## **PROJECT SUMMARY**

# PS Plus 3 – HMP Wellingborough

This report has been compiled to give information about the offenders (beneficiaries) worked with on the PS Plus 3 project in HMP Wellingborough – a male closed category C prison in the East Midlands. The project ran for 14 months between  $1^{st}$  April 2007 and  $30^{th}$  June 2008, in which time 425 beneficiaries were started on the project. At its peak, it is estimated that the project worked with approximately 25% of the prison population.


Of the 425 beneficiaries started, 23% (98) left the project early with 87% of these transferring to a non-PS Plus prison establishment.

### **Demographics**


- 64% (272) of the beneficiaries started in Wellingborough were White-British. 36% (151) of the beneficiaries were from ethnic minority groups (where known), and 17 beneficiaries were from outside the United Kingdom.
- 58% (247) of beneficiaries started in Wellingborough were aged between 21 and 30, with the average age on starting the project being 30 years 6 months.
- The most common offence type of beneficiaries started in Wellingborough was theft, burglary or robbery (36%) followed by violent offences (29%).





### **Assessment**

- For the majority of prisoners (where known), the level of risk posed towards adults, children, other prisoners, the public and themselves is low. Less than 4% were classed as high or very high risk in each category.
- Every beneficiary required help with either employment or education, while 396 (93%) required help with both employment *and* education.
- 253 beneficiaries were identified as requiring assistance with substance abuse, with 25% and 49% of beneficiaries requiring help with alcohol and drugs issues respectively.
- Comparison to the rest of the beneficiaries worked with in male PS Plus prisons shows that beneficiaries started at Wellingborough were significantly *more* likely to require assistance with drugs, education, employment, finance, housing and life issues.
- Comparison to beneficiaries worked with in other male PS Plus prisons shows that beneficiaries in Wellingborough were significantly less motivated on starting the project.

### Soft Outcomes


- o 689 soft outcomes were achieved by Wellingborough.
- 69% (310) of the beneficiaries worked with at Wellingborough achieved at least one outcome while there.
- o 263 beneficiaries received advice and guidance.
- 309 beneficiaries received assistance with employment issues.
- 294 beneficiaries received assistance with education or training issues.

### **Qualifications**

- 132 courses or qualifications were passed by beneficiaries on the PS Plus project at Wellingborough.
- PS Plus beneficiaries completed courses in a wide range of subjects, from food hygiene to skills for life.
- 39 adult literacy and adult numeracy courses, and 27 information technology courses were passed.

### Hard Outcomes

- o 71 hard outcomes were recorded by PS Plus staff.
- 54 hard outcomes had sufficient evidence for ESF auditing purposes.
- Beneficiaries successfully achieved 13 employment outcomes and 41 education/training outcomes while on PS Plus 3.
- Employment ranged from motor repair to brickwork, while education/training ranged from the Construction Skills Certificate Scheme (CSCS) test to fork lift truck training.

### **Summary**

 Overall, Wellingborough started 425 beneficiaries, achieved 55 hard ETE outcomes and 689 soft outcomes on the PS Plus 3 project.
