

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month




- o Most months, Morton Hall started between 5 and 15 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- o Up until the last 5 months of the project, no more than 13 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.





Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers




- Nearly 190 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Morton Hall.
- o 236 beneficiaries finished in Morton Hall 201 completed the project and 35 left the project early.



- o Of the 35 beneficiaries who left the project early, 17% (6) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- o 9 of the beneficiaries who left the project early were foreign nationals awaiting deportation.
- o 9 of the beneficiaries who left the project early decided not to continue on the PS Plus project.


- o Most months, fewer than 10 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- o In total, 92 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Morton Hall.
- o 40 prisoners did not meet the required eligibility criteria to be on the PS Plus project.


- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (33%) and from United Kingdom (40%).
- o The ethnic origin for 24% and the nationality of 35% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- o Ethnic minorities account for 43% (40 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.





Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus

Ethnic Breakdown of Beneficiaries in Morton Hall



- o 66% (125) of the beneficiaries who started and 70% (163) of the beneficiaries who finished in Morton Hall where White-British.
- o 34% (64) of the beneficiaries who started and 30% (73) of the beneficiaries who finished in Morton Hall where from Ethnic minorities.



- o 82% (155) of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- o 83% (196) of the beneficiaries who finished in Morton Hall stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationality of 24 of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall and 24 of the beneficiaries who finished in Morton Hall are unknown.





Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2




- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Morton Hall is 35 years and 6 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- o There are no beneficiaries in Morton Hall below the age of 20 or above the age of 61.








Disabled Beneficiaries



Beneficiaries Starting in Morton Hall




Beneficiaries Finishing in Morton Hall

- o 5% (10) of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall were classified as being disabled.
- o 5% (12) of the beneficiaries who finished in Morton Hall were classified as being disabled.




Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Morton Hall



- 94% of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall needed help with employment and 87% needed help with education.
- o Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall needed help with housing.
- o Over 35% of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall needed help with drug issues.



Beneficiary Background



- o Over 140 of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall were ex-offenders.
- $\circ\quad$ 31 of the beneficiaries who started in Morton Hall were lone parents.








Transfers from other PS Plus Establishments

Transfers from Morton Hall




- o 65 beneficiaries have transferred into Morton Hall 82% transferred to Morton Hall from New Hall.
- o 37 beneficiaries have transferred from Morton Hall 76% transferred from Morton Hall to Drake Hall or Askham Grange.
- o 5 beneficiaries have gone "Through the Gate" to Cambridgeshire Probation Service.






Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode



- o 2% (4) of the beneficiaries started in Morton Hall were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- None of the 4 beneficiaries classed as having no fixed abode gained an accommodation outcome, although a further 88 did gain one.





- o For 77 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, adults, prisoners and public. Most beneficiaries are of medium risk of harm to children.



- o 632 soft outcomes were gained by Morton Hall beneficiaries.
- o 97 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- o 130 beneficiaries received Advice on Disclosure.
- o Beneficiaries in Morton Hall attended 140 interviews Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job and New Deal interviews.
- o 44 beneficiaries attended Job Club.





Exam Results




- o 97% (108) of the exams taken were passed.



- o 81 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Morton Hall.
- o 29 adult Literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Morton Hall.









- o 125,787 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- o 106,232 (84%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.





Hard Outcomes





ETE Outcomes

- o 69 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Morton Hall with evidence for 18 of these outcomes (26% evidence for outcome rate).
- o 52 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 29 outcomes (56% evidence for outcome rate).
