

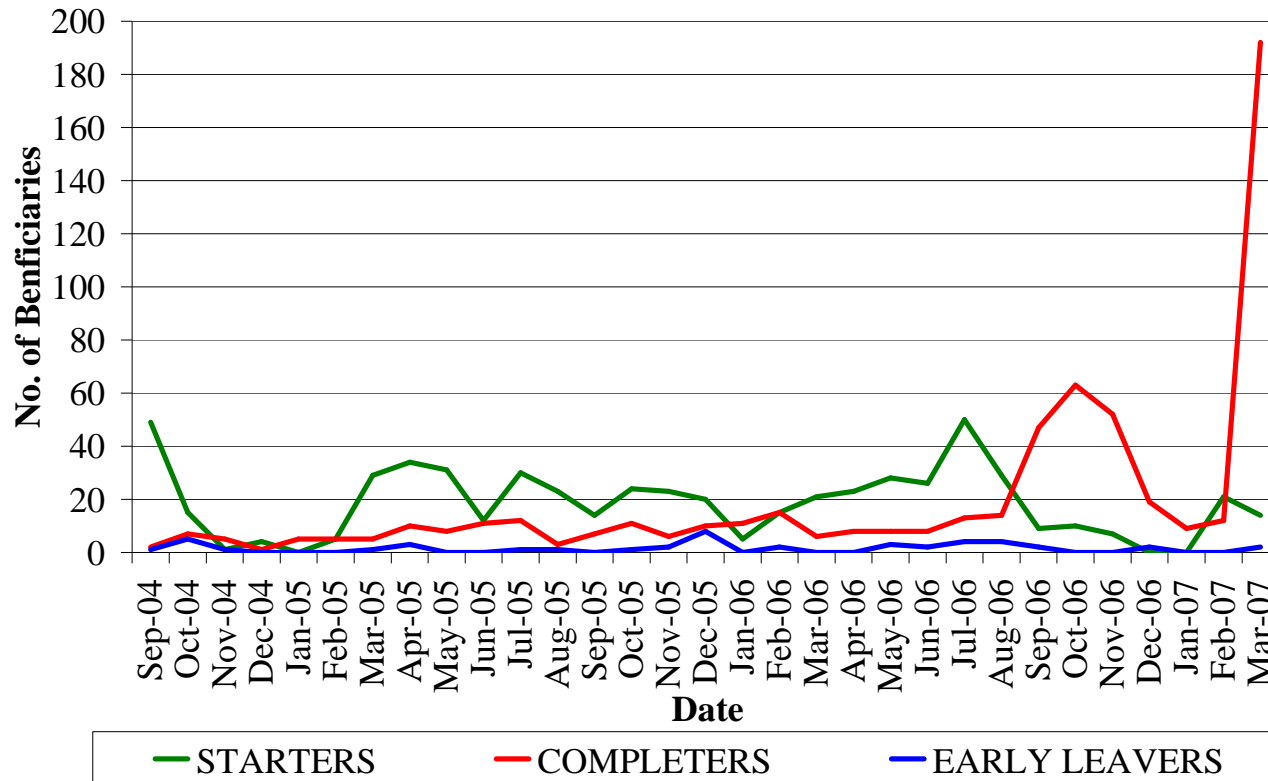

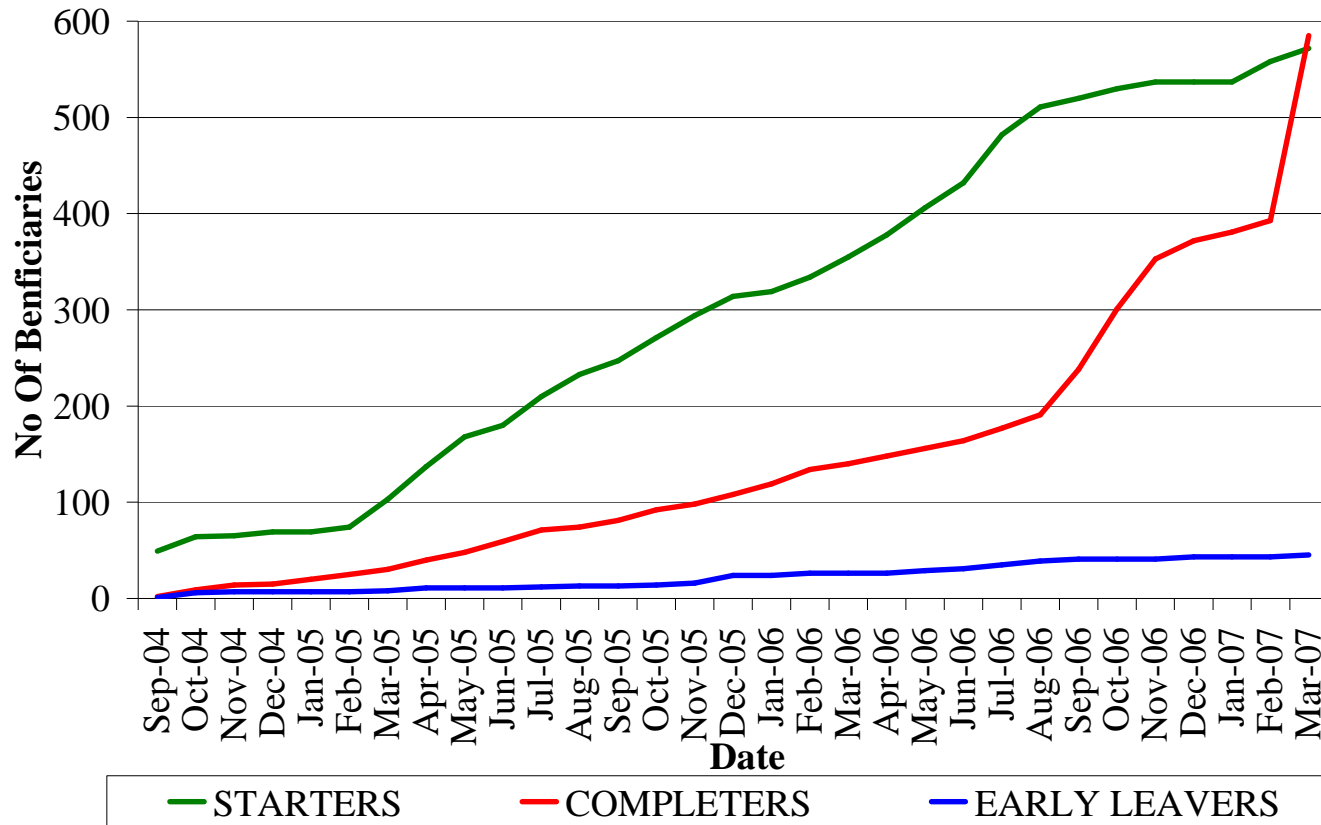

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



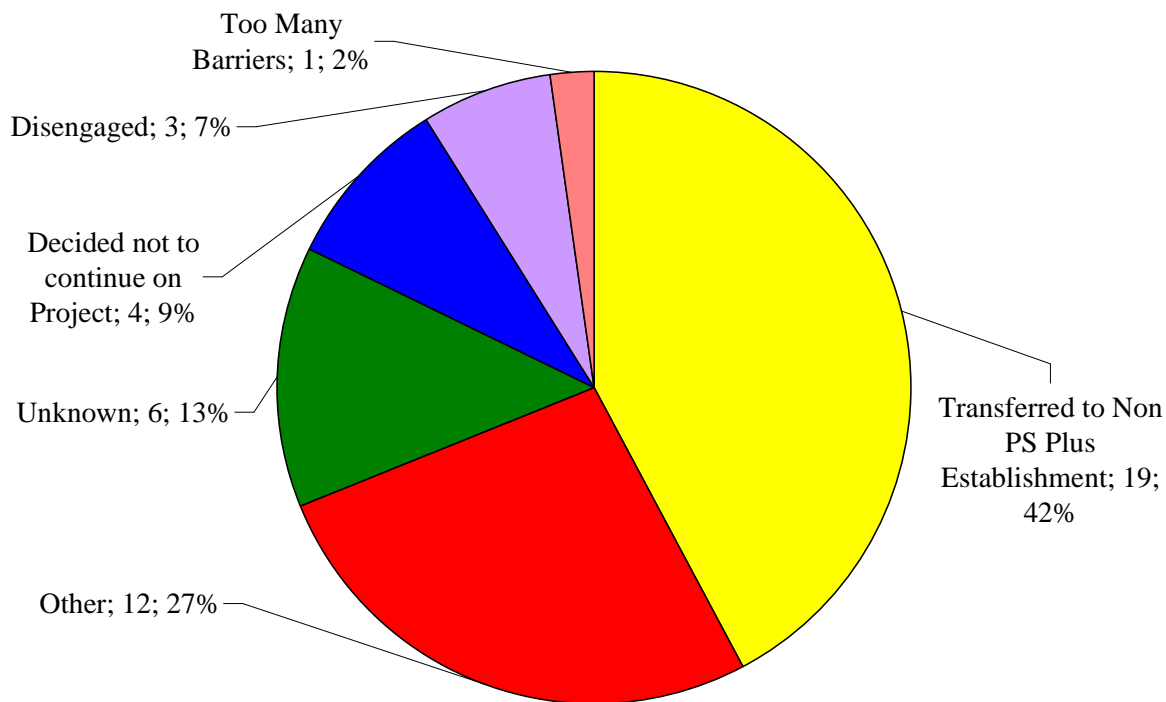
- Most months, Whatton started between 10 and 30 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 20 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 600 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Whatton.
- Approximately 630 beneficiaries finished in Whatton – 585 completed the project and 45 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

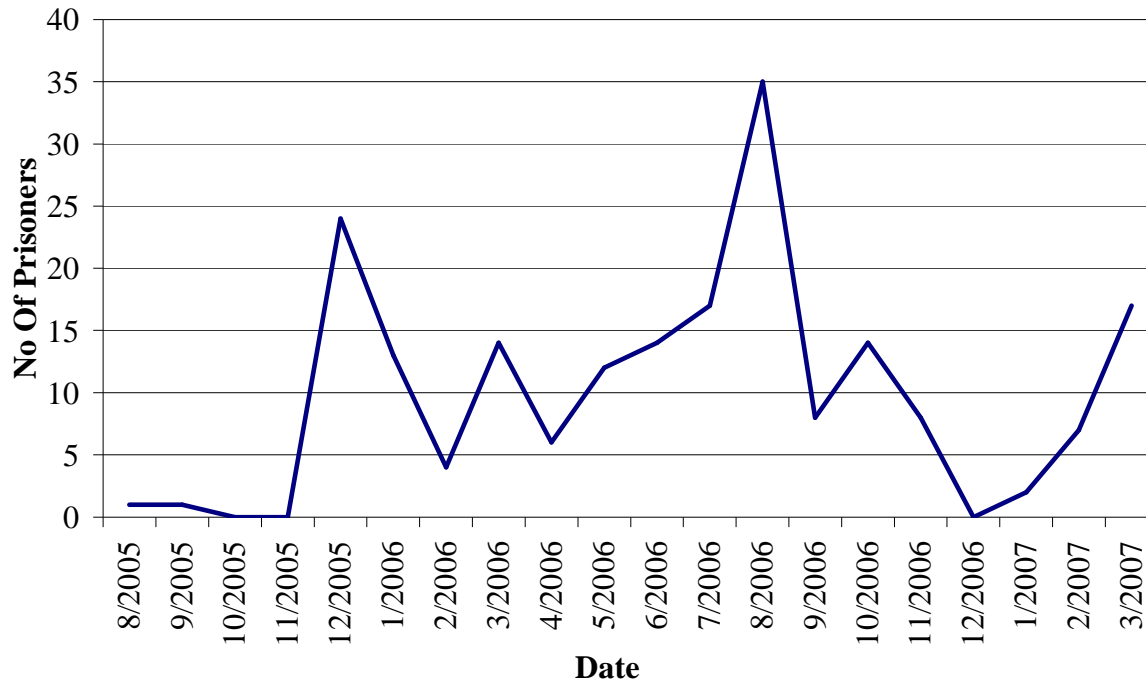

- Of the 45 beneficiaries who left the project early, 42% (19) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 4 of the beneficiaries who were Early Leavers decided not to continue on the project and 3 were disengaged.

Non-Starters Per Month

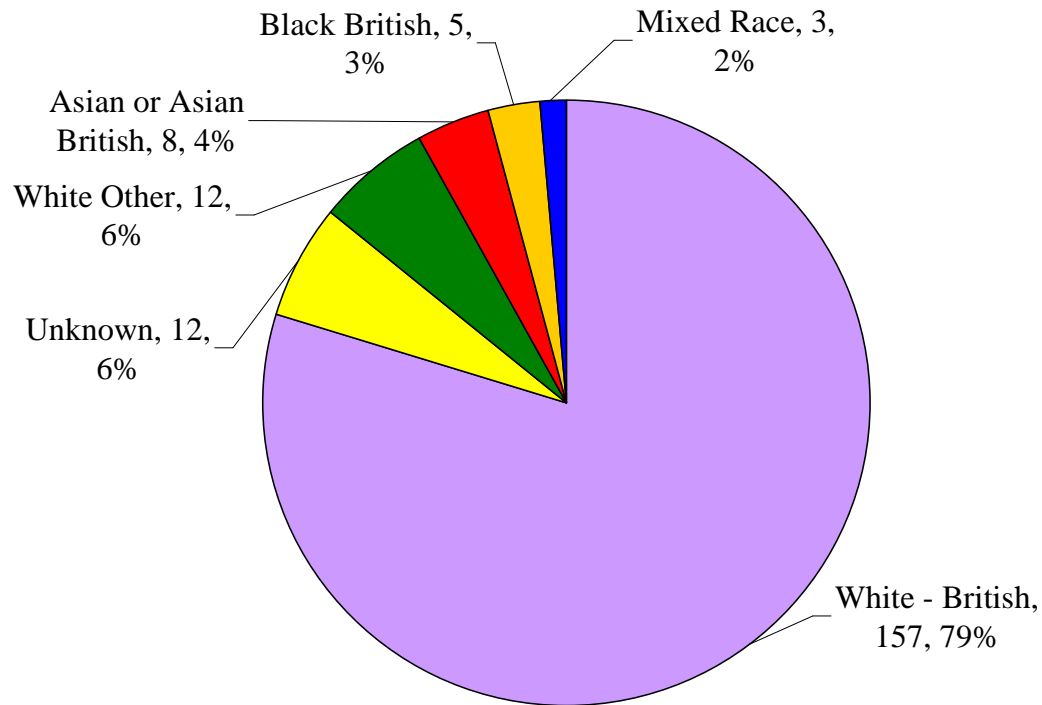

- Most months, fewer than 15 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, less than 200 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Whatton.
- 83 of the prisoners not started in Whatton did not require PS Plus Services and 78 did not wish to be considered for PS Plus at this time.

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



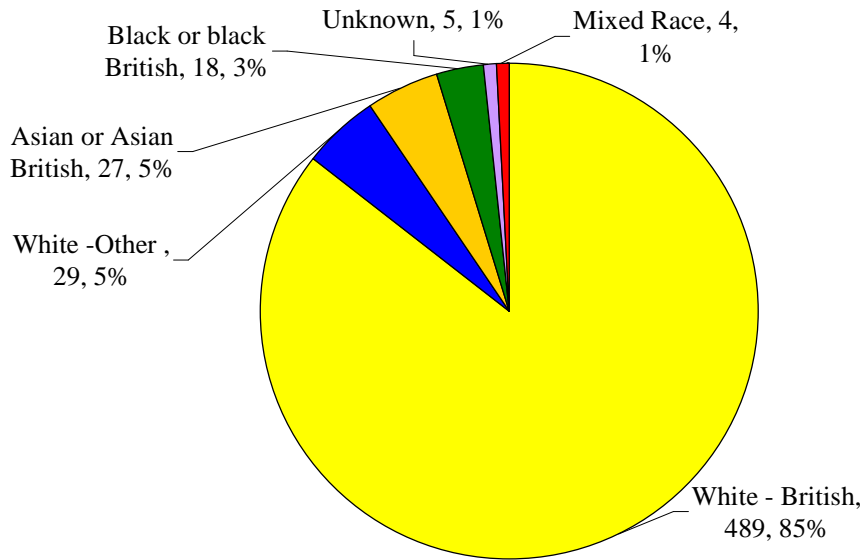

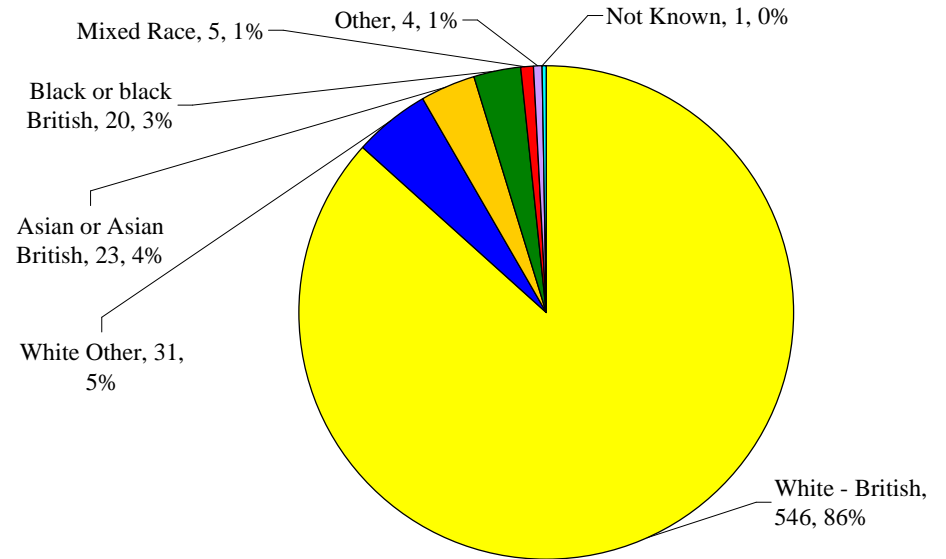
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (79%) and from United Kingdom (90%).
- The ethnic origin for 6% and the nationality of 3% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 15% (28) of the prisoners not started.

- 85% (489) of the beneficiaries who started and 86% (546) of the beneficiaries who finished in Whatton were White-British.
- 14% (78) of the beneficiaries who started and 13% (79) of the beneficiaries who finished in Whatton were from ethnic minorities.

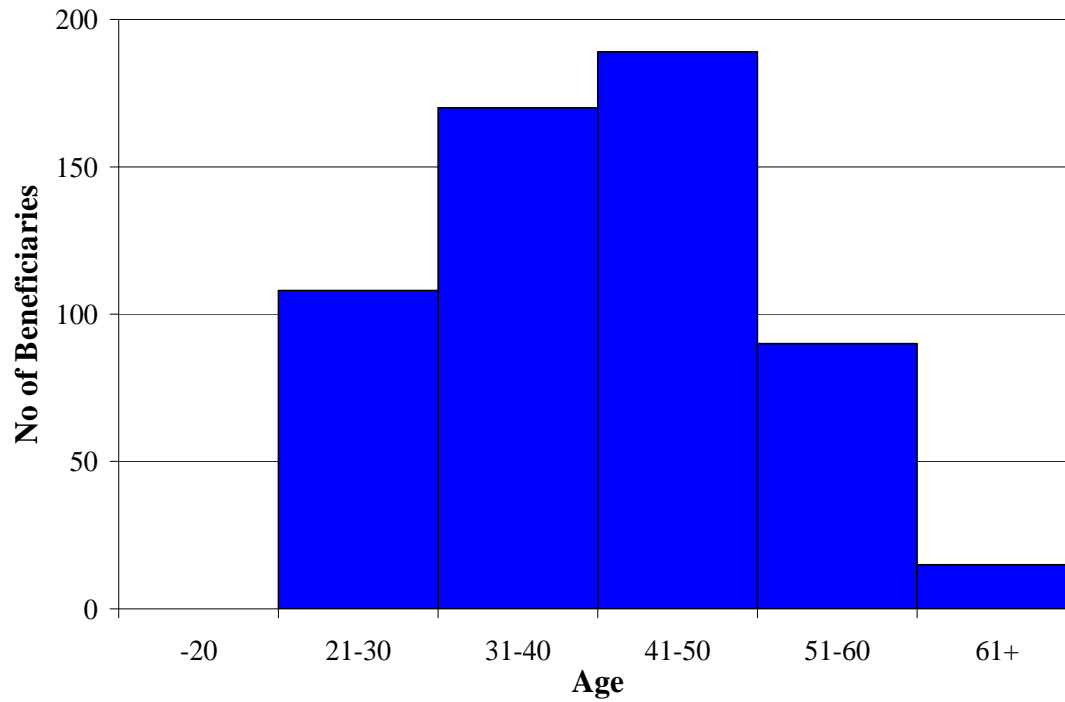

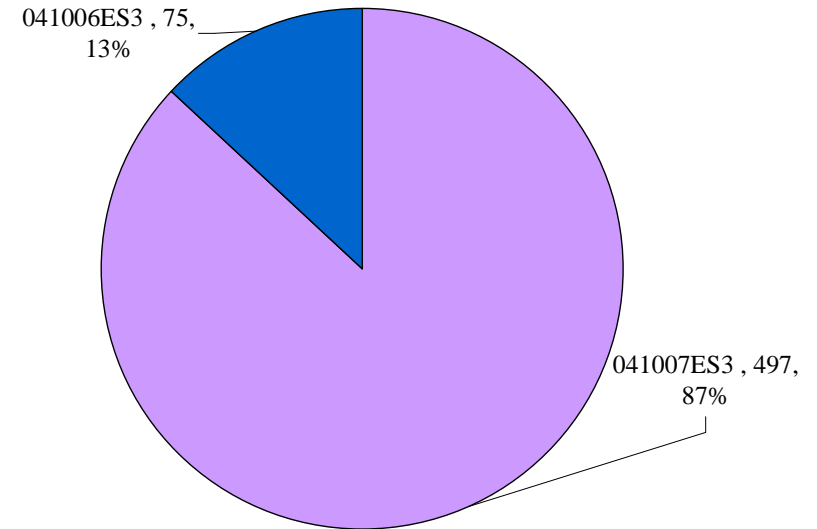

- 81% (465) of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- 83% (523) of the beneficiaries who finished in Whatton stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 91 of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton and 90 of the beneficiaries who finished in Whatton are unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



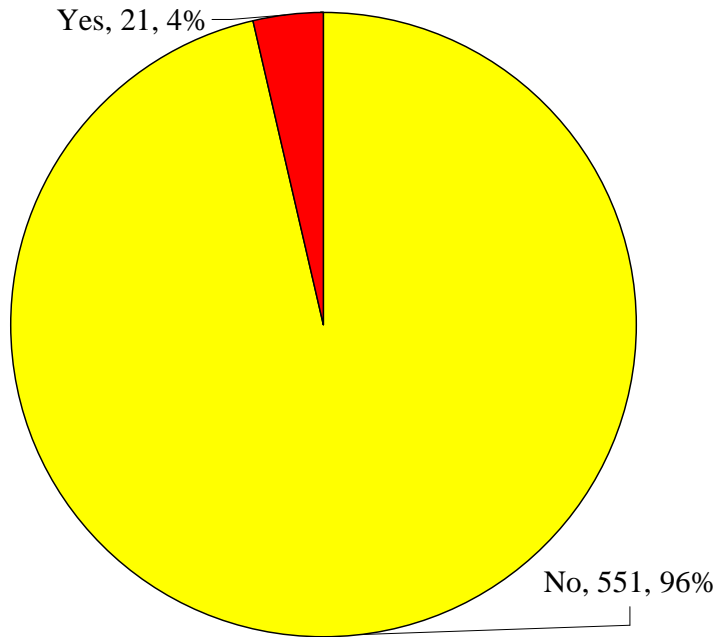
Age Breakdown



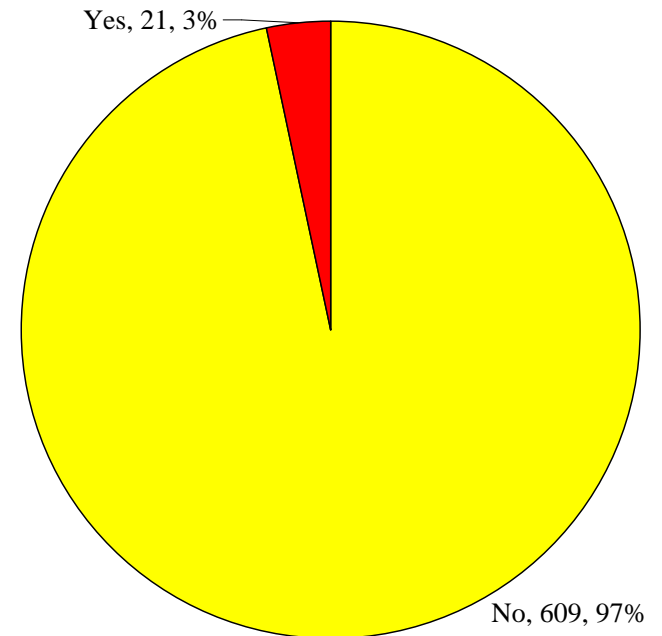
Dossier Number Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Whatton is 40 years and 11 months. The average (mode) age group is 41-50 years old.
- 87% (497) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

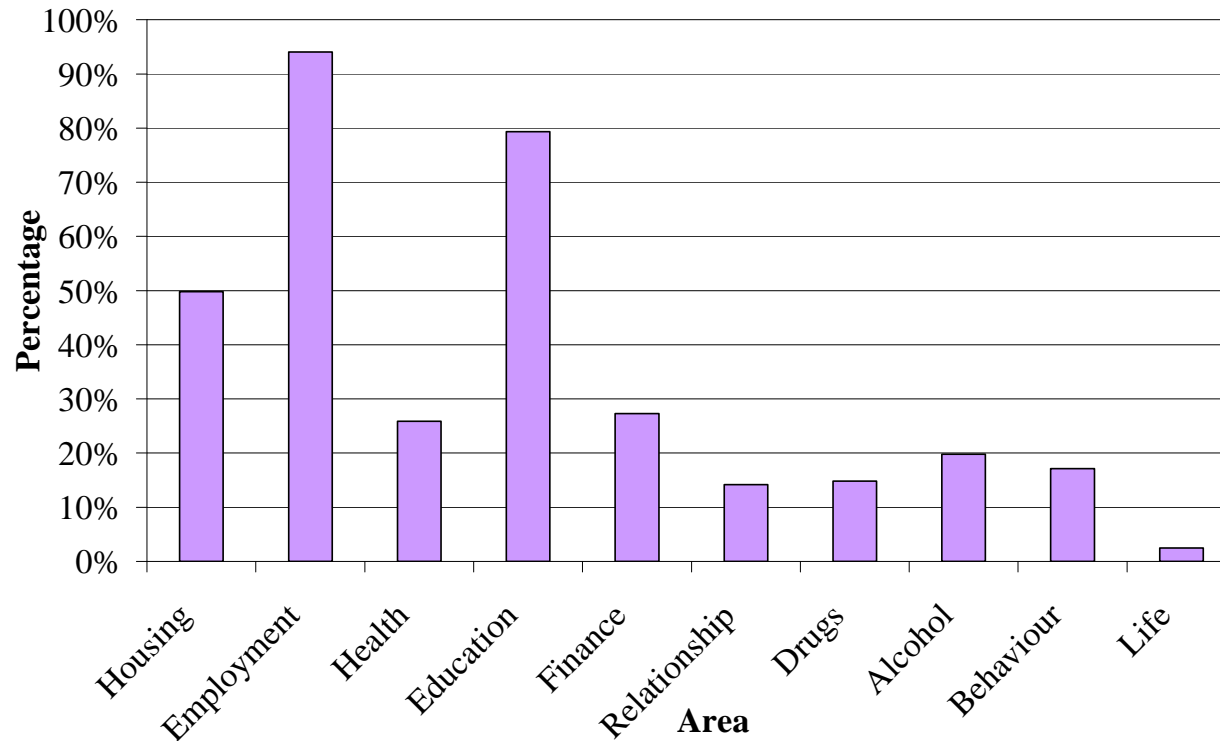

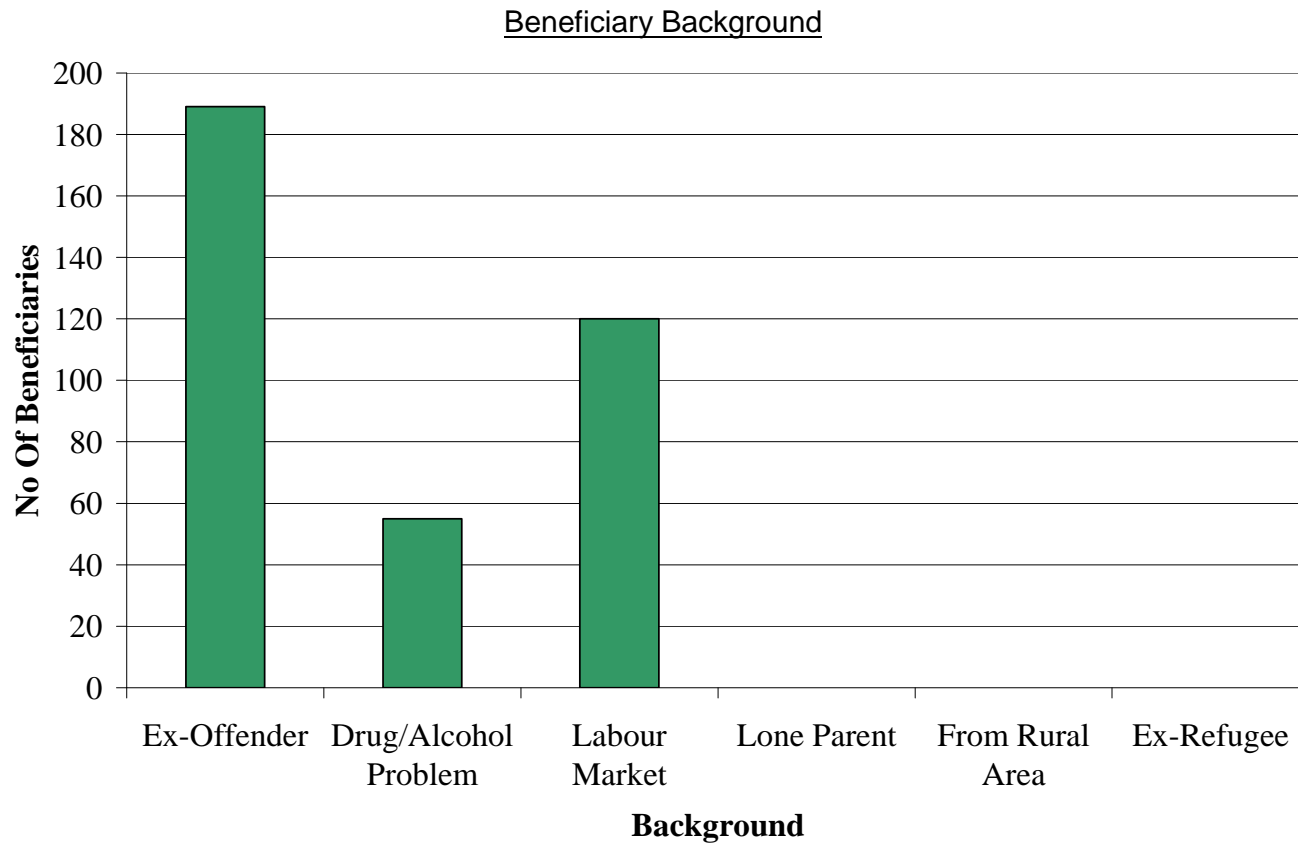
Beneficiaries Finishing in Whatton

- 4% (21) of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton were classified as being disabled.
- 3% (21) of the beneficiaries who finished in Whatton were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Whatton



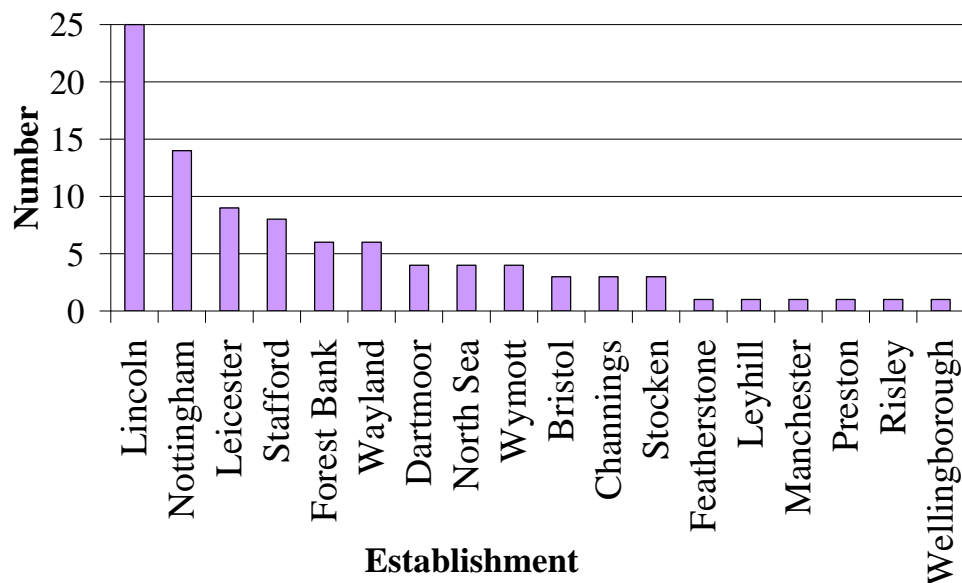
- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton needed help with employment.
- Nearly 80% of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton needed help with education issues.
- 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton needed help with housing issues.



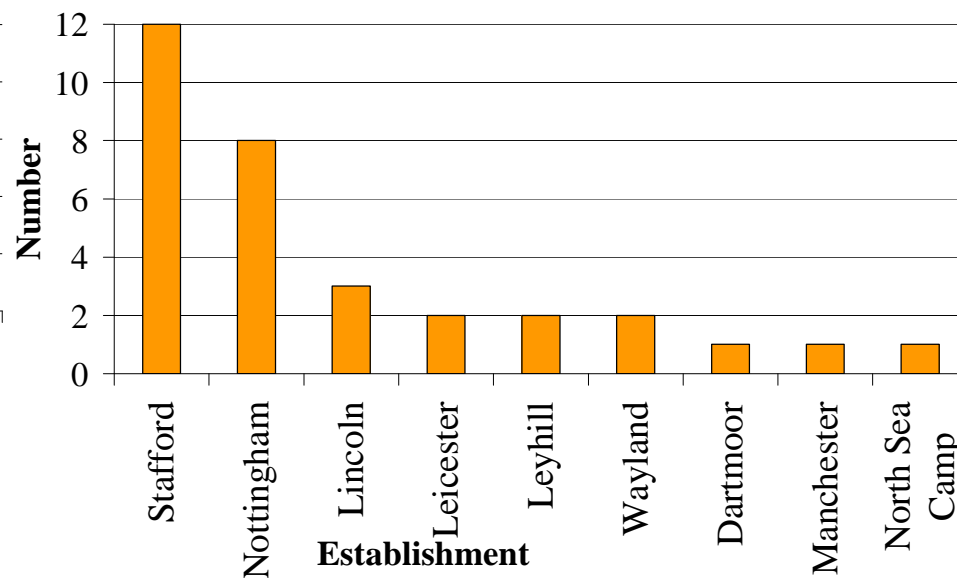
- Over 180 of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton were ex-offenders.
- Over 50 of the beneficiaries who started in Whatton had a drug or alcohol problem.

Transfers into Whatton

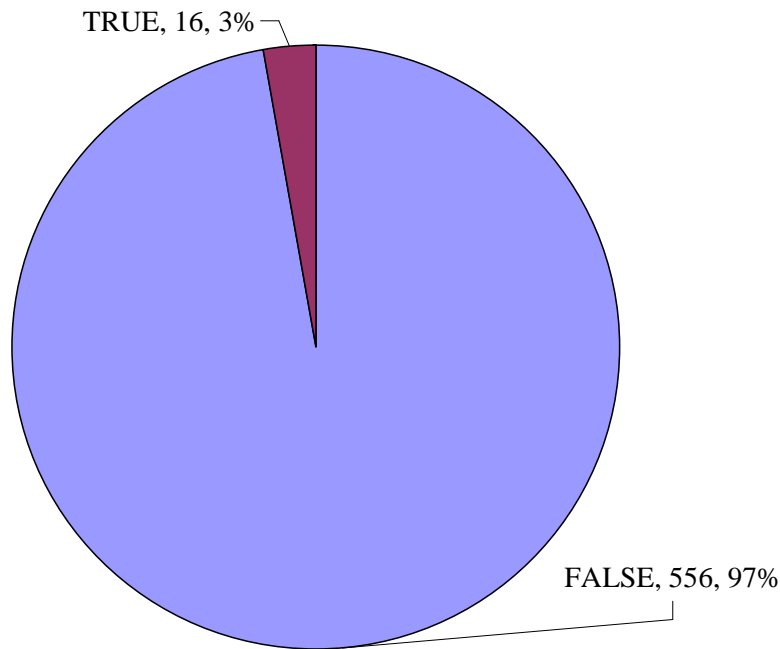


Transfers from Whatton

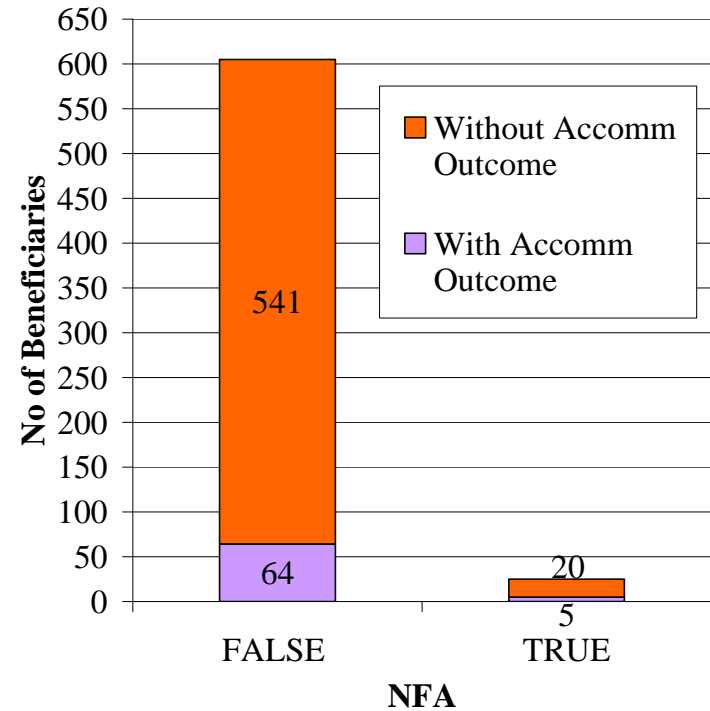


- 95 beneficiaries have transferred into Whatton – 59% transferred to Whatton from Lincoln, Nottingham, Leicester or Stafford.
- 32 beneficiaries have transferred from Whatton – 63% transferred from Whatton to Stafford or Nottingham.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

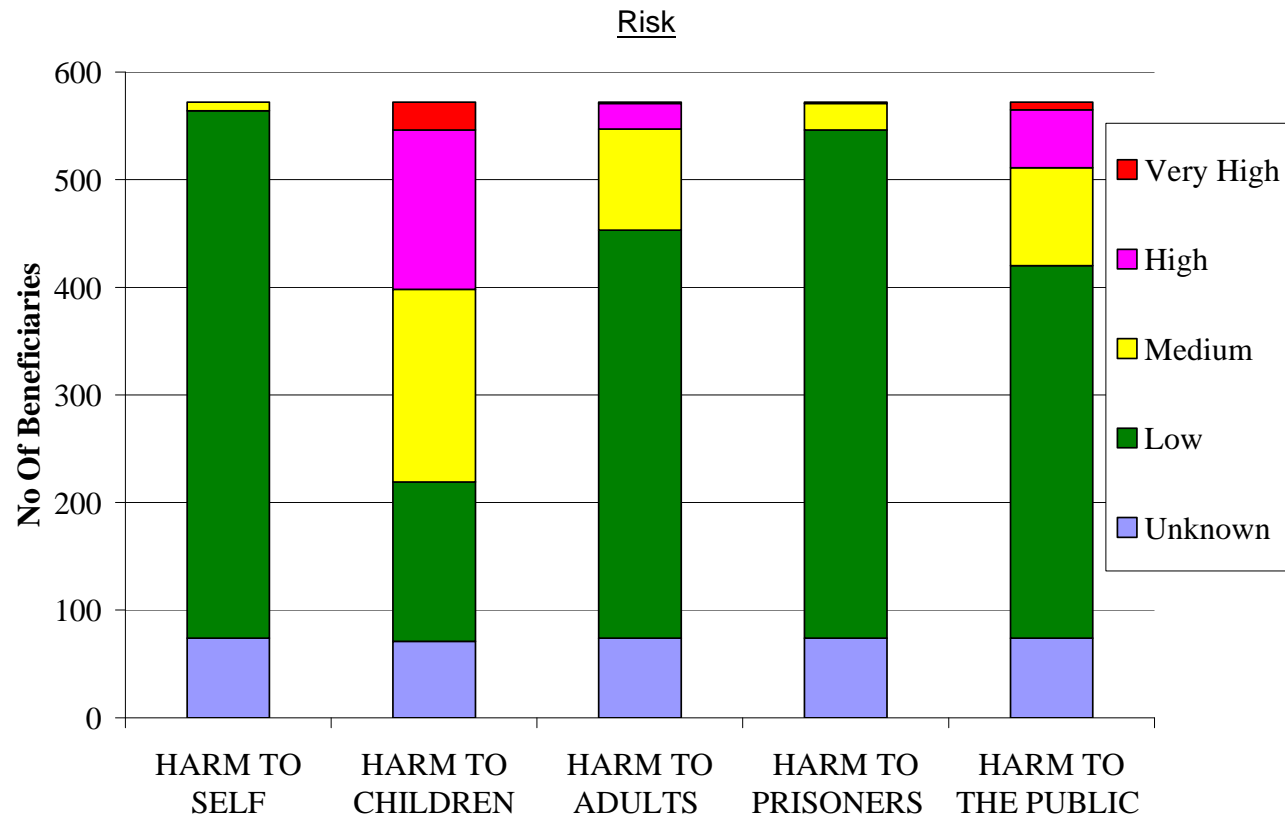


Beneficiaries Starting in Whatton



Beneficiaries Finishing in Whatton

- 3% (16) of the beneficiaries started in Whatton were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 25 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 5 had an accommodation outcome secured.

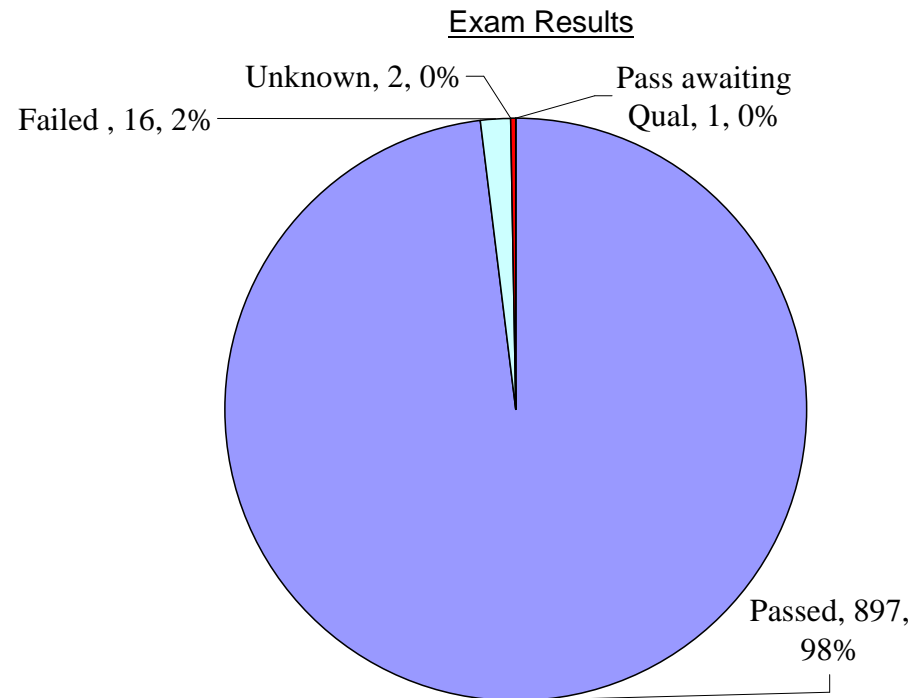


- The majority of beneficiaries were low risk to harm themselves, adults, prisoners and public.
- Approximately 300 beneficiaries were medium, high or very high risk to children.

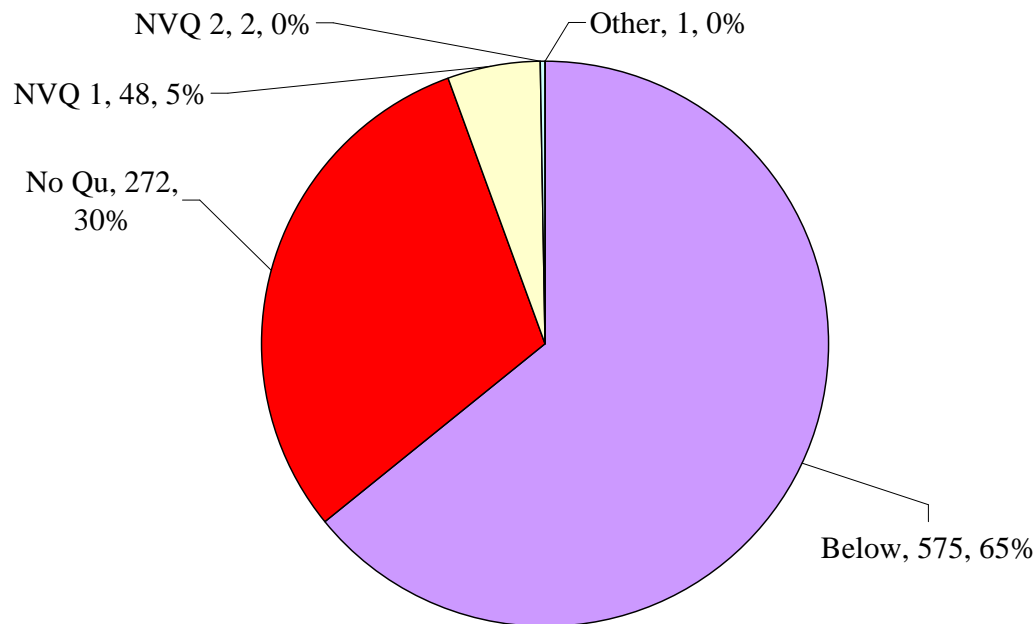

- 958 soft outcomes were gained by Whatton beneficiaries.
- 71 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- 58 beneficiaries attended ECDL.
- Beneficiaries in Whatton attended 257 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 5 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiaries Access Fund.



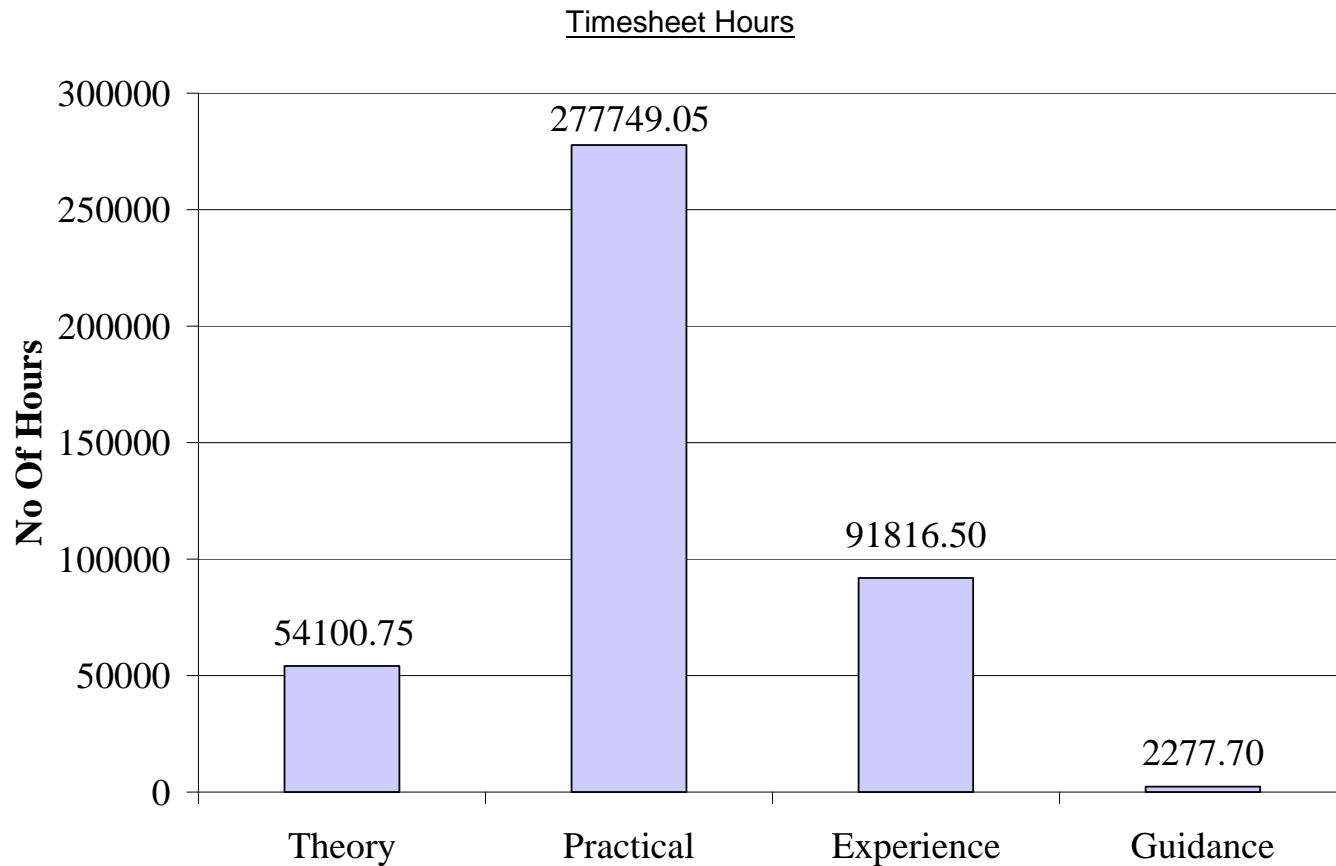
- 98% (898) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only 16 (2%) exams were failed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



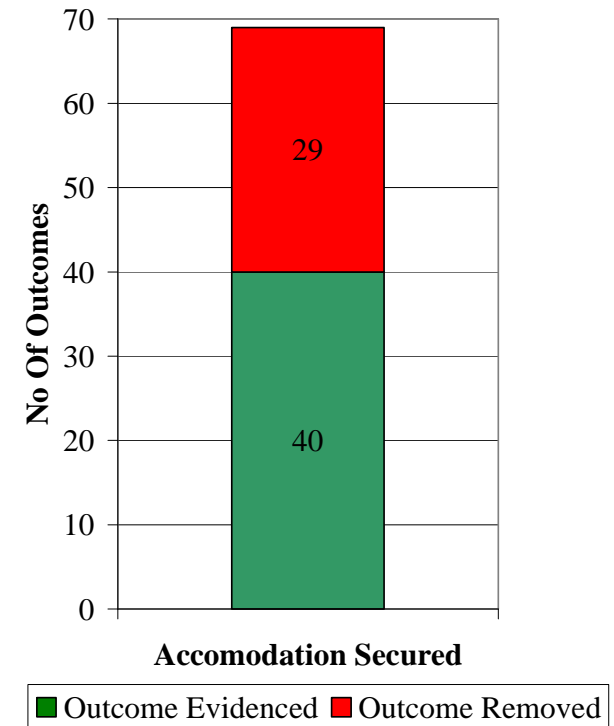
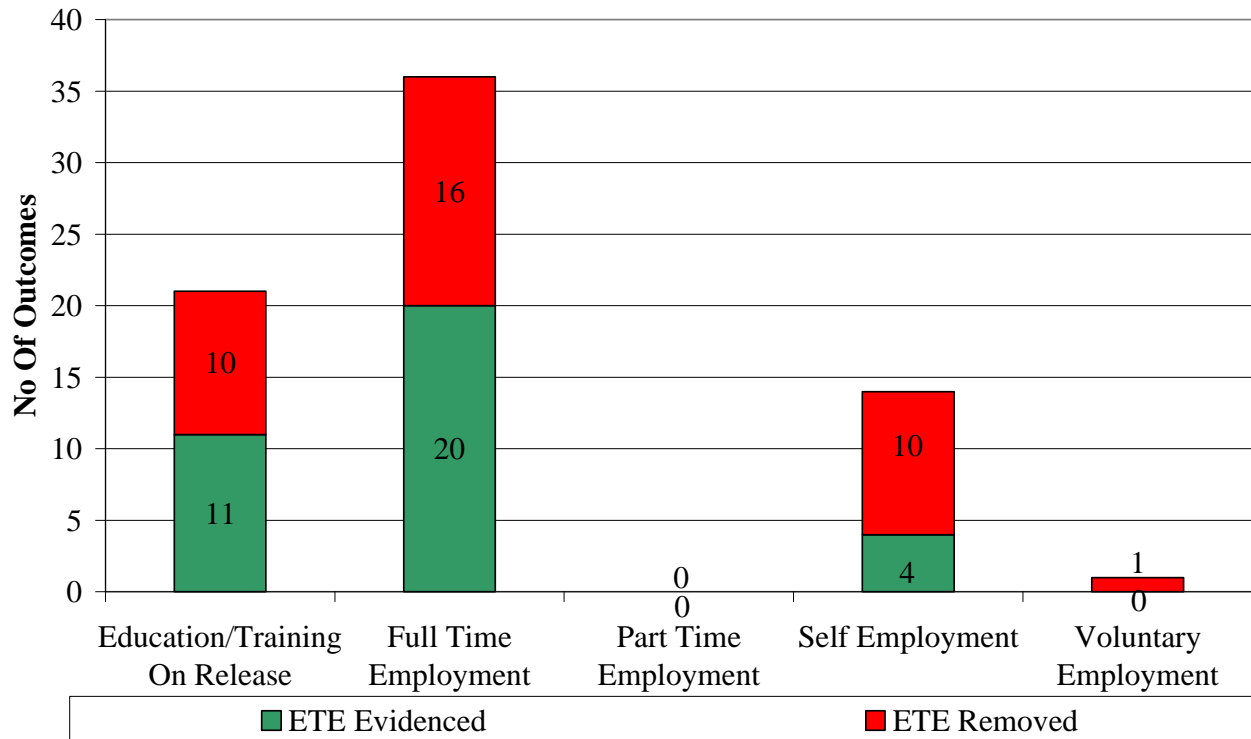

- 50 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Whatton.
- 273 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Whatton.



- 425,944 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 277,749 (65%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 72 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Whatton with evidence for 35 of these outcomes (49% evidence for outcome rate).
- 69 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 40 outcomes (58% evidence for outcome rate).
