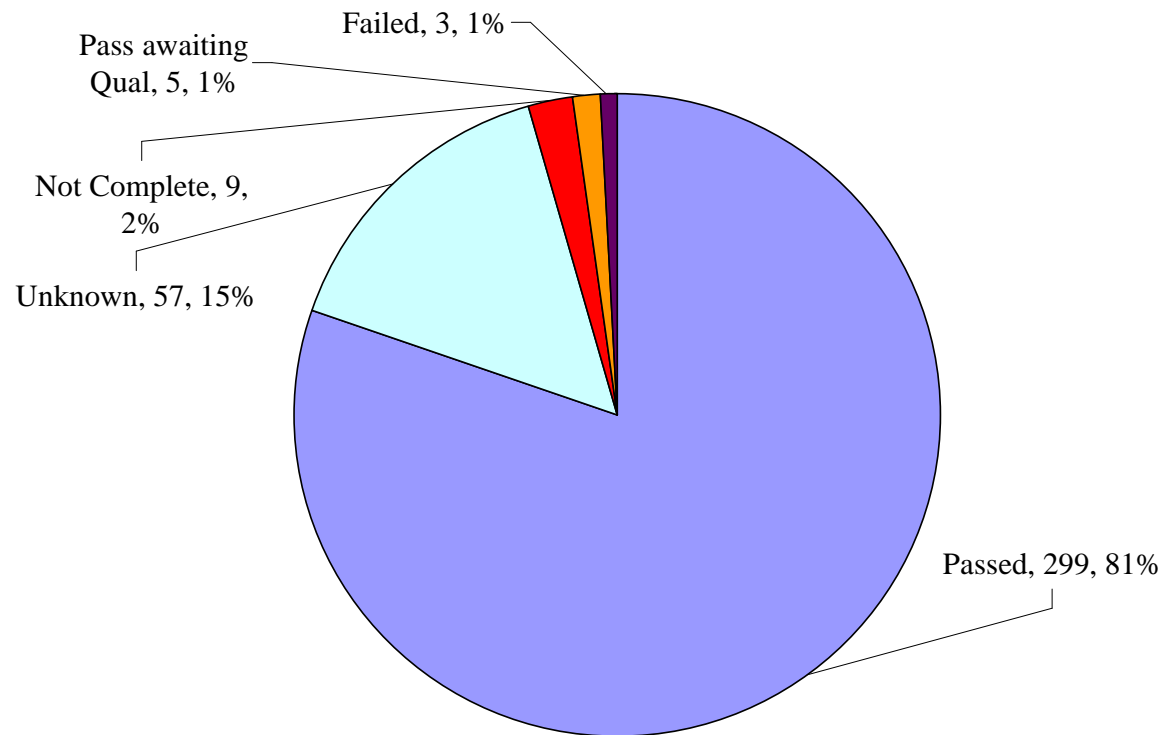

- 657 soft outcomes were gained by Kirkham beneficiaries.
- 102 beneficiaries had IAG assistance.
- 63 beneficiaries gained assistance writing a CV.
- Beneficiaries in Kirkham attended 42 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 25 beneficiaries gained Advice on Disclosure.

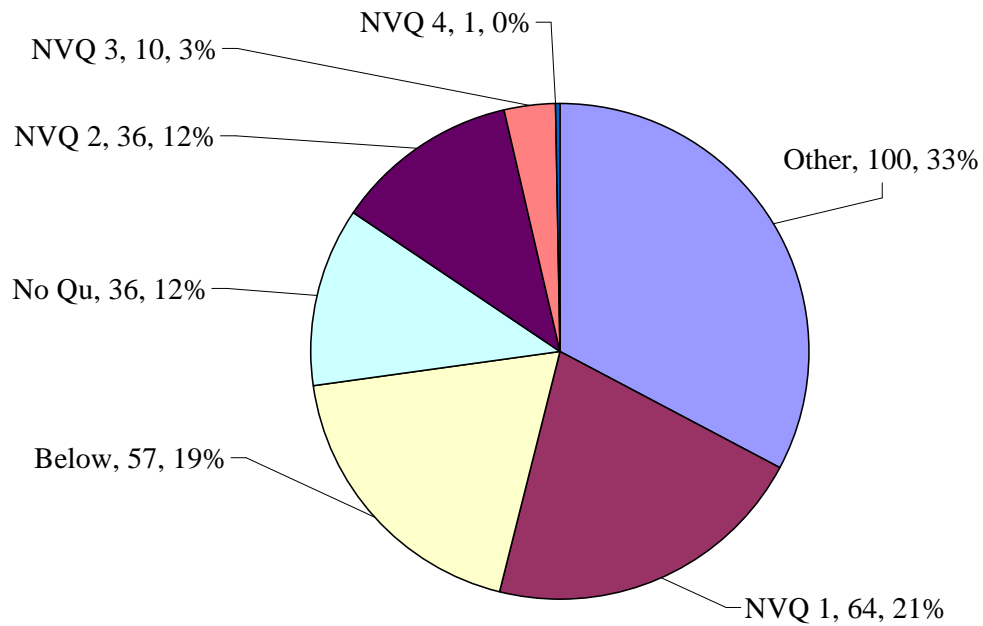


Exam Results

- Only 3 exams were failed.

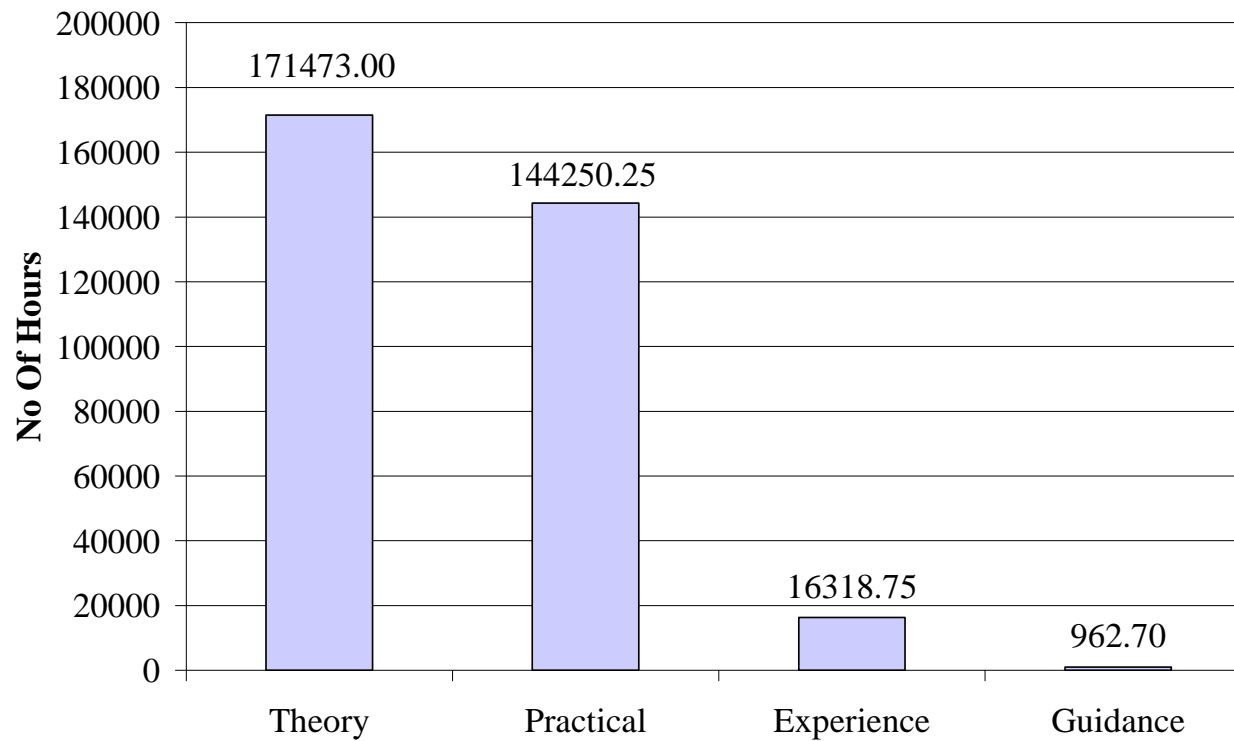

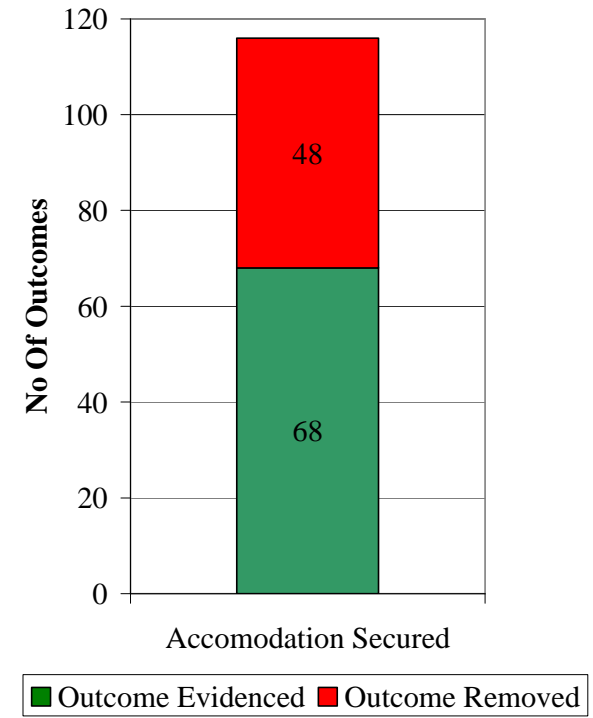
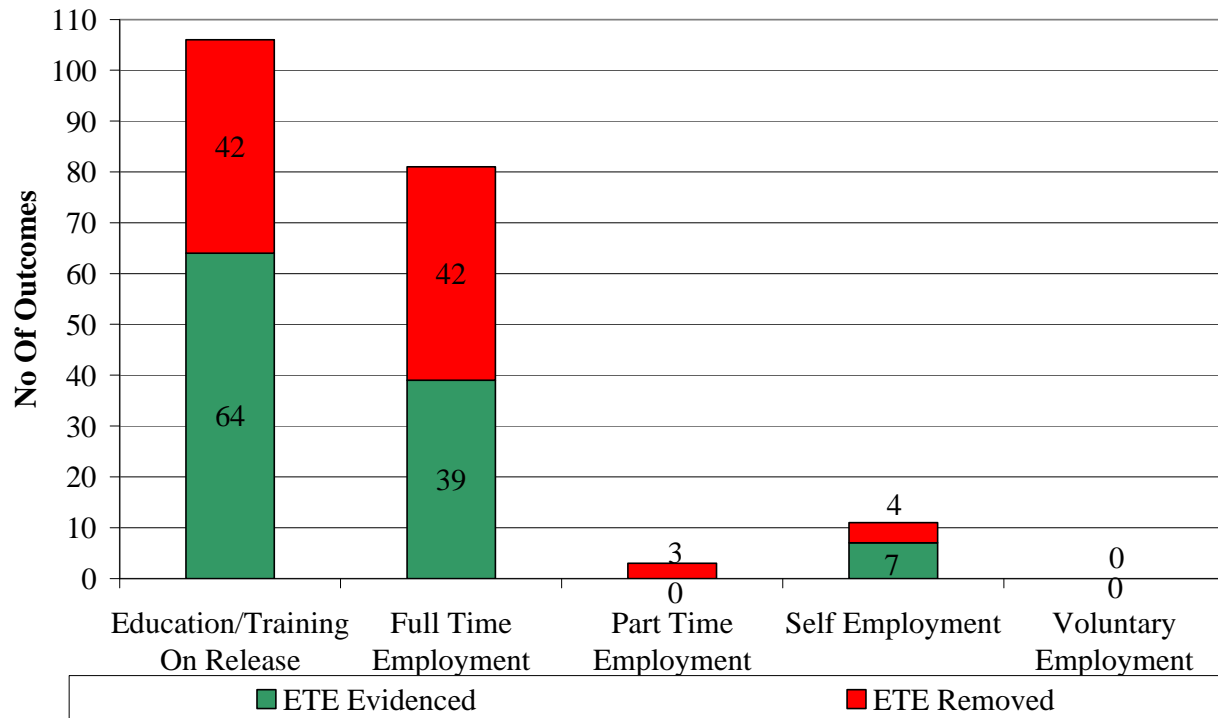
- 111 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Kirkham.
- 74 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Kirkham.

Timesheet Hours



- 333,001 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 171,473 (51%) of the hours collected were for gaining experience.

### Hard Outcomes



- 201 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Kirkham with evidence for 110 of these outcomes (55% evidence for outcome rate).
- 116 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 68 outcomes (59% evidence for outcome rate).
