

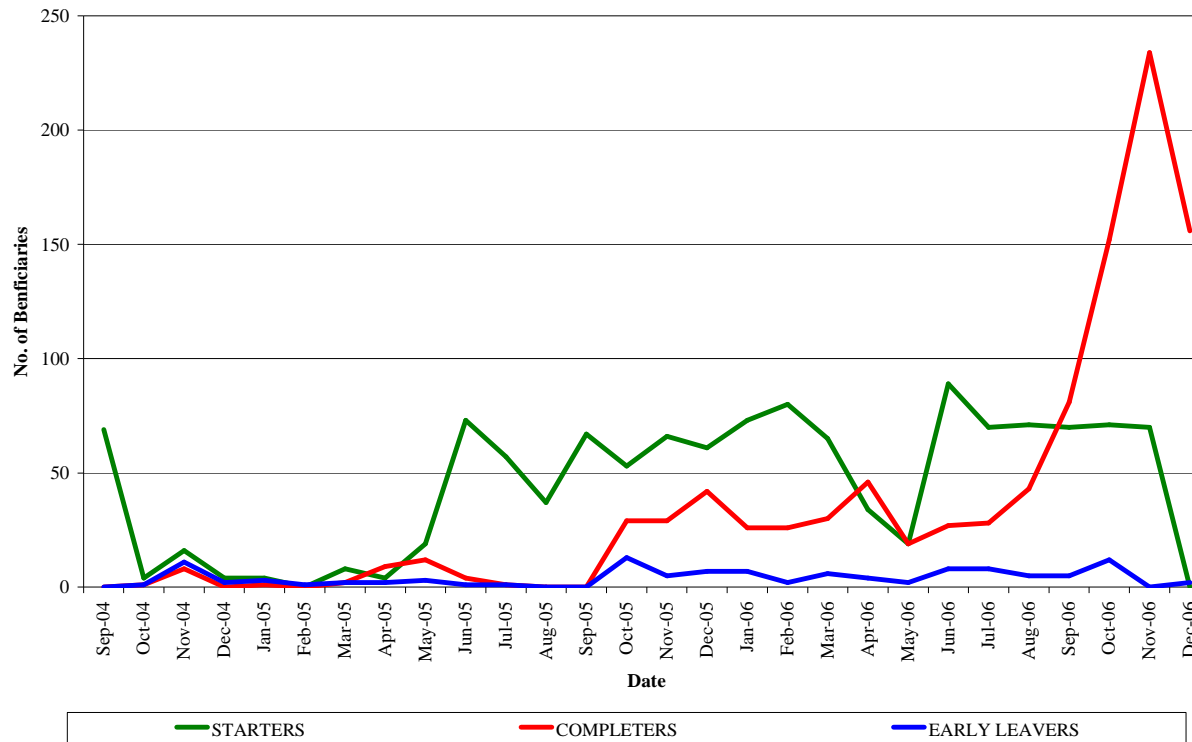

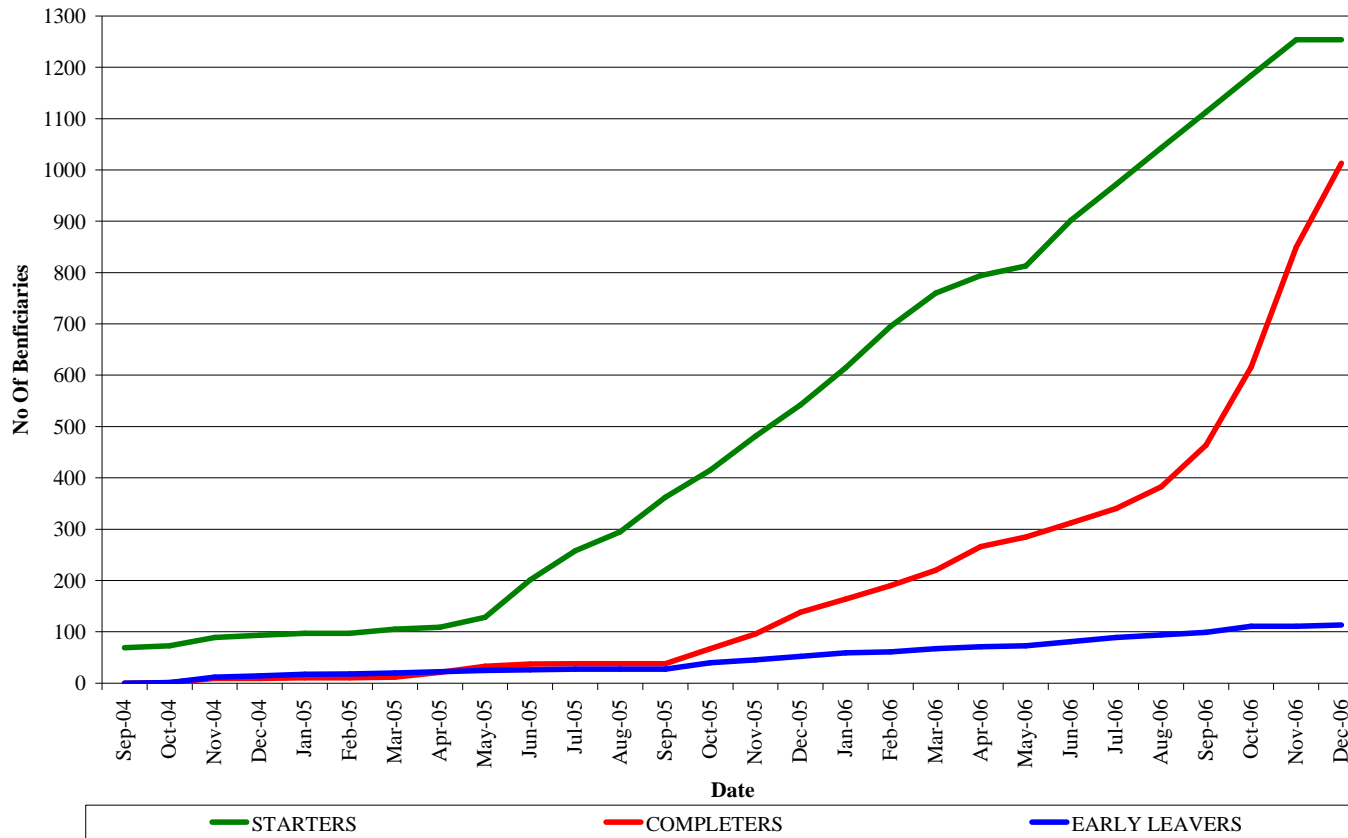

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



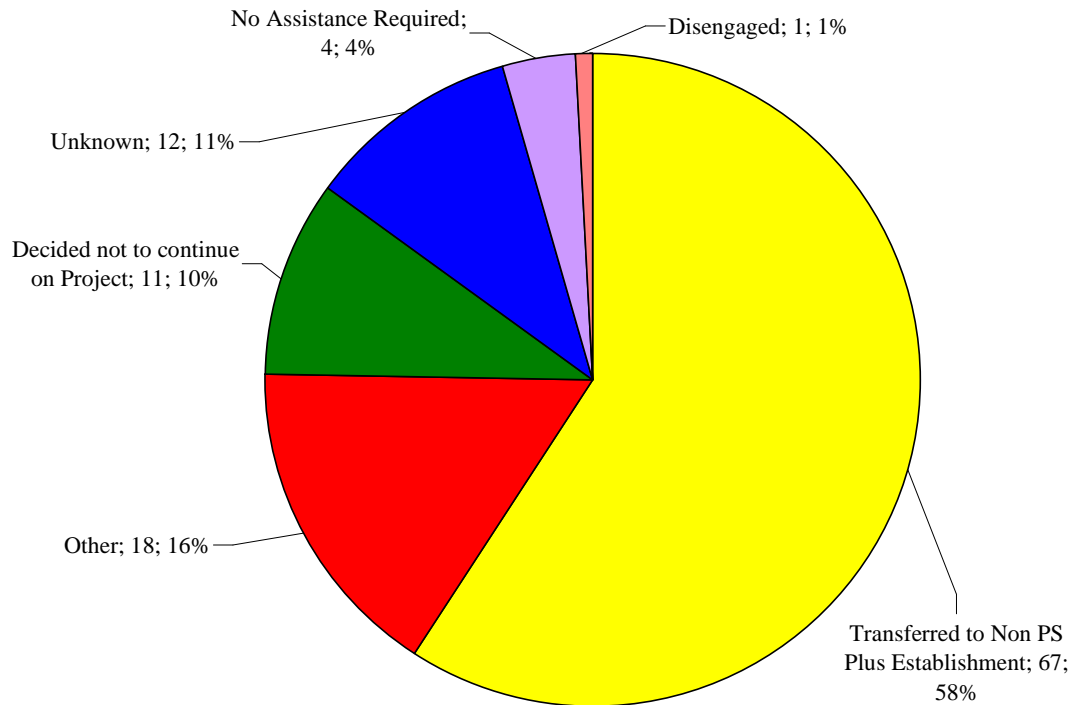
- In the 9 months, Risley started less than 20 beneficiaries most months, this increased to approximately 70 starters per month until the final month of the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 4 months of the project, no more than 50 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.
- Throughout the project less than 15 beneficiaries were leaving the project early.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 1250 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Risley.
- 1126 beneficiaries finished in Risley – 1013 completed the project and 113 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

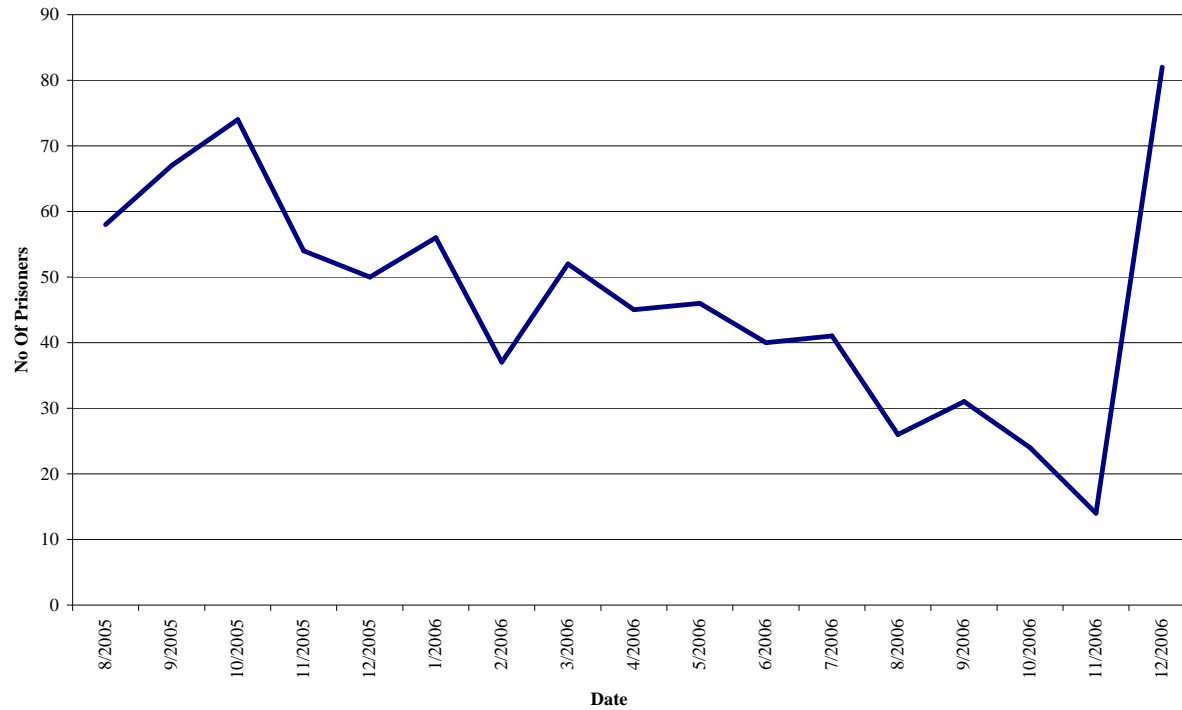


Other reasons given for beneficiaries leaving the project early:

- Of the 113 beneficiaries who left the project early, 58% (67) of the beneficiaries transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 11 beneficiaries decided not to continue on the project and 4 did not require any assistance from PS Plus.

Non-Starters Per Month

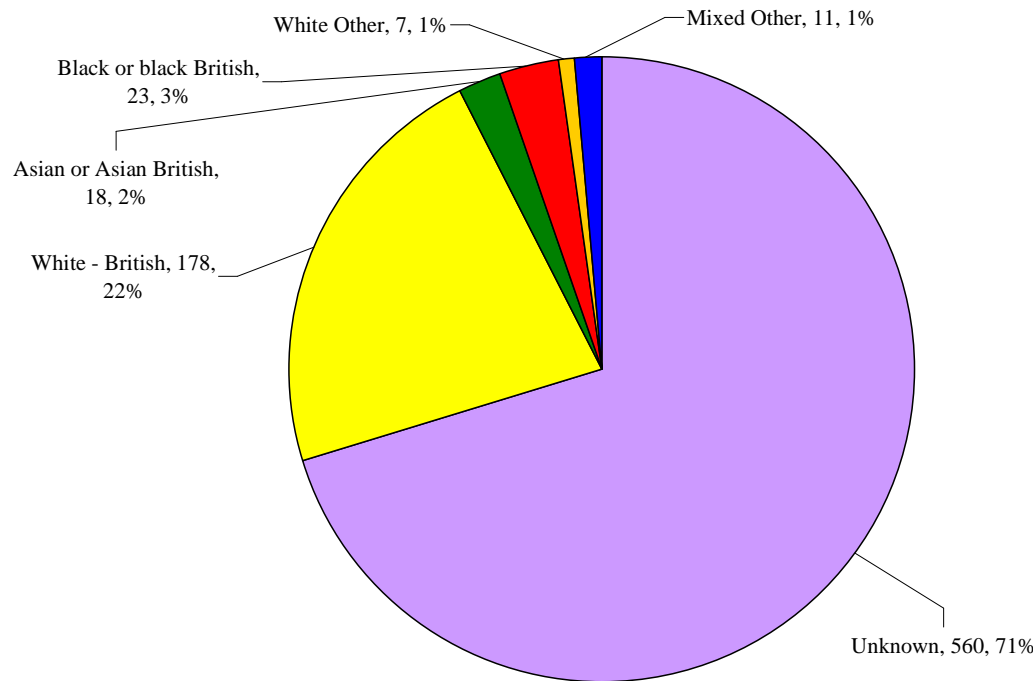

- Most months, over 40 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 797 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Risley.
- 55 of the prisoners not started in Risley did not meet the eligibility criteria for PS Plus Services and 526 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (154 to a PS Plus establishment and 372 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



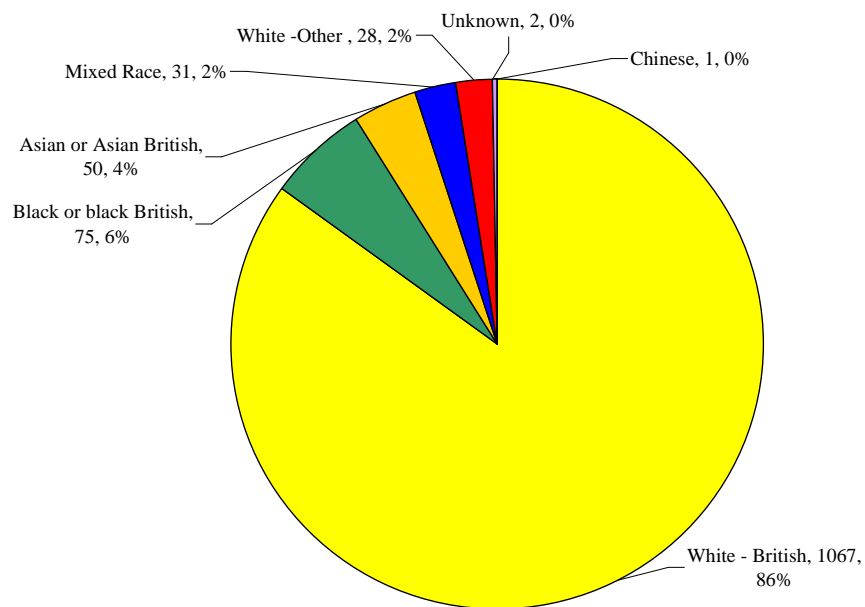

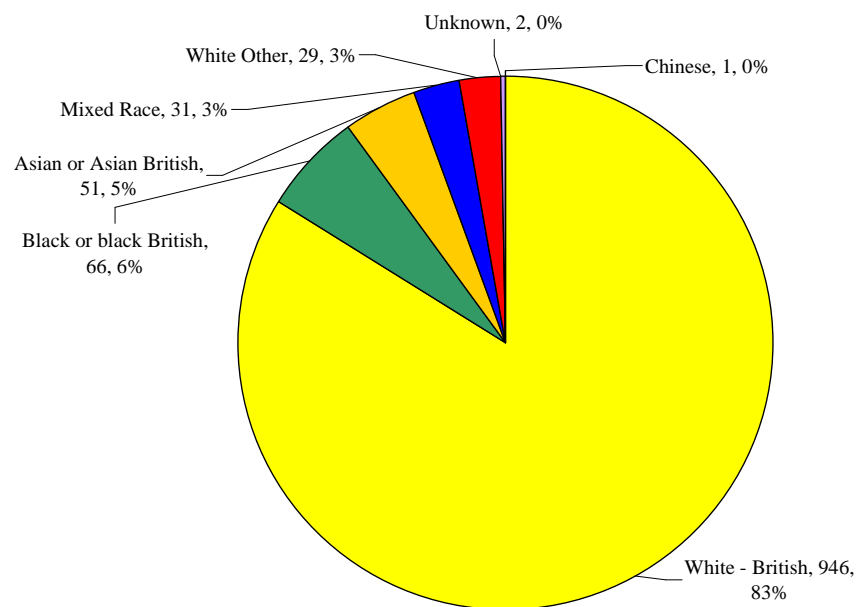
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project where the ethnic origin was known were White-British (22%) and most were from United Kingdom (71%).
- The ethnic origin for 71% and the nationality of 23% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 7% (59 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 86% (1067) of the beneficiaries who started and 83% (946) of the beneficiaries who finished in Risley were White-British.
- 14% (185) of the beneficiaries who started and 17% (178) of the beneficiaries who finished in Risley were from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of 2 beneficiaries who started and 2 beneficiaries who finished in Risley was unknown.

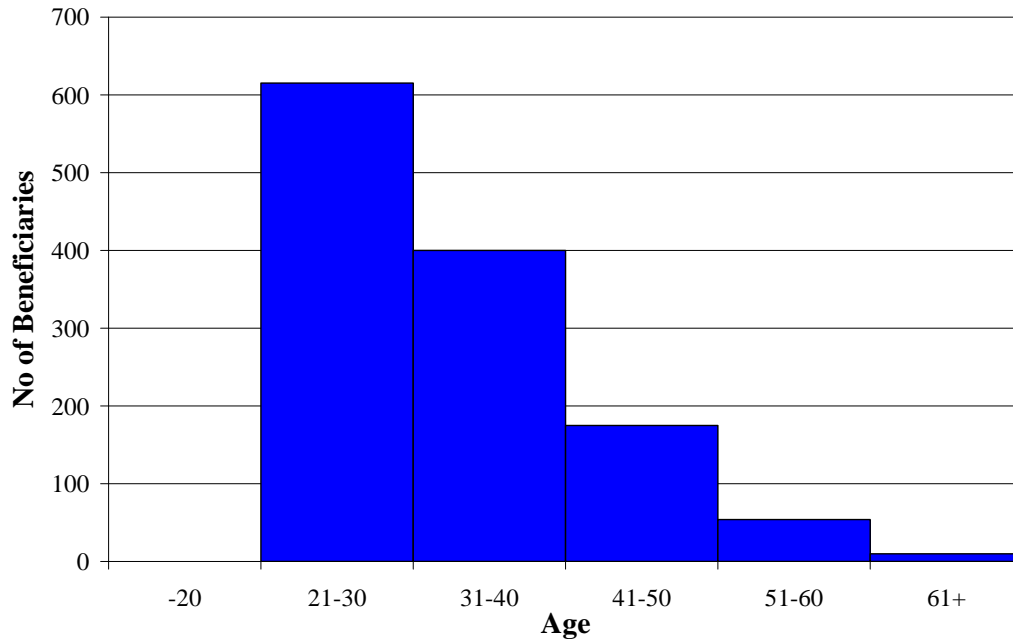

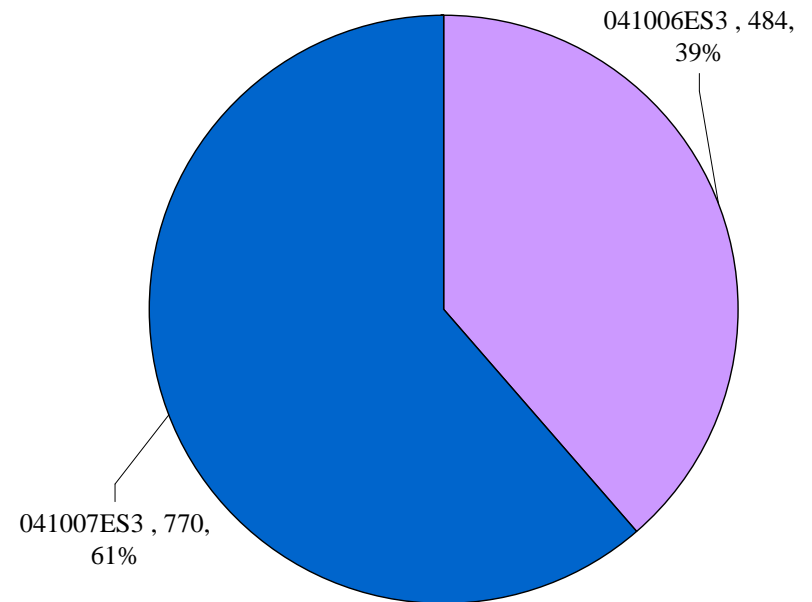
- 89% (1110) of the beneficiaries who started in Risley stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 90% (1012) of the beneficiaries who finished in Risley stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationality of 98 of the beneficiaries who started in Risley and 71 of the beneficiaries that finished in Risley was unknown.



Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



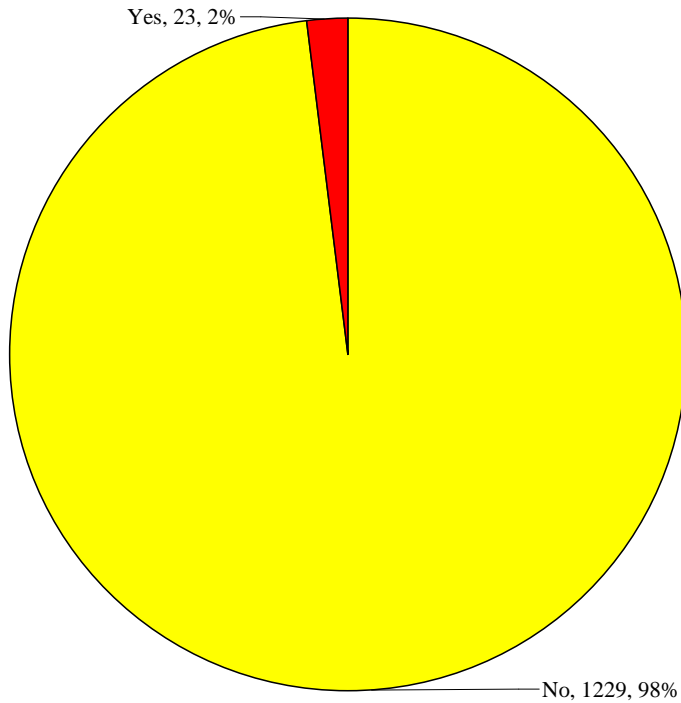
Age Breakdown



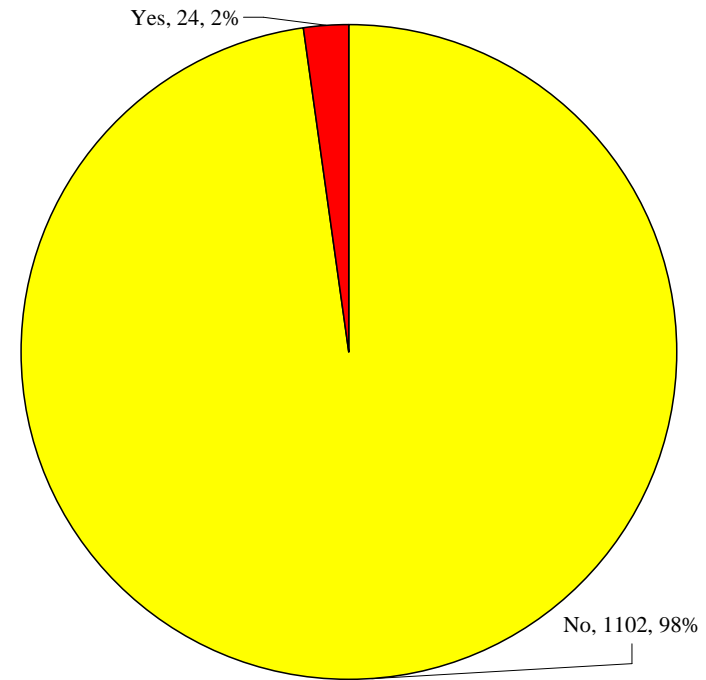
Dossier Number Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Risley is 32 years and 7 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- There are no beneficiaries in Risley under the age of 21.
- 61% (770) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

### Disabled Beneficiaries



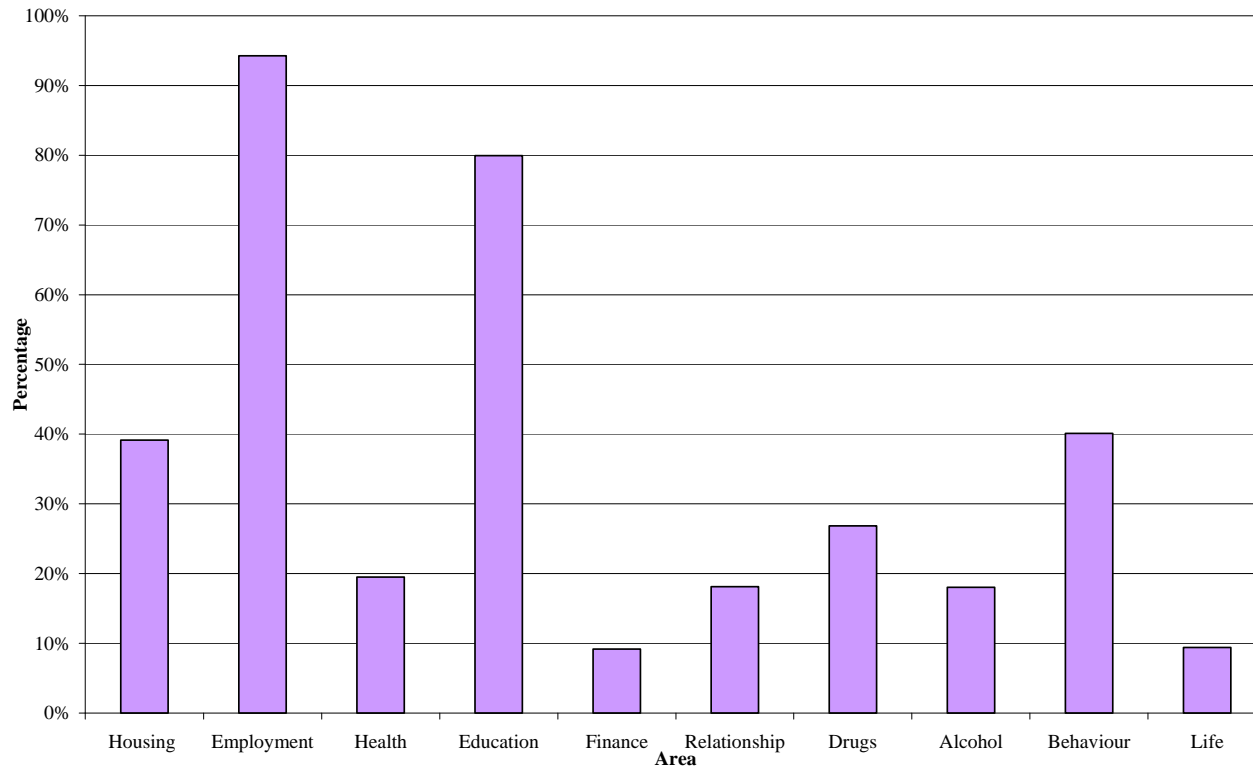

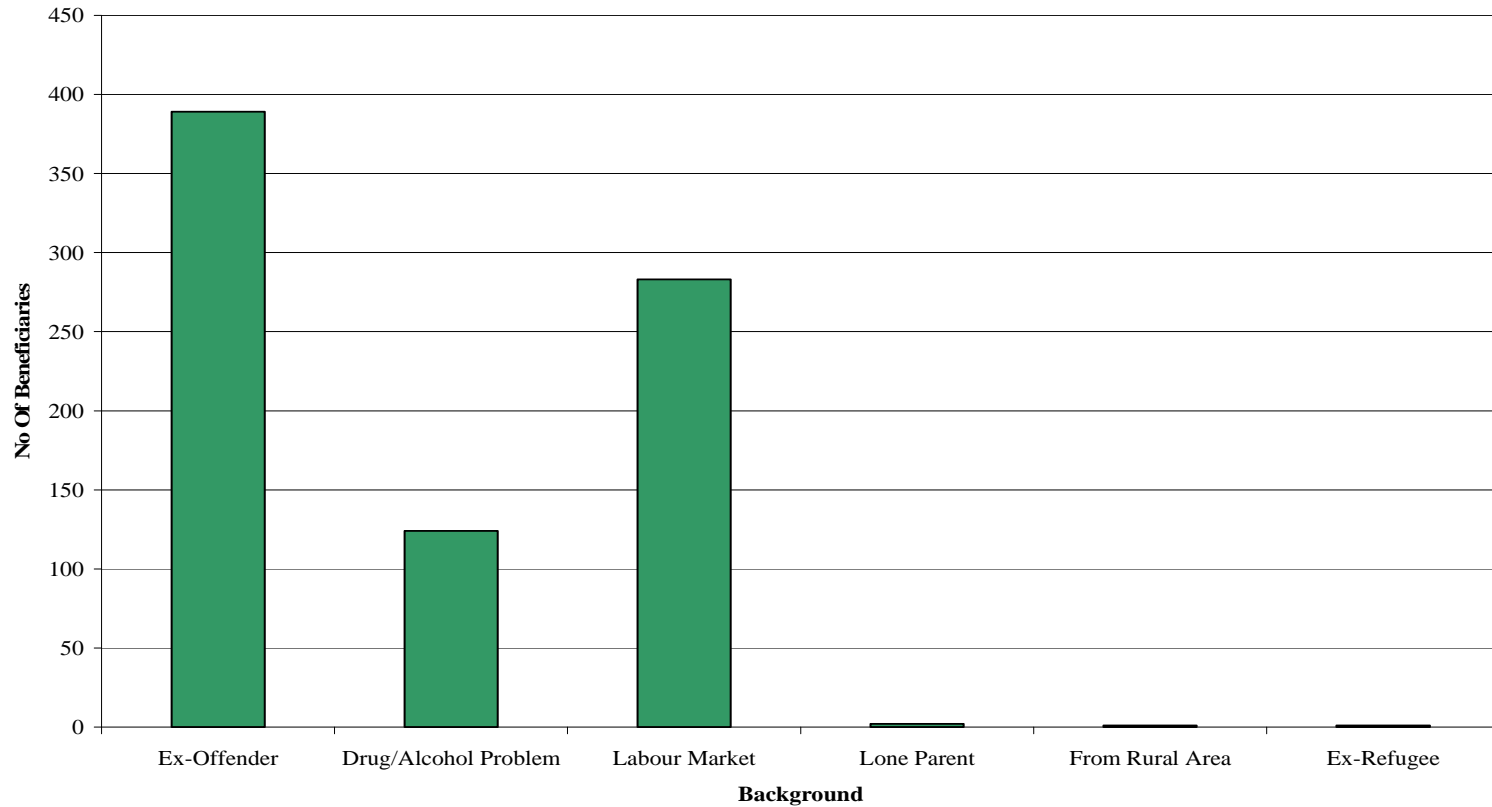
- 2% (23) of the beneficiaries who started in Risley were classified as being disabled.
- 2% (24) of the beneficiaries who finished in Risley were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Risley



- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Risley needed help with employment and 80% need help with education.
- Approximately 40% of the beneficiaries who started in Risley needed help with housing issues.
- Over 25% of the beneficiaries who started in Risley needed help with drugs issues.

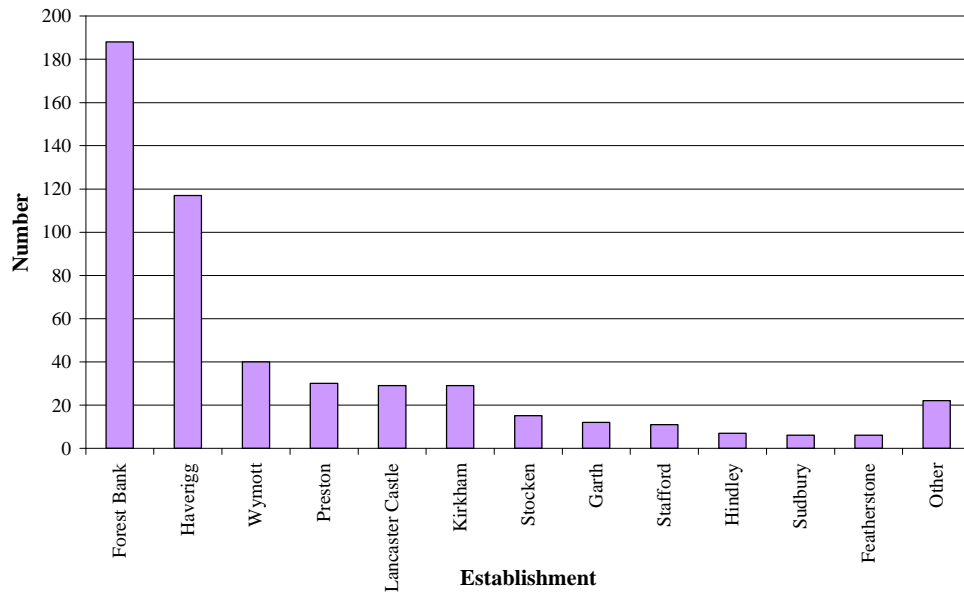
### Beneficiary Background



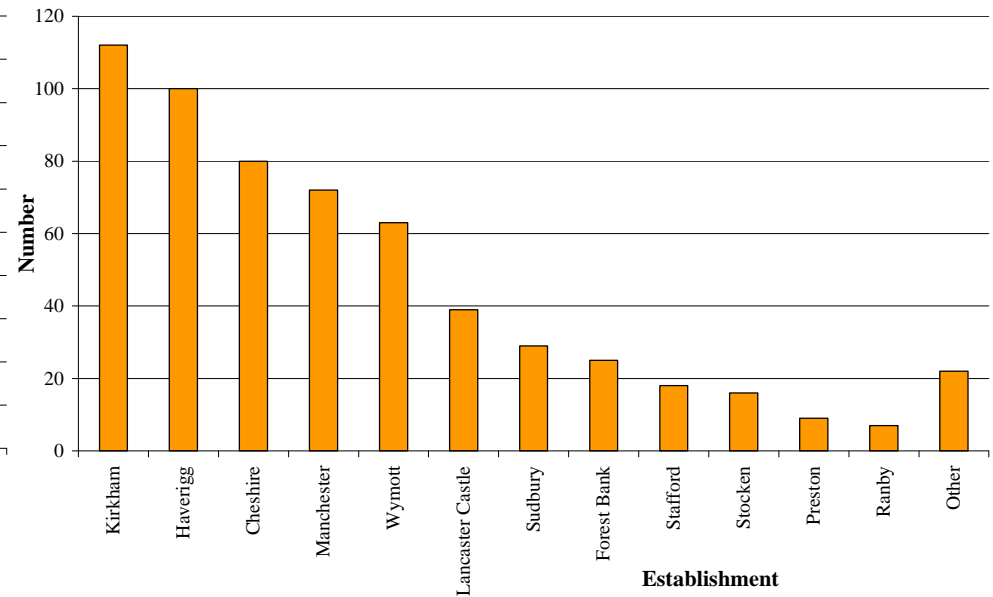
- Nearly 400 of the beneficiaries who started in Risley were ex-offenders.
- Over 280 of the beneficiaries who started in Risley were on the labour market.

Transfers into Risley

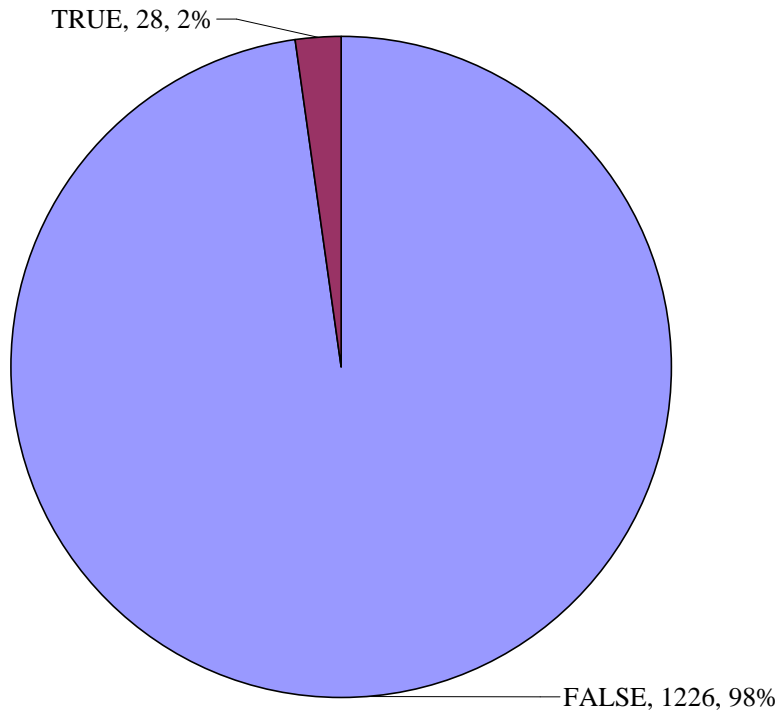


Transfers from Risley

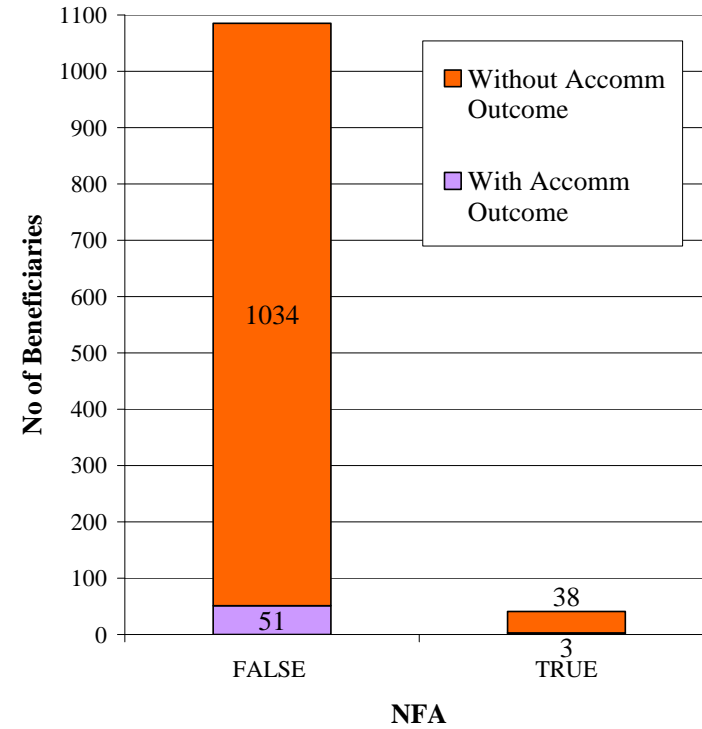


- 512 beneficiaries have transferred into Risley – 60% transferred to Risley from Forest Bank or Haverigg.
- 592 beneficiaries have transferred from Risley – 72% transferred from Risley to Kirkham, Haverigg or Wymott or have gone “Through the Gate” to Cheshire or Manchester probation services.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

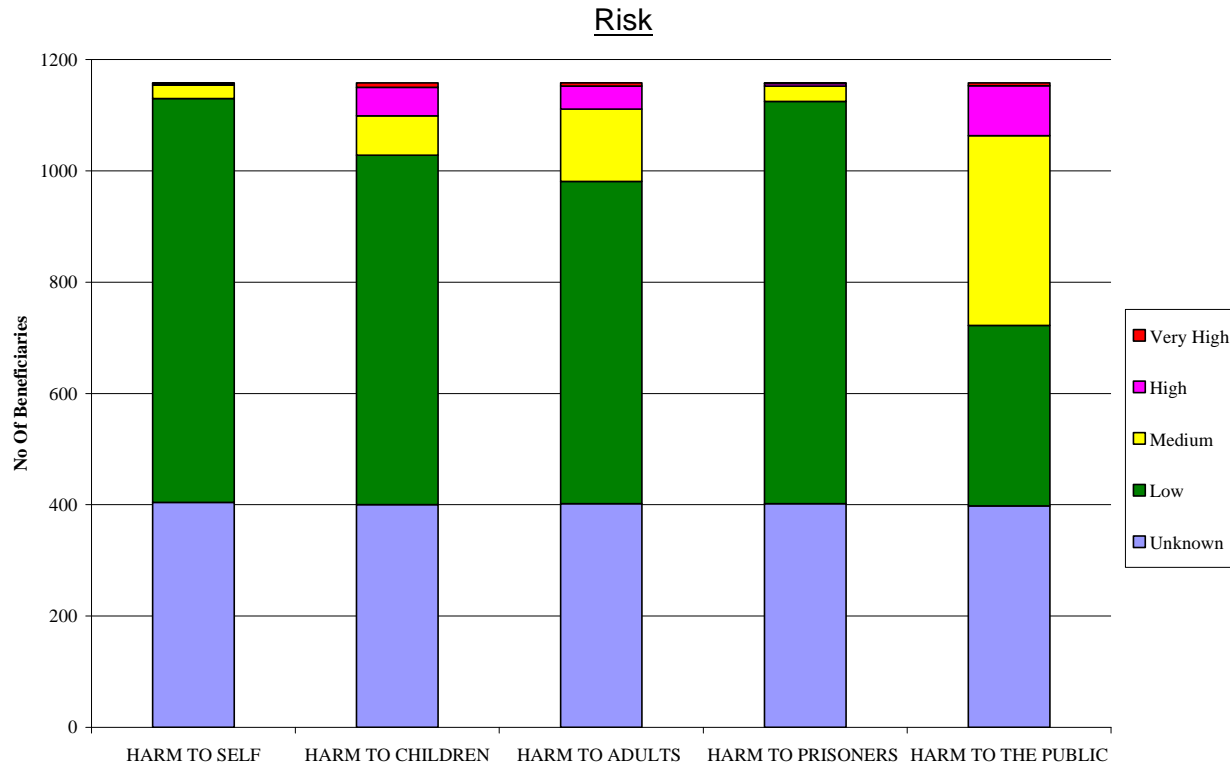


Beneficiaries Starting in Risley



Beneficiaries Finishing in Risley

- 2% (28) of the beneficiaries started in Risley were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 41 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 3 had an accommodation outcome secured.



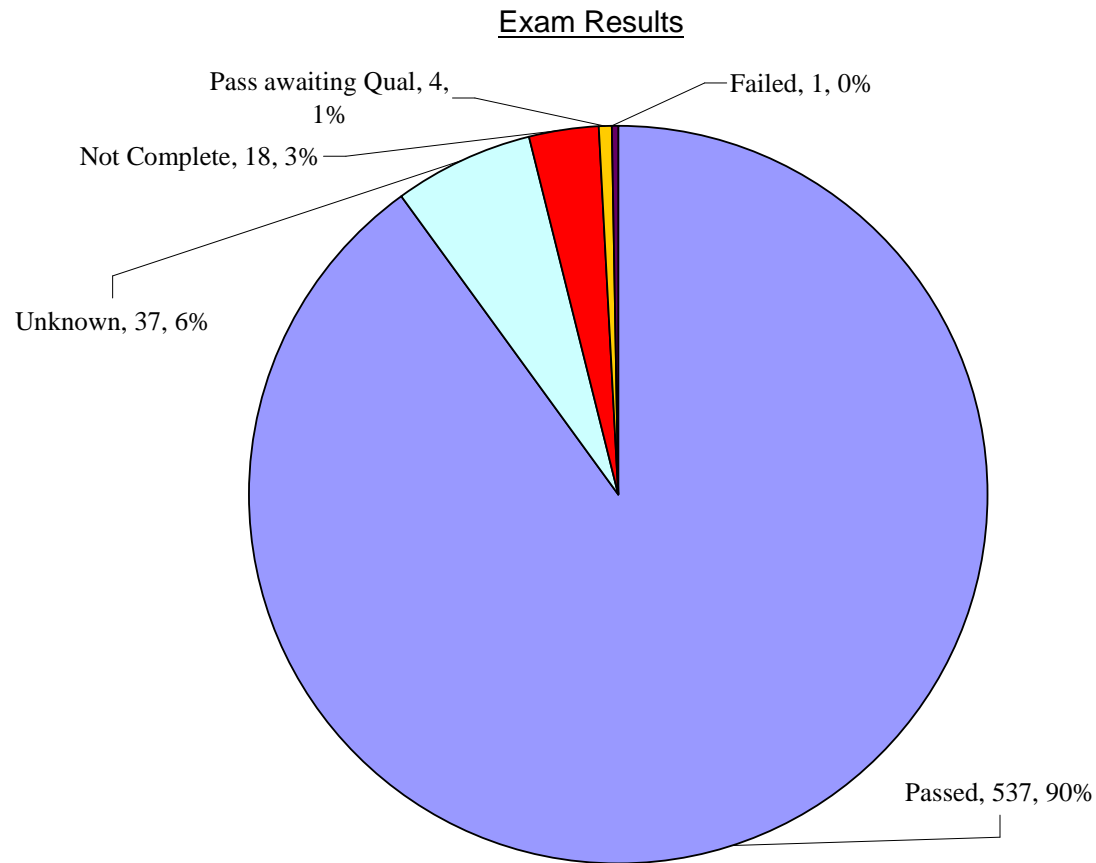
- For approximately 400 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, children, adults, prisoners.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are high risk of harm to the public.

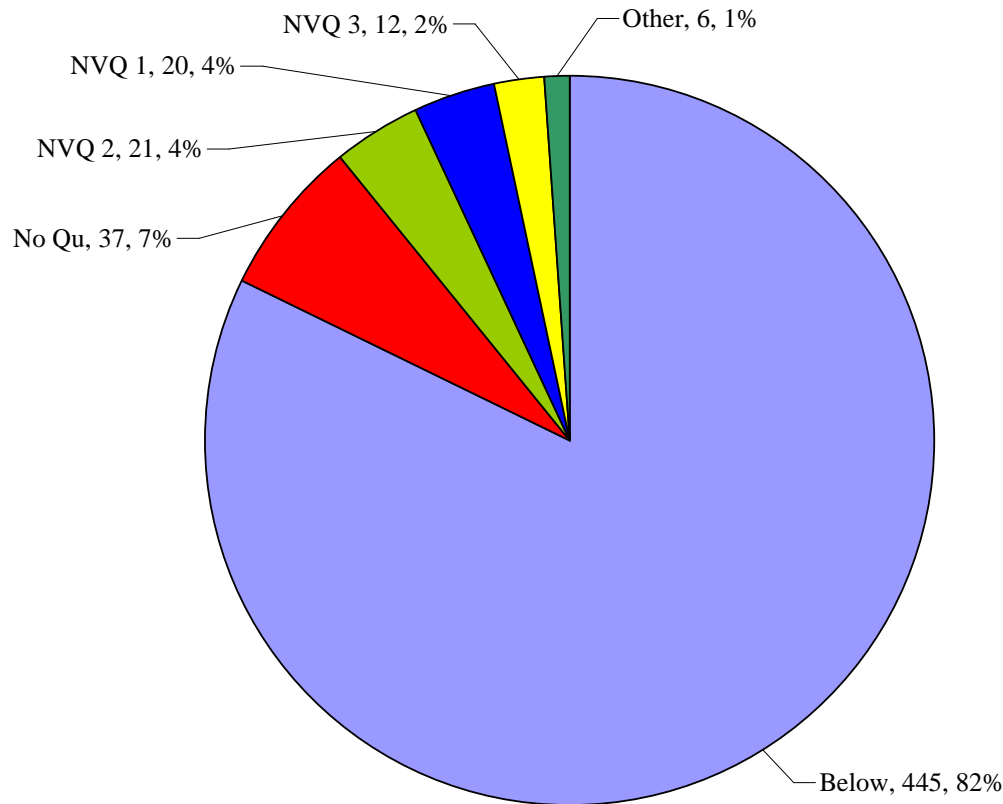
- 671 soft outcomes were gained by Risley beneficiaries.
- 100 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- 21 beneficiaries attended ECDL.
- Beneficiaries in Risley attended 96 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, job and Progress to Work interviews.
- 24 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.





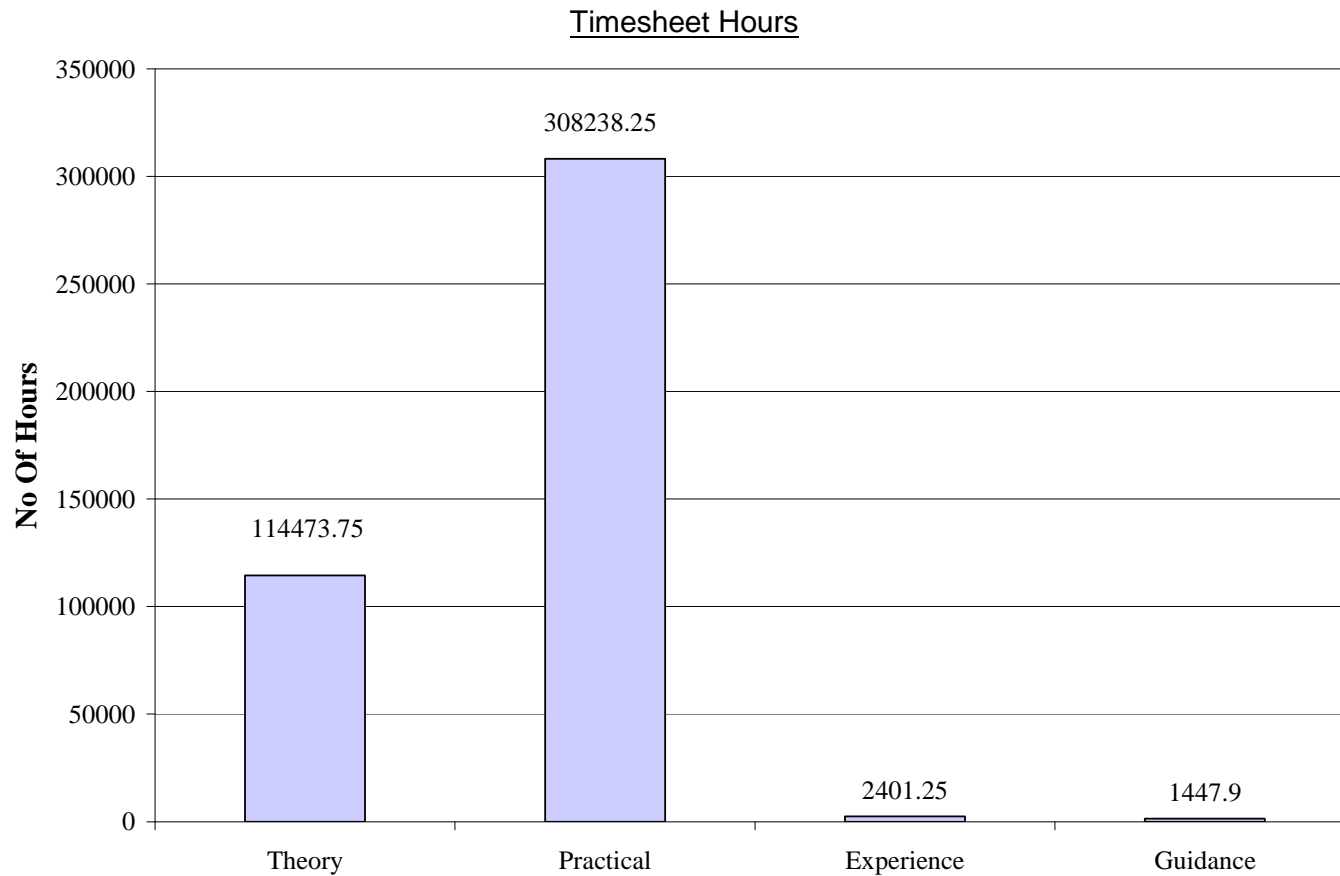
- 91% (541) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only one exam was failed.

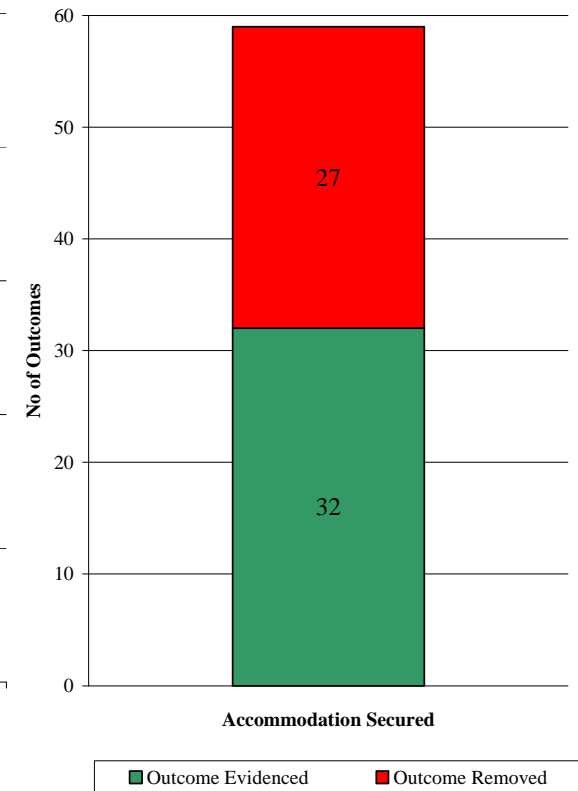
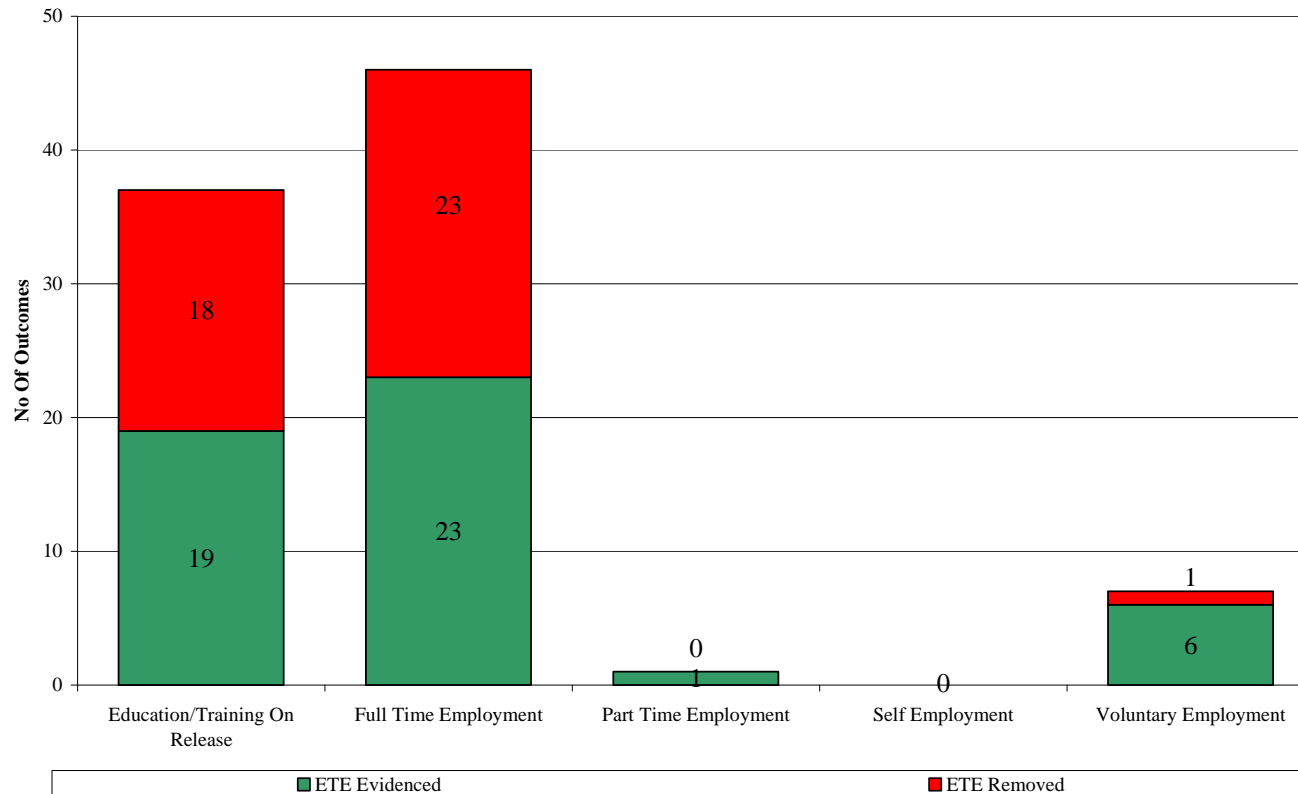

- 53 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Risley.
- 161 adult Literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Risley.



- 426,561 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 308,238 (72%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

### Hard Outcomes



- 91 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Risley with evidence for 49 of these outcomes (54% evidence for outcome rate).
- 59 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 32 outcomes (54% evidence for outcome rate).
